

terrorism looks like and what can be done to counter it," Rabbi Rosen explained. Kelly is coming February 22 to speak to our community and honor the memories of Matt and Sara. *Spiritual Radical: Abraham Joshua Heschel*, by Edward Kaplan, is a sequel to his first



biography of Heschel's early years. Included are FBI files, interviews with people who knew him, and analyses of his writings. Kaplan explores Heschel's shy and private side, spiritual radicalism, and vehement defense of absolute integrity and truth in ethical and political life. Heschel (1907-1972) born in Poland, raised in a Hasidic community and later lived in secular Jewish Vilna and Berlin, immigrated to the U.S. in 1940. Heschel was also Rabbi Kessler's teacher and friend, and attended the dedication of the Beth El Sanctuary in 1963.




