The Broken Alliance: What Happened Between Blacks and Jews

During the Civil Rights Movement of the 1960's, Blacks and Jews marched together in the hopes of achieving the equality that African Americans had been fighting for since their arrival on the shores of America. It was a dream never to be fulfilled, and Jews, knowing full well what it meant to be outcast and marginalized, took up the cause of their Black brothers. Seeking justice, Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., and Rabbi Abraham Joshua Herschel walked arm in arm, leading thousands together across the Edmund Pettus Bridge, in the March from Selma to Montgomery.

That bond between Jews and Blacks is no longer! What happened? Can it ever be repaired? In this 90 minute presentation, Dr Joyce Witt will explore the reasons why this breach happened and explore questions for the future of this broken relationship.
