We're In This Together Rabbi Ilana Garber

In the span of three days this past month, my family experienced the joys and sorrows at each end of the lifecycle. First we welcomed my newest nephew into the covenant of our people at his *bris*, and then three days later we bid farewell to Adam's 97-year-old grandfather at his funeral. It was an exhausting roller coaster of emotions.

At both events I was struck by the power of community. Most of those who gathered at my mother's home for the *bris* had never met my 8-day-old nephew, obviously, and yet they came to support our family and to offer him the blessing of our tradition: may he grow into a life infused with Torah, *chuppah* (the wedding canopy), and good deeds.

Of course, on the opposite end of the lifespan, most of those who gathered at the funeral had known and loved Adam's grandfather for many years. As the rabbi eulogized, he was a devoted community leader, a legend in the community. And so, his community came to support our family and to pay their last respects by participating in the *chesed shel emet*, the ultimate kindness of burying the dead knowing that the deceased cannot thank or repay us.

As I witnessed these two very different events, I was reminded of how lucky we are to be part of a community. Many of us are part of several different communities – school, work, and of course the synagogue – and we are all the more blessed because of those connections. Being entrenched in a community means that the community can support and hold us during *simchas* (joyous occasions) and *tzuris* (sorrows). Being part of a community means that we too are able to support those around us as they experience life's ups and downs. Joining together as a faith community, a religious community, a synagogue community – makes us into a holy community.

Remember the old TV show "Cheers"? What a great example of community: where everybody knows your name, and they're always glad you came! Beth El is that place for so many of us, and if you don't feel that it is for you (yet), then please let us know and we'll help you make yourself known. We want to get to know you so that we may be with you as you journey through life.

At the *bris* my new nephew received his name, Rafael, for the first time. At the funeral, Grandpa Sidney's name was recited over and over, in love and respect. And throughout both of these moments we were surrounded by community, holding us, honoring them, and making our lives ever more enriched, meaningful, and holy.

Chodesh tov – have a good month! And Chag Pesach Sameach – a happy Passover!

Daled Class Had a WOW! Morning

On Sunday, March 15, the Beth El Religious School Daled class participated in a collaborative Beth El-Emanuel-B'nai Tikvah program which was held at B'Nai Tikvah.

The theme of the program was **Israel** - **the Hope & the Promise**. The goal was for each child to leave the morning with a better understanding of the biblical references to God's *promise* of Israel to Abraham and the Jewish people, including personally relating to the text. The second goal was for students to become familiar with the history and meaning of Hatkivah, Israel's national anthem. What do the words actually mean? How do they interpret the vision of Hatikvah? How does this increased knowledge better connect them to the lyrics of this song?

The group finished their learning with a Michography project in which they created a piece of communal art work using their interpretations of Hatikvah. Of course we concluded the morning with a meaningful and heartfelt singing of Hatikvah - look for a video this Spring!


When asked by the song leader if they had heard of Hatikvah, one of our Beth El students replied, "Of course, it is the song we sing every Wednesday!"




Hebrew Through Prayer

This class on the major prayers of the Shabbat morning service concludes April 9.

Dough: A Memoir by Mort Zachter An unemployed, heavily mortgaged accountant answers the phone in 1994. A banker offers Mort Zachter the opportunity to take control of his Uncle Harry's seven-figure money market. Assuming it is a practical joke — Harry had lived like a pauper in a housing project while running a bread store on New York's Lower East Side for 60 years



– it is legit. In *Dough: A Memoir*, Žachter stumbles upon a stockpile of two-dollar bills stashed in Harry's fruitcake boxes. A relative jokes that Harry really is from "old money." Mort describes life at the bakery from the 1940s through the 1960s. He realizes that his uncle gave him the gift of time to write an honest, but lighthearted, memoir about loyalty and wealth.



We Look Like the Enemy: The Hidden Story of Israel's Jews from Arab Lands by Rachel Shabi, a journalist and firsttime author, reports societal struggles of Israel's Arab-Jewish population as an Israel-born daughter of Iraqi Jews. She explores conflicts and inequities among the privileged, educated and cosmopolitan European Ashkenazi Jews, and Mizrahis, whose culture has

incorporated traditions often devalued or oppressed: Popular Arabian music is banned from Israel's airwaves. The Mizrahi accent has become shorthand for the lower class. Interviews with Mizrahi citizens blame the Ashkenazi-dominated Jewish Agency for presenting Israel as a haven for *all* displaced Jews, when the reality for Arab Jews is likely less prosperous — and possibly less tolerant. This is a rare overview of the *other* Israeli conflict.

Lifelong Learning, cont.

A year ago, Beth El's president, Lois Koteen, established an Education Task Force to review the Religious School, making sure our children receive the highest quality Jewish education.

The Task Force began by gathering feedback from as many people as possible. We conducted focus groups, mailed out surveys, and conducted interviews by phone and in person. We reached out to past and present students and parents, teachers and administrators alike. We wanted to hear everything – the good and the not so good.

Based on what we heard, we prepared a thorough analysis setting forth the strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats facing our Religious School. This SWOT analysis allowed us to craft a new vision and mission statement for the Religious School that would guide the development of a Strategic Plan.

Our vision: Today's children, tomorrow's adults, living engaged Jewish lives.

Our mission: Lay a foundation of Jewish learning, inspiring our students to embrace Judaism as a meaningful part of their lives.

In a comprehensive manner, the Strategic Plan sets forth the following objectives:

- i. to improve our curriculum in order to develop Jewish literacy and cultivate a strong, positive Jewish identity;
- ii. to create a collaborative atmosphere among teachers and staff through better communication;
- iii. to build a strong relationship with families through clear messaging;

- iv. to attract and retain high quality, effective teachers;
- v. to prioritize financial allocations;
- vi. to stay on top of opportunities to improve by working together with other schools, allowing for alternative educational plans, creating a school board, defining the role of the clergy, and maximizing attendance through flexible scheduling.

Noteworthy is that each objective comes with strategies, recommendations, and timelines to guide the implementation process.

Recently, the Strategic Plan was presented to the Temple Board for preliminary review; it met with high praise. We will soon be presenting it to the Religious School community and the broader congregation.

Our school has implemented some of the plan already. A consultant was hired to help us further evaluate our school as well as guide us in reviewing and strengthening our curriculum. We continue to implement innovative and exciting programs for our students.

A Parent Action Group is in place and we intend to modify and revitalize our Education Committee. Thank you all for your input and patience as we implement the Strategic Plan. And, of course, thank you to all the Task Force members who have not only provided advice, but have rolled up their sleeves and worked hard to move this project forward: Lisa Karabelnik-Harris, Tammy Krulewitz, Jordan Grossman, Anita Levy, and Jodi Schwartz.
