





From the Rabbi

That was some Tishri! We now move into the month of Cheshvan which has no Jewish festivals. It does have four Shabbatot, our weekly "palace in time" where we are able to break from our daily lives to catch our breath. Even before I was a rabbi I always loved Shabbat. It is what I consider "intentional space," where I exchange the daily activities from the rest of the week with Shabbat.



Shabbat morning at Sinai is a time when many congregants convene in the chapel or on Zoom to engage in Torah study. Each week is an opportunity to engage with the weekly Torah portion as we go over well-known texts to glean new observations. Then at 10 a.m. we have Shabbat morning worship which features prayers about our health and body, our daily miracles, and our gratitude for the gift of being. If you think that the Torah study and Shabbat worship are not for you, think again. All of it is accessible to you whether you know Hebrew or not, whether you have studied Torah forever or you are just dipping your toe in the water.

If you are a person who has felt uncomfortable with Torah study, or with prayer, know that our Shabbat morning offerings exist to feed your being, to have you invest your valuable time so that when you leave you experience it as time well spent. Know that I welcome everyone.



Bereshit Crossword Puzzle




