Rabbi's Message



Looking Toward a Better Future

Over the last few years we have seen an increasing number of senseless tragedies, from lone individuals massacring innocent civilians, terrorism, wars around the globe and our continued contentious and very divided political climate. What is as disturbing is the rise of anti-semitism throughout our own country and the world.

None of this occurs in a vacuum and over the last few years we have seen this exponential rise in not only anti-Semitism, often justified as anti-Israel sentiment, but also attacks against minority groups, both in America and around the world.

Like many of you, I struggle with difficult questions such as, what can I do? How do I protect our children and community? How does one show solidarity against bigotry and hate without pointing fingers and blaming those with different political and religious beliefs than our own?

The truth is there is no one simple solution to fixing this shattered world with which we find ourselves. However, there are glimpses of light that shines through the darkness. We find people from diverse backgrounds coming together in solidarity against the forces of evil who seek to divide and destroy our way of life.

It is during such times that we can turn to the Torah for guidance. In this week's biblical portions, we find the Israelites standing on a similar precipice:

"See, today I will give you both a blessing and a curse. There will be a blessing if you listen to the commandments which Adonai your God has commanded you this day. And a curse if you do not listen to the commandments..." (Deuteronomy 11:26-28)

Here the Israelites are commanded to see the repercussions of living a life dedicated to the ideals and values of freedom and justice that are set forth in the Torah. The idea that every human being regardless of race, gender, religion and sexual orientation is created in the divine image.

As we approach the Jewish High Holy days and begin our period of reflection, soul searching and repentance, we must not only ask God to forgive ourselves, but also learn how to forgive each other. Most importantly, we must learn to not demonize those perceived as the "other". We are all holy brothers and sisters sharing this increasingly small world. We need to remember that those who seek to divide us are insignificant. The more we come together with common purpose, the more these hate-filled voices will be drowned out until one day, God willing, we will live in a society where war, hate, fear and bigotry are permanently left on the bookshelves of history.

Rabbi's Message

This is symbolized when the twelve tribes of Israel split into two, with half standing on Mount Grizim to recite the blessings, and the other half standing on Mount Eival to recite the curses, which can be seen as symbolic of the divisions that not only plagued the Israelites in the desert, but also throughout our history. Once completed, both groups engraved the blessings and curses for all future generations to see.

It is this symbolism of being split into two that gives us inspiration for how we can heal our divided society though tikkun olam. We need to strive to achieve mutual respect and dialogue. All compassionate people must come together and engage in respectful discussion to learn to see through other's eyes, see the divine in everyone, and truly listen to our fellow human beings.




