We have already provided funds for 4 projects (for legal aid, support for foster parents, aid to refugees, and congregational efforts at the border), and the trustees are eager to provide funding for additional projects that include active involvement from Hakafa member(s), that work towards authentic justice, and that build shared and sustained justice. Eligible projects include existing Hakafa social justice projects, existing projects led by other organizations, or new projects you'd like to start. We are eager to fund projects that engage members of the Congregation in volunteering, advocacy, or education, and that help to "move" justice work on topics of interest to the congregation. We are especially interested in projects led by youth and young adult members.

OPPORTUNITIES TO HELP/VOLUNTEER:

RAC-IL 2024 Advocacy Issues

The RAC-IL (Illinois Religious Action Center of Reform Judaism) has selected 2 issues for its advocacy campaign in Illinois in 2024, and we welcome your involvement. The issues, **Gun Violence Prevention and Barriers to Affordable Housing**, were selected through a listening campaign (some Hakafa members participated). There are 2 bills that will be the focus for the 2024 work:

- 1. Gun Violence Prevention: Karina's Bill, which requires firearm removal to occur during service of an emergency order of protection when granted by a judge.
- Barriers to Affordable Housing: Build Illinois Homes Tax Credit, which creates an additional funding source to build more affordable housing in Illinois. The state would offer an income tax credit to businesses or individuals who build affordable housing.

NSUMC Stitchers Group - A Common Thread

A Common Thread, a stitchers group created by members of the North Shore United Methodist Church, meets monthly on the first Saturday of each month, and Hakafa members are invited.

Their next gathering will be on **Saturday, April 6** at **1:30 PM** at the **North Shore United Methodist Church (NSUMC)** (213 Hazel Avenue, Glencoe). **They are currently prepping and crocheting sleep mats for distribution to people who are unhoused** through a Deerfield agency. They use grocery store plastic bags which are then cut into

strips and knotted together to make the "plarn" (plastic yarn) that is crocheted into the sleep mat. If you'd like to participate, please contact Marjorie Kemp at the NSUMC (mkemp@northshoreumc.com). If you don't know how to knit (or crochet), but would like to learn, call Marjorie at 847-308-1947 or Marj Passini at 630-802-7339, and they can provide materials. IN ADDITION, A Common Thread organizers are meeting with other local faith communities to put together a larger more focused group and are polling people about days and times that work for meeting. They would rotate around the community, and their first project will be knitted hats for refugees.
