Thank You

My mother's name was Joy. I called her "Joy of my Life." She was such a wonderful woman. We miss her very much.

What made my mother so remarkable was how unremarkable she was. She didn't try to be more than she was; she merely lived her life. She helped, because she should; she gave, because she could; she never judged, because she wouldn't; and, she never sought recognition, because there was no need or reason for it. My mother was plain and simple and bright and airy and curious and there, always there. Her smile and disposition radiated her name: Joy.

The move from Youngstown to Chicago was difficult for my mother. You might remember when I talked about it at her first Yom Kippur service as a Hakafa member four years ago. My mother's life had been intimately intertwined with the life and vibrancy of Youngstown's Jewish community. She started the Jewish library in the 1970s. She sang in her synagogue's High Holy Day choir. She was active on the Jewish Community Relations Council's board, driving its Holocaust education initiatives. My mother came to Youngstown in 1956, when it was at the height of its vitality. And, she experienced its slow decline from the 1970s onward after the steel mills closed. The Jewish community began to wither as Youngstown did. It is heartbreaking for those of us who grew up there to watch it continue in its spiraling malaise.

The decision, then, to move my mother here was not an easy one. As many of you have heard me say, my siblings and I fought over who would get to have my mother close by. I am the lucky one – I won. And as much as she tried to convince herself that this was the best option for her, my mother didn't want to leave the comfort, security, and routine of home. She was always small town; coming here was almost too much to consider.

She didn't complain, though. My mother never complained. As much as she did not want to leave Youngstown, as much as she did not want to live in an assisted living facility, and as much as she didn't want to – in her words – "be a burden to any of us," my mother accepted her new situation with grace. She did so, in large part, because of all of you.

Mom always loved Hakafa. She would feel so welcomed and included every time she and her husband, Len, would visit. And, the way everyone made her feel so comfortable when she moved here eased her transition into this new phase of her life. She came to Torah discussion every Wednesday and services every Shabbat. She came on Sunday mornings when she could. She was present at confirmations and Passover seders and Megillah readings. She hated to miss anything. She liked being the rabbi's mother, to be sure; but even more, she loved how all of you didn't treat her that way and just let her be her.

And, as you treated her in life, you respected and honored her in death. Our chevra kadisha prepared and watched over her; our chesed committee took care of the shiva and of my family. Our president coordinated so much. A couple of you even came to Youngstown for the funeral. The outpouring of love and support from all of you – the food, the donations, the calls, the texts, the notes – has been overwhelming. Rona, the boys, and I are touched beyond words.

Hakafa means encirclement, and an encirclement is an embrace. You all embraced my mother. You continue to embrace and sustain my family. You are such a special, gentle, loving community.

Thank you. Thank you all.

Shavuot

The holiday of Shavuot (pronounced shah-voo-OAT) occurs on the sixth day of the Hebrew month of Sivan (beginning at sundown on Saturday, June 8 this year). It is the second of three pilgrimage festivals (Passover and Sukkot are the other two) and is a day on which *yizkor* is observed. Shavuot commemorates the day God gave Moses the Ten Commandments on Mount Sinai. It also has an agricultural reference, marking a stage in the harvest. One of the customs of Shavuot is to hold a *tikkun*, or Torah-based learning session, mostly late into the night.
