This event is both a celebration of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.'s 1965 civil rights speech on the Green and the kickoff for a social justice campaign to continue his work.

You can learn more about these local efforts from a WTTW documentary by Rich Samuels, in which Rabbi Robert Marx said:

"People in the suburbs were feeling, here we're educating for an open society in the South. Let's take a look at our own front yard – not even back yard – let's take a look at where we are. And they were seeing that where we are had its tremendous problems."
