Ki Tissa – Crime, Punishment and Compassion

Although there are many high points in Exodus to show how the Israelites persevered, the incident of the Golden Calf is an important reminder of what could happen when faith is tested.

While Moses is conversing with God on Mount Sinai for 40 days and nights, the Israelites become anxious of his fate. Feeling abandoned, they turn to Aaron who, in an attempt to placate the increasingly hostile crowd, has them gather all of the gold earrings of the people and fashion a golden calf.

God sends Moses from Sinai to deal with those who have degenerated and strayed from the path of the God of Israel through idolatry. How Moses handles the situation and secures forgiveness for the people represents the essence of how Judaism views not only sin and repentance, but also Divine retribution, compassion and atonement.

Initially, God seeks to destroy the Israelites and start over again. Yet, in the spirit of Abraham, Moses pleads to secure their forgiveness. In fact, he goes one step further and asks God to "...teach me Your ways...and show me Your glory." (Ex. 33:13,18) God Responds "I will cause all my goodness to pass in front of you, and I will proclaim my name, Adonai, in your presence ... I will have mercy on whom I will have mercy, and I will have compassion on whom I will have compassion." But, said the Eternal, "you cannot see My face, for no one may see Me and live" (Ex. 33: 20).

God then places Moses in the cleft of a rock and recites what is known as the thirteen attributes: "Adonai, Adonai, the compassionate and gracious God, slow to anger, abounding in love and faithfulness, maintaining love to thousands, and forgiving wickedness, rebellion and sin. Yet he does not leave the guilty unpunished..." (Ex. 34: 6-7)

These thirteen attributes serve as the focal point for the "selichot" (prayers of forgiveness) that we say leading up to and during the Jewish High Holy Days.

It is at this moment that God teaches all future generations not only how to pray for forgiveness, but also that the Eternal is committed to forgiving those who repent. This is the essence of the Jewish belief that the God of Israel is a God of love, compassion and forgiveness.

However, there are those who do not repent or strive to improve. What of them? Here the above verses conclude: "the sins of the fathers are meted out on their children and children's children," illustrating that our behavior creates consequences for future generations and the truly unrepentant do not go unpunished by God when human justice fails.

These two ideas seemingly contradict one another: forgiveness and compassion verses justice and punishment. In an ideal world, there would be no need for justice and punishment, but there is no ideal world. People take advantage, live without remorse and only act in their own self interests. The idea of Divine justice allows those who live good lives to release their resentment, knowing the guilty will eventually be punished. This in turn allows us to feel compassion toward those around us and practice forgiveness.







Among the honorees was **Temple Sinai's Women** of Sinai President, **Reesa Manning**, who was awarded the WLF Trail Blazer Award.






