# Commission on Jewish Education & Leadership (CJEL)



In our inaugural year, SULAM received 3 awards from CJEL at the 2018 Annual Meeting of the Jewish Federation of Greater Hartford.

The Innovative Family Program Award was presented to Rabbi Ilana Garber, for the *Sixth Grade Bar/Bat Mitzvah & Beyond Series*. This new approach engaged and educated our Bar/Bat Mitzvah aged learners and their parents. Families strengthened their connection to our Beth El community, and the learners created a more meaningful connection to the Bar/Bat Mitzvah liturgy, their individual Torah portions, and mitzvah projects.

The Innovative Program Award was presented to Anita Levy, SULAM educator, for *Sharing the Dream*. This new curriculum for 7<sup>th</sup> grade learners successfully connected the teachings of Torah, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel, and our Rabbi Emeritus Stanley Kessler (who marched with King and Heschel) to real life situations. Learners were able to personally experience the meaning of the Torah by doing *g'milut chasidim* (good deeds) and connect these lessons to the civil rights movement.

The Uniquely Effective Teen Aide award was presented to Jordan Oberstein, who has served as a *madrich* (teen aide) for several years. He worked with the t<sup>h</sup> grade, helped manage the open learning space model, demonstrated flexibility and problem-solving skills, and was the go-to guy for anything involving technology.

# \* A Rabbi's Desk - Tuning up the Rosh



As we count down to the start of *Rosh* Hashanah (lit: head of the year), let's take a moment to explore the word *Rosh.* Why that particular word?

Our rabbis have taught us that the head is the key to not just our body's, but equally important to our soul's,

survival. Without the head, there is no us, physically or spiritually. Rosh Hashanah is the time annually when we both renew and recharge our "spiritual heads," a time where we rededicate ourselves to the ways we will serve each other and God.

Our liturgy points to this renewal in the *Musaf* service on both days of the holiday, with three special segments within the framework of the day's prayer. In the first, *Malkhuyot*, we express our humble acknowledgement of God's sovereignty. A more familiar way of looking at this is the teaching "know before whom you stand" - which happens to be inscribed above the ark in the chapel. Understanding that during each moment in our lives we always stand in front of God, can have a huge impact on what we say and what we do.

The second service, *Zikhronot*, reminds us that God remembers our deeds and all that has happened in our lives. Of course, we have Yom Kippur to try and

effect forgiveness for our wrongdoings, but knowing that there is a "divine ledger" being kept on our lives should again humble us in our daily actions.

Lastly, *Shofarot* culminates with the nervous anticipation of the future. Again, if we go forward with the Jewish teaching that "we put God in front of us at all times," then we can prepare to help and serve in a better way. The blasts of the Shofar, done 100 times on each day of Rosh Hashanah (except on Shabbat), is meant to awaken us physically and spiritually, helping us realize that our lives going forward must be better than our lives over the past year.

All of these messages combine to prepare our head, our *rosh*, for the coming year. We need two days (not just one) to prepare our heads, bodies, and souls for the 360 (or so) days until this renewal can help us again the next year. We need to be reinvigorated with the strength to carry us to do only good in this world, especially with the adversity that we face every day.

May Rosh Hashanah 5779 fill all our heads with the koach (strength) that we may need to see us through any difficulties and to do good deeds, helping each other throughout this new year.
















# \* Reflections from the President



Recently, Rabbi Rosen and I attended a community event entitled "Responding to the Trauma of Children at our Borders." The speakers were excellent; the stories heart-wrenching. As I listened, I was reminded of a presentation by a Holocaust survivor named Ruth

Weiner. Ruth was just 8 years old when she escaped from Austria during the Holocaust.

Along with her own account, Ruth told the story of Mickey Goldman. Mr. Goldman testified at the trial of Adolf Eichmann (one of the Holocaust's main architects). At the trial, Mr. Goldman told his own story of survival, recalling being beaten 80 times by

the Nazi commander of the Przemysl labor camp. However, he said the worst blow of all was "the 81st blow" – the fact that there were those who did not believe his story or did not empathize with his plight.

