



SULAM Standards

SULAM is a kehillah (community) of learners; we are all learning from one another. For our SULAM kehillah to be a successful learning community we each must adhere to the highest of standards. These standards apply to everyone in our SULAM kehillah: learners, madrichim (teen aides), educators, synagogue staff, and parents. They apply when we are on Beth El Temple property, when we attend synagogue or SULAM events, and when we represent Beth El Temple out in the wider community.

It is a Jewish value to conduct our lives with love and respect for others. At SULAM we stress the following kinds of respect: respect for others and ourselves, respect for subject matter and respect for our surroundings.

Respect for Others and Ourselves

In our SULAM kehillah we treat everyone with respect, dignity and sensitivity. Simply put, we must not harm another person's body, another person's things, or another person's feelings. We encourage others to express their opinions in a safe environment.

Respect for Subject Matter

Torah is at the heart of all we learn. Within every subject, we are exploring Jewish heritage, culture, beliefs and values. These are essential for transmitting Judaism from generation to generation. All educational materials must be treated with care.

Respect for Our Surroundings

Beth El Temple is a sacred place. We pray in the sanctuary, learn and socialize throughout the building. We treat all spaces with dignity.
