In the Same Boat

On Shabbat morning, October 21, we were privileged to mark a special milestone for our family: the 20th anniversary of our son Dani becoming a Bar Mitzvah. Since Dani was born with Down Syndrome and Autism,

we didn't know exactly how that day in 1997 would ultimately turn out.

But years of training in music with dedicated Carolyn Bernstein, and devoted Bar Mitzvah instruction with Ruth Anne Faust, made him ready for his special day. What truly overwhelmed us was the remarkable outpouring of support and love that remains with us to this day.

This special Shabbat 20 years later was also a joyous day. It also gives us the opportunity to reflect on just how far our society has come with relating to those with special needs. Gone (for the most part, thankfully) are the horrible labels of "retarded" or "cripple." Today we think about people with disabilities or challenges. With emphasis on the word *people*.

This time of reflection has also yielded an appreciation for so many within Beth El who have made an accessible and meaningful life for all a priority in their own lives. Ronit Shoham was recently honored by Leadership Greater Hartford for many acts of giving, including the establishment of the Miracle League Greater Hartford to bring the joy of baseball to all children. And on Sunday, October 22, Jonathan's Dream was rededicated at the JCC. It is just one of

many fully accessible playgrounds that Amy and Peter Barzach created not only to honor the memory of their infant son Jonathan but to give all children, whatever their challenges, the gift of play.

If you think about it, you realize that the line between ability and disability is a very thin one in life. We all have areas that stymie us or present conditions that are beyond our control – illness for example. There are also some cultural trends that leave us so divided, so tied into the echo chamber of our own views, that we find it all but impossible to hear the other.

As in 1997, Dani ascended the bimah during the reading of a portion of Noah.

One of the most powerful lessons of the portion is embedded in a curious description of the man. He was "a righteous man in his generation." What does the phrase "in his generation" suggest? As our sage Rashi tells us: some read this to say that Noah was, in general, a righteous man. Others suggest that he only stood out because of the general evil that was all around him.

I think that this question concerning Noah urges us to think about our humanity in broad terms. To think about excellence not only in resume-recorded accomplishments, but also in the nurturing of care, service, honor, and character. To see where we fall short and not be frozen in place by a perceived inability to grow in soul and giving.

To do that, we need each other. We need a community that supports us, reminds us of the holy and special within every one of us, and like Noah, helps us float on the top of stormy waters when they occur.

How fortunate we all are to be in that boat together. In a special caring place that we call Beth El.

According to the Talmud, "Every blade of grass has an angel that hovers over it and whispers, 'Grow, grow.'" Rabbi Naomi Levy puts

it another way. "God is here. God is watching over us and hoping for us. God is waiting for us to notice the beauty in every breath we take, the potential in every encounter, the extraordinary possibilities of every ordinary day."

We begin again, having made it through the High Holidays. Don't let the opportunity pass in the year ahead to find that better and happier you lurking within. At Beth El, we have programs, concerts, classes, and events for every kind of learning and giving. We are constantly rolling out creative ways to pray and participate. We are also building a stronger community, not only within the walls of our shul, but within our broader community as well.

The Bible uses a passing phrase I like quite alot: *kol dimamah* (loosely translated as the small or thin voice; the "voice of fragile silence"). It's the voice Elijah heard when before God. That

voice rests within each of us and speaks to us of who we are and who we want to be. In fact, *Kol Dimamah* is the name of a deaf dance troupe in Israel (because they dance to the thin voice within them).

Listen to that voice, whether it is whispering to you or starting to get a bit louder. It wants you to repair the world – one mitzvah at a time. I promise that even the journey will bring you joy. And, all of us here at Beth El, are rooting for you! So, "Grow, Grow."

* Cantor's Corner - Tunes for All Ages



In the Middle Ages, many *piyutim* (poems) were written especially for the High Holidays. The melodies that accompanied these poems were so highly regarded that they were called *Mi-Sinai tunes* (from Mount Sinai). Most of these poems, as beautiful and as meaningful as they are, have been

lost, mostly because of the somewhat transitory nature of the changes in the liturgy of the prayerbook in the Conservative and Reform movements. However, some very important poems have remained. These include:

Kol Nidrei Barechu Aleinu VehaKohanim

They comprise a mix of German minnesinger ballads, French troubadour melodies, and Rhineland street songs, along with some cantillation tropes, which themselves bear the imprint of Central European folksong.