We all know that Judaism teaches us to love our neighbor as our self. Ruth's presentation reminds us that Judaism is not just based on lofty ideals, but based also on deeds and acts of kindness. Let us not be the caster of the 81st blow through our indifference. As we approach the New Year, let's try to think of how we can see beyond ourselves to ways we can contribute toward making our world a more loving and caring place for all of us.

# **★ Cantor's Corner** - On Composing a Piece of Music



It is a somewhat daunting task to begin to write a piece of music. I occasionally get questions like, "How do you write music, and from where do

you get the ideas?"

Well, I don't know exactly how it's done, but I am pretty sure that to compose a piece of music, or to write a text and proceed with a creative gesture, one should allow oneself to be open to any and every possibility that might give meaning to the creative intention.

For example, if I were to write a song to be used for Shabbat, Rosh Hashanah, or even a wedding, I would try to find a combination of notes and rhythms that would elicit feelings of joy and celebration; but how do the notes make their appearance???

The most important part for me, in thinking of the music, is to try to look at every possible parameter. So, for a wedding: Who is the couple? What is my relationship to them and their families? What is my relationship to the world surrounding me at the

time I am writing this music?

This is followed by moments of "letting it come to me." I can't really describe these feelings except to say that those moments include an abdication, a surrender, to the creative spirit, and a feeling of trust that the time ahead will be guided by a belief in "the honesty of the moment."

Only then do the notes start to fall into a structure that can become something meaningful. Ultimately, it is a process of making a statement that is personal, one that has significance and relevance for me as the composer. This is the point at which the composition has the potential to be worthwhile and significant to the active listeners.

I would like to think that this creative process might be a paradigm as to how we can look forward to the New Year, visualizing it as a clean sheet of writing paper, with nothing written on it yet, but having the potential to be the masterpiece that is our lives, our community and our dreams...

# **★ Sukkot** - The Ultimate Together Holiday (just outside)

As soon as Yom Kippur ends, the build-up to Sukkot begins. This week-long holiday starts just five days after Yom Kippur. It is named for the huts, or booths, where Jews are required to "dwell" during the festival. One of the three pilgrimage festivals of ancient Israel, Sukkot celebrates the Fall harvest. Never built a sukkah? The Internet has all the info you need to get started!

You'll find Beth El's sukkah in the Ceremonial Court off of Hoffman Hall. Outside the synagogue, you'll find them in backyards across our community. We "dwell" in the sukkah during the holiday, eating our meals and, for the hearty among us, sleeping in them as well. A sukkah can be

made out of a variety of materials, but the roof must consist of natural materials (i.e tree branches) which allow you to see the sky and stars at night.

Historically, the sukkah represents the farmers' huts that were built in the fields of ancient Israel during the Fall harvest, and the dwellings of the Israelites in the wilderness of the Exodus. It is by definition a flimsy structure, symbolizing the fragile nature of life and our dependence on God's protection.

As with all Jewish festivals, services at Beth El play a key role in our communal celebration of Sukkot. We ask God to save us (*hoshana*, from which we get the English word hosanna). During the



# \* Lifelong Learning - Holidays

## What is it all about? ~ Questions & Answers about our traditions.

Why do lews donate money to their synagogue **at the time of High Holidays?** The High Holidays are a time when Jews – regardless of their level of engagement or observance – feel most connected to their Jewish selves. During the month of Elul preceding Rosh Hashanah, it is customary to increase the giving of charity, as well as ask forgiveness from people one may have wronged. It is a time when Jewish organizations of all kinds seek to inspire Jews to step up their involvement and, yes, to also increase their charitable giving.

Why do we visit the cemetery before Yom **Kippur?** It is a traditional time of remembrance and recalling loved ones who have passed.

Why is the Havdalah service different on Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur? All festivals and Shabbat conclude with *Havdalah* prayers, recited at the end of Ma'ariv. On Rosh Hashanah and other festivals it is modified and does not include the spices or flame. But, since Yom Kippur is described in the Torah as Shabbat Shabaton Hee Lachem (Sabbath of Sabbaths it will be for you) a full Havdalah is recited at the end of Neilah (similar to Shabbat each week).

Why do we wear white and sneakers on Yom **Kippur?** White is a sign of purity. Shoes without leather (some sneaker brands) are worn so as to have no luxury - leather is considered a luxury.

