Chanukah - A Light in the Darkness

During this busy holiday season, it can be difficult to remember the true meaning of Chanukah. It is actually a celebration of religious freedom over religious suppression as told in the story of the Jewish victory over Antiochus IV, Syrian ruler over the Greek Empire. He sought to impose the Greek religion over the inhabitants of the Land of Israel, prohibiting Jewish religious rituals, such as Shabbat observance and circumcision, and desecrated the Temple in Jerusalem by erecting statues of Greek gods and sacrificing pigs on the alter.

Today, we remember when the small group of Jewish fighters, led by Judah the Maccabee, finally broke through and were able to recapture the Temple. By lighting candles each year, we commemorate the re-consecration of the Temple and remember this victory that has served to comfort the Jewish people through many dark periods of persecution and religious repression.

Living in the United States over the last few years, we have unfortunately begun to see a rise in anti-semitic attacks on our community, culminating in the tragic modern day pogrom at the Tree Of Life Synagogue in Pittsburgh. There is a war being fought on all fronts against extremism of all kinds, which eerily resembles the time of Antiochus. There are no borders. Sadly, as well as the attacks against the Jewish community, those hit the hardest are the many minorities from all over the world who are coming under attack. This has led to a humanitarian crisis, which cannot be ignored.

This Chanukah, as we light the menorah, we must remember who we are. In the darkness of religious extremism and intolerance, we should be a light by staying true to our values and not giving into fear and hatred. Although we should stay diligent in protecting our communities and families, we cannot ignore those who are suffering. So during this holiday, reach out to those in need and be an example of tolerance and understanding.

RELIGIOUS SCHOOL



One candle is added to the menorah each night. The first night, you light only the shammus (the one at a different height) and one Chanukkah candle. By the eighth night, you light all of the candles.

Candles should be added to the menorah from right to left (like Hebrew writing)

Blessing over Candles

Light the shammus candle first, then recite the blessings while holding the candle. Do not light the other candles until the blessings are done!




