Join David Rieser for this first of two sessions on "By the Rivers of Babylon: Exile, Return, and the Birth of Judaism." The trauma of the destruction of the Kingdom of Judea by the Babylonians in 586 BCE and the deportation of a large swath of the Judean elite still resonate in the literature of the prophets as they sought to explain the tragedy. Some of that literature began to be crafted while these Judeans were still in captivity and some written or redacted upon the return to Judea 70 years later. Within those explanations lay the seeds of a new religious approach based on the lessons learned in Babylon and recognizing that the returnees to Judea still constituted an elite best suited to teach those lessons to the people who remained behind. Later prophets such as Ezra and Nehemiah explicitly laid out this new course which informed not only the prophetic literature but the various redactions of the Bible that followed the return, and created the Judaism with which we are familiar. Our discussion will focus on the

historical record for these events, (such as it is), the literature, and how the resulting conflicts within the Judean community still affect the Jewish community today.

Hakafa member David Rieser is a lawyer by profession, and while he was always a history buff, his Bar Mitzvah at Hakafa sixteen years ago sparked an apparently insatiable interest in Jewish history. He made the mistake of telling Rabbi Elder about some of his reading, so this is now his fifteenth adult education discussion.

Celebrate Passover with Hakafa at our annual Second-Night Passover Seder! Unfortunately, registration has closed for the in-person seder. If you are not already registered to attend in person, you are welcome to join us via Zoom. There is no reservation or fee needed to participate via Zoom. For those participating via Zoom, here are some details that will help you prepare and participate:

- We will be sharing an online haggadah on the screen, so there is no need for you to bring your own.
- We encourage you to have your own seder plate, though it is not necessary in order for you to participate in the seder.
 - o If you do not have a seder plate, you can use a regular plate.
 - Your seder plate should have the following items on it: horseradish, a sprig of parsley or other green vegetable, a roasted or hard-boiled egg, a spoon of charoset, a piece of lettuce, and a shank bone (if you have one - a chicken bone will also work).
- Please also include an item that you would like to add to the seder plate. What
 would you like to remember, commemorate, or honor at our seder that is not included in
 the symbols we already have on the plate? Add your object to our collective call to
 freedom.
- We will be tasting different foods throughout the seder, therefore it would be helpful if you had parsley, salt water, matzah, horseradish, and some charoset available to eat
- Don't forget an extra glass and some wine or juice for Elijah and a glass of water to honor Miriam.

RAC-IL New 2024 Campaigns

Help support RAC-IL's (Illinois Religious Action Center of Reform Judaism) new 2024 campaigns: Gun Violence Prevention - Karina's Bill SB 2633 which will require firearm removal to occur during service of an emergency order of protection when granted by a judge; and Removing Barriers to Affordable Housing - Build Illinois Homes Tax Credit SB3233 which creates an additional funding source to build more affordable housing in Illinois through income tax credits to businesses in compliance with the bill. We will be advocating for passage of both bills during the 2024 legislative session by meeting with legislators, phone calls to legislators, witness slips, email drives (see below) and in person advocacy days in Springfield.
