Moses reviews the justice system for the Israelites, explains some laws concerning kings, priests, and Levites, and then explains the laws of warfare.

September 14—14 Elul

Ki Teitzei (When You Go Out)

Moses delivers specific rules about proper family relationships, and many aspects of daily living, including justice, family responsibility, work, and sexuality.

September 21—21 Elul

Ki Tavo (When You Enter In)

Moses instructs the Israelites regarding the first fruit offering, then goes on to list the rewards of keeping the commandments, and the punishments for disobeying them.

September 28—28 Elul

Nitzavim (You are Standing)

Moses describes the Covenant between G-d and the Israelites, urging the Israelites to uphold the Covenant and honor the Torah so that they may be rewarded with life in the Land of Israel.

President's Message

Temple Sinai 1.0 began with the dedication of the Temple Sinai building on March 2, 2001. Many meaningful Shabbat and High Holy Day services, Bar and Bat Mitzvahs, Confirmations and sadly memorials would take place in Temple Sinai's new house of Worship.



Temple Sinai 2.0 began on Sunday, October 25, 2015 when Beatrice Eslamboly, President, and Reesa Manning, Board Member, presented a plan for individuals to invest in a 5 year note to be used to refinance the mortgage on the Temple Sinai Property through an LLC referred to as Semble. By April 2016, enough funds were invested to refinance the mortgage.

Temple Sinai 3.0 begins Friday, August 30, 2019. The sale of the 4.25 acre property and preschool building closed escrow. Funds have been wired to Semble to pay all Semble investors, or in the case of IRA investments, the IRA's will be moved back to the originating IRA's. When Semble receives the funds and paperwork, they anticipate completing the distribution to investors by September 15, 2019.

To the 68 individuals or couples who supported **Temple Sinai 2.0**, our gratitude will never cease. Special thanks goes to Burt Kaplan, may his memory be a blessing. His bequests to Temple Sinai were instrumental in having the funds to pay Semble. Long time member, Rick Stein, financial manager and trustee of the Kaplan estate was very helpful in getting the funds released to Temple Sinai.

Now that we are getting our financial house in order, lets all move on to the reasons Temple Sinai exists:

A temple that embraces members and guests alike, providing a safe haven and a vibrant venue for Jewish religious, educational, cultural and social programs.

High Holidays 5780

Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur are just around the corner. It is customary the month before the New Year, the Hebrew month of Elul, to evaluate the previous year from both a personal and communal perspective. It has been a trying year for Jewish communities throughout the world, especially in the US, and Israel. Jew-hatred has reached levels never seen before. Unprecedented attacks have occurred in Pittsburgh and Poway. With the violence in Israel escalating at an alarming pace, anti-Israel, Jew-hatred rhetoric is also on the rise. Members of the US congress who seek to divide US Jewry use Israel as the wedge. We must not let this stand. We are too small a people to allow rhetoric to destroy us from white-supremacists, and those who use Israel and BDS as an expression of their hatred for our people.

The Coachella Valley has a small, yet vibrant Jewish community that represents a microcosm of worldwide Jewry with similar challenges. We are not immune to the issues facing our people as a whole. We have had to take steps in our community to secure our facilities and educate our staff and congregation to keep us safe and secure. Education and having respectful dialogue is also essential in keeping us united.

During this period, as we look inward for solutions to our problems, we need to engage with those we disagree with outwardly. This is a form of *Teshuvah*, repentance. The Jewish people, as founders of monotheism, brought a moral code into the world with the Ten Commandments. Much of modern civil law finds its roots in the pages of the Talmud. We are people who see God's hand in history, a people who stand at the forefront in the fight for social justice and the cause of freedom and equality. These are the tools we have in hand to change today's narrative of division and hate.

We are no better than our fellow human beings; each individual is unique. We are an ancient people who continue to see the miracles of creation in science and human creativity. As we look toward the Jewish New Year, we must follow the examples of the previous generations who built this community. Temple Sinai is an oasis with the only religious school and adult education program in the valley. It is here we have the opportunity to strengthen ourselves and our young people for whatever the future may bring. We are a family who truly cares for one another. I encourage all of us to look inward this year and think about what more can be done for our people, our family, and our community. Let us be inspired to work to leave our legacy for the next generation.



Beginning a new year of school always reminds me that the more we know, the more there is to learn. Life-long Jewish learning is an important part of our community and is an inspiration to all that enter our Shul. Our Rabbi Avi Levine Religious school begins on September 10th for 4th through 7th graders, and on September 15th for K through Confirmation. We have a wonderful team of teachers and support staff, and we have been busy this summer creating a supportive learning environment for our students. On our first Sunday, when the students arrive, parents will be asked to stay for our opening program in the



sanctuary, and to then escort their children to their classrooms. We're proud of the children's classrooms and we want the parents to see the work that has been done to update them. Later in the school year, each class will have a mishpachah (family) program where students and parents will learn together in their child's classroom. Be sure to check the "Beit Sefer News" published every Sunday during the schoolyear for upcoming events!

The philosophy of our school is to create community among the students and to give them the tools they need to feel comfortable and knowledgeable in any Shul they travel to. This means making lifelong friends and becoming literate in Jewish worship and prayer. Every Sunday at 11:30 AM, there will be a prayer service led by our madrichim (student helpers) and Kitah Zayin class. This is a "learner's minyan" and is open to the entire congregation. Please feel free to join our youth in prayer and song. It's a wonderful intergenerational opportunity and also a time to practice our liturgy. Hope to see you there!