Why is a Tallit worn at night only on Yom **Kippur?** Yom Kippur is considered one full day of prayers, starting with *Kol Nidrei*. We continue to wear

the tallit through Neilah, the end of the full day. The tallit is not worn during regular weekday evening services.

Why is Neilah such a special service at Beth El? Literally, the closing of the gates. This is the final service on Yom Kippur and the Ark is open for about an hour. While it is open, we have one last chance to seek repentance and be sealed in the Book of Life. At Beth El, everyone, including non-Jewish relatives, is invited to stand for a private moment at the open Ark.

What are the special honors on Simchat Torah?

There are three special *aliyot*, and to receive one during the Torah reading is a great honor at all synagogues. For the first, we read the last section of the Torah, when Moses passes away. The second goes back to the beginning with the story Creation and the establishment of Shabbat. The third is a portion that precedes the Haftarah reading for the day – the first chapter of Joshua, which is the book that immediately follows the Five Books of the Torah. The honors are called *Kallah* or Chatan, "bride or bridegroom" of the Torah, which reflects on the specialness of these honors. At Beth El, each of the honorees is brought to the bima under a chuppa, signifying the "wedding-like" atmosphere of the moment, with special blessings recited over the honoree.

# What does it all mean? ~ Terms used during the Holidays, and year-round

Aliyah/Aliyot (pl) ~ lit. "going up," an honor to ascend the bima

**Amidah** ~ the central prayer in all services, generally recited while standing

**Bima** ~ the pulpit

**Chatan** ~ lit. "bridegroom"

**Diaspora** ~ a scattered population whose origin lies within a particular geographic locale; or the movement of a population from its original homeland. In particular, the term refers to all Jews who live outside of

**Erev** ~ lit. "evening," commonly used to denote the eve on which a holiday or Shabbat begins

**Havdalah** ~ a ceremony that marks the end of Shabbat or a holiday. On Shabbat it involves wine, spices, and a braided candle. On most holidays, just wine.

**Kabbalat Shabbat** ~ the service that welcomes in Shabbat, recited on Friday evenings

**Kallat** ~ lit. "bride of"

**Ma'ariv** ~ the name of the evening service that commences each new **Jewish day** 

Mincha ~ the name of the afternoon service of each Jewish day

**Musaf** ~ the additional service added on Shabbat and many holidays, and is greatly extended on the High **Holidays** 

**Shabbat** ~ the Jewish Sabbath, a period of rest each week which commences on Friday night just before sundown, for a 25 hour period. It begins with candle lighting, and ends with Havdalah.

**Shacharit** ~ the morning service each day

**Shofar** ~ a ram's horn that is used to make a blast of noise like a trumpet, and is used in Rosh Hashanah services and at the end of Yom Kippur.

Yom ~ lit. "day"

- ☆ Treatment and reuse of almost all domestic waste water for agricultural irrigation
- ★ Highly advanced and very efficient irrigation methods
- strains with 10 times higher yield from the same amount of water
- ⇒ Pioneering work in drilling exceptionally deep wells
- ★ Large-scale desalination of seawater and brackish groundwater
- ★ Controls of algae blooms in reservoirs for reused water

- **⋄** Innovative water safety methods, early warning systems,
- ★ Innovative methods for minimizing non-revenue water

Government policies throughout Israel's history have ensured a continuous supply of potable water for all citizens and promoted sustainable national water

at an impressive 86%! All while still conserving and protecting natural water resources. (Spain is second at 17%).

Desalination techniques made great leaps forward in the last decade, at considerable cost savings due to novel membrane technology. Five plants along the Mediterranean Coast have led the way to this amazing surplus.

> Water is also an area of collaboration between Israel and her supplies 7% of Jordan's water needs, at cost. Collaboration between Israel's and Palestine's water management companies continues



Israel shares her knowledge and techniques around the world from India to Africa and here in the US. Many people have a lot to thank Israel for! Water management is one more indication of Israeli ingenuity and foresight. Long range planning, conservation, support of novel ideas, persistence, and dedicated problem solving are the hallmarks of Israel's existence and make us justly proud.


for corporations, institutions, and universities. He is a member of the National Sculpture Society, National Academy of Design, Artists' Fellowship and other fine
