Vayigash (And He Approached)

Genesis 44:18 - 47:27

Joseph's brothers refuse to return to Canaan without Benjamin, whom Joseph has falsely accused of theft. Joseph reveals his true identity, and invites his brothers to return for their father Jacob and their families and bring them to live in Egypt.

January 11 — 14 Tevet

Vayechi (And He Lived)

Genesis 47:28 - 50:26

On his deathbed, Jacob blesses his grandchildren, Ephraim and Menashe, then blesses each of his sons. Jacob dies. Joseph affirms to his brothers that he has forgiven them for their misdeeds. Ending the book of Genesis, Joseph dies.

January 18 — 21 Tevet

Shemot (Names)

Exodus 1:1 - 6:1

The new Pharoah makes all the Israelites slaves, orders the deaths of all newborn Israelite boys. Moses' mother puts her son in a basket in the river. He is saved by Pharaoh's daughter. As an adult, he kills an Egyptian taskmaster, flees to Midian, Marries Zipporah. Gd tells Moses and Aaron to return to Egypt and free the slaves.

January 25 — 28 Tevet

Vaera (And I Appeared)

Exodus 6:2 - 9:35

God tells Moses and Aaron to go to Pharaoh to demand freedom for the Israelites. Pharaoh refuses, and God unleashes plagues on the Egyptians.

RABBI SEARCH COMMITTEE REVIEW

Within days of the Rabbi's letter of resignation in October, a 10-person Rabbi Search Committee was established from a cross-section of the congregation. As of December 31 we have:

- 1. Developed a description of who we are as a congregation to provide insight for prospective applicants.
- 2. Created a list of priorities that we feel are necessary for our next rabbi to have.
- 3. Completed the CCAR (Central Conference of American Rabbis) 6-page application for an interim rabbi.
- 4. Completed the CCAR 6-page application for a permanent rabbi.

We will need an interim (temporary) rabbi for an unknown period of time while we do a diligent search for a permanent rabbi. We are asking CCAR for an interim rabbi as soon a possible to continue our programs with minimal interruption.

We extend our heartfelt thanks to current members who are stepping up to lead services on Friday evening and Shabbat morning, and lead Torah Study on Shabbat morning.

Both applications were submitted on January 1, 2020 so when the Director of Placement turns on her computer on January 2, the applications will be on her screen and ready for distribution to rabbis who desire only interim positions, and to rabbis who are looking for permanent jobs as a congregational rabbi.

It is truly a "learner's minyan" and we invite community members to witness the students' growing leadership and knowledge.