For me, these melodies, in some ways, are as strong as the texts that they accompany. Who could think of an alternative melody to the Kol Nidrei? I would think that would be not possible...

As many piyutim that were written for the *Yamim Noraim* (Days of Awe), there were a few

written for the *Shalosh Regalim* (the pilgrimage festivals of Passover, Shavu'ot, and Sukkot) and one special poem, most of it written sometime in the 13th century, originally to be sung at home during the celebration of Chanukah. *Ma'oz Tzur* (Rock of Ages) is a six-stanza poem that tells the story of Jewish history and recalls the deliverance from Pharaoh (the exodus from Egypt), Nebuchadnezzar (Babylonian captivity), Haman (Purim) and Antiochus (Chanukah). This fabulous poem also has interesting biblical allusions and acrostics. One of the acrostics is found in the 1st letters of the 1st three words of the last stanza, the word, *chazak* which means "be strong"!

This poem has been set to many melodies but by far the most beloved is identified as an offshoot of an old German folk tune also written in the 15th century. It is ironic that this tune was the first tune used by Martin Luther in his settings of his German chorales. This is a great example of the cross-cultural influences between the Jewish European communities and the larger European Christian population.

So, as we light our Chanukah menorahs, we celebrate with pride, our past with the focus to make our lives continually meaningful in the present and the times ahead.

* Worshipping Together - Chanukah

Lighting the *Chanukiah* (Chanukah Menorah)

A Chanukiah takes nine candles, eight at the same level and one shamash (guardian) that stands taller and is used to light all the others. Place the candles in the *Chanukiah* right-to-left (as Hebrew is written and read), but light them left-to-right so that the new candle is lit first.

Each night, you say the first two blessings shown, and on the first night you add the third blessing. After you say the blessings, you light the candles.

Light the candles after sunset, EXCEPT on Friday night when we light Chanukah candles right before we light Shabbat candles.



The 1st night of Chanukah this year is Tuesday, December 12.

A Historical Refresher

In 168 BCE, Syria's King Antiochus marched into Jerusalem to end Jewish worship in his kingdom. His soldiers desecrated the Temple and killed thousands of people. Three years later, Judah, a son of Mattathias the Kohen (priest), led a rebellion and re-took Jerusalem. His search for pure, untainted olive oil to light the menorah thus rededicating and returning Jewish practice to the Temple – netted enough for only one day. Miraculously, it lasted for eight.





A Historical Atlas of the Jewish People: From the *Time of the Patriarchs to the Present*, edited by Eli Barnavi, was recently donated to the Beth El Temple Library by Lillian Rosenberg. The history of the Jews spans more than three millennia, encompassing most parts of the globe. The saga is set forth pictorially in a comprehensive and richly illustrated and designed volume. Hundreds of detailed maps, photographs, and drawings, combine with chronologies and commentaries by leading experts to make the narrative. Virtually all of the key elements of Jewish history and culture are examined – the background of the Bible; the Israelite tribes; revolts, wars, and religious developments; the Jewish faith within Middle Eastern history; and the Diaspora. Readers travel

with millions of immigrants to the "Golden Land" and watch as they create new lives and a new culture. Modern Jewish history completes the book with the birth of political Zionism, founding of the State of Israel, and Judaism's survival.





We Look Like the Enemy: The Hidden Story of Israel's Jews from Arab Lands, by Rachel Shabi, explores a more specific aspect of Jewish heritage. She was born in Israel to Jewish immigrants from Iraq who came to Israel during the

mass immigration of the early 1950s. Afterwards, the family moved to England, where Shabi grew up and became a journalist. She returned to Israel to investigate relations in Israel between *Mizrahim* and *Ashkenazim*. The book is based on conversations with family members and other Mizrahi individuals as well as selected studies relating to the subject. She sees *Mizrahim* as both primitive and similar to Arabs, the Jewish state's enemies. The importance of this very personal book is in the insights it provides into the feelings and attitudes of both groups toward social, cultural, and political conditions in Israel.






