From the Rabbi

As you read this we are closing in on counting the Omer, a seven week period (a week is a shavua in Hebrew) that connects the second night of Passover, the festival of our liberation, to Shavout, the festival of our receiving Torah. Both Passover and Shavout have agricultural roots. Passover was originally the time of the planting of the crops for the year, including the spring wheat. Shavout is when the first spring wheat was harvested and taken to the ancient Temple.

Now known as "Z'man matan Torahteinu"-Shavout is our

observance of the giving of Torah. One custom, the Tikkun Leil Shavout, was begun by the Kabbalists living in 16th Century Tzafat. They would rise at midnight and study Torah until sunrise (it also was a time when the wakening affects of caffeine were realized.).

In modernity Shavout is often the least observed of the three festivals. Here at Sinai we will observe Shavout on June 5th at 10 a.m. where the Torah portion will be the Ten Utterances ("commandments"), we will recite some psalms from Hallel, and hold a Yizkor service. All are welcome. It will be available online on the Zoom link used for Shabbat morning. Whether you join us on June 5th or not, enjoy summer wherever you find yourself! Chag Shavout Sameach!

In the next few days, you should all receive a request for your dues commitment for the coming fiscal year. The Finance Committee and the Board of Directors developed a bare-bones budget that will include having our Cantorial Soloist Wayne Abravanel providing music each Shabbat from mid-September through May, that will provide for the return of four Shabbat dinners, that will provide for the return for some additional adult education including the popular Lunch & Learn series, and that includes some very special fundraising events. We have had to provide for a modest increase in dues for all Temple members and an increase in the cost of security which is now included in the dues figures rather than stated as a separate assessment. We also increased the number of Patron levels and are so grateful to those congregants who help to sustain the temple at the various Patron levels. Watch for details.

Our pre-Onegs before services each Erev Shabbat have proven to be most enjoyable so we are planning to continue them throughout the summer. With fewer people in-person at services during the summer, we can lower the price of sponsoring a pre-Oneg in June, July, and August to only \$65. 

From the Educator

Shalom Temple Sinai Congregants, Families, and Students,

Our academic school year has come to an end. What an amazing year it was. After a year and a half of online learning due to the COVID-19 pandemic, we have returned to in-person teaching while making accommodations to ensure that our students, madrichim, and staff are safe. This in-person teaching promoted social growth and interpersonal bonding between our students, shaping a strong future of individuals who are deeply engaged in Judaism.

Every Tuesday, our students take part in learning and discussing the weekly Torah portion and applying it to today's world. We studied about the commandments given at Mount Sinai. Those codes became

the foundation of law in the Western world, spreading basic values such as equality of all people, charity, the importance of individual freedom, responsibility, human-rights, and justice.

We continued acquiring Jewish pride by celebrating Israel's 74 years of independence. It was amazing to learn about all the contributions a country, smaller than New Jersey, has made to our world.

To commemorate *Yom Ha'Shoah* (Holocaust Remembrance Day) our students hosted a local child Holocaust survivor who shared her incredible survival story. Rickie Taras and her father were the only two individuals in her extended family to survive. Our students are the last generation to be able to hear firsthand about the Holocaust. This will provide them tools to fight hate and discrimination and be advocates for social justice and peace.

Our students concluded their year by learning about the holiday of Shavuot and the lessons obtained from the story of Ruth: welcoming a stranger, loving people regardless of their background, and protecting and providing for the most vulnerable in our society.

Our confirmation students excelled during their May 20 Confirmation service, and we are all very proud of their achievements.

I would like to conclude by thanking our outstanding teachers: Ruthi Rukenstein and Marjorie Lander; our dedicated volunteers Paula Hoffman and Carol Woodward; and our exceptional madrichim Lexi Berman, Tommy Clark, Tara Greene, Ari Sanford and Rachel Sanford. A special thank you to Rabbi Novak who led our *T'fillot* and extended our learning by setting an example of excellent human character.

Wishing everyone a safe and healthy summer and looking forward to another exciting year in the fall.




