



### From the Rabbi

Are you an American Jew or a Jewish American? These hyphenate questions have always seemed silly to me. I am a man, born Jewish, in the United States who was also born gay. I am proud to live in this country and to have made Judaism and the Jewish People my life's work.

Ever since I can remember I have only been attracted to my own gender. There was no choice involved—same as there was no choice for having brown hair, blue eyes and being right-handed. With these identities, I foster what Rabbi Hillel articulated so many years ago: "Do not separate yourself from the community."

Not knowing that my sexual orientation had a name, one morning in shul when I was ten I was paging through the Hertz chumash (Torah commentary) edited by the late Rabbi J.B. Hertz. On the much contested verse Leviticus 18:22 that reads: "With a male you shall not lie [after the manner of] lying with a woman; it is an abomination!"Dr. Hertz commented: "The Torah saves Israel from the depravity of Greece and Rome." Some words for a ten-year-old to encounter! Apparently the Torah did not like how I was born and who I was to be.

Over time I, and many others, have wrestled with this verse, knowing that I am gay and I love the Jewish people. I should not have to choose. Still when it was time for me to go to rabbinic school the doors of Conservative Movement's seminaries were closed to LGBT people (until 2007). I went to HUC-JIR instead and was ordained in 2007.

Fast forward to 2022. I am in the middle of my third year serving Sinai. You are a wonderful congregation and I am grateful to you that I am here. As we all know, the Coachella Valley is home to a large number of people who are part of the LGBTQ community. I, and others, would like to engage them with Sinai which is why we are forming Desert Keshet, Sinai's outreach to the LGBTQ community. On November 18 we will have a Desert Keshet Shabbat evening, with guest speaker David Brinkman, DAP Health's CEO.

Preceding Desert Keshet on Sunday, November 6 Temple Sinai will be marching in the Palm Springs Pride parade. If you are interested in joining us so that the community sees our strength please reply to lgbtq@templesinaipd.org or call the temple office.

I rejoice at being alive at a time when all of us who reflect the Creator's image are embraced at Sinai.

### From the Educator

Shalom Temple Sinai Congregants, Families, and Students,

October was a very festive month for our Rabbi Avi Levine Religious School.

On Sunday, October 9, our students enjoyed a school-wide celebration honoring the holiday of *Sukkot*. This included listening to stories that reflect the history of Sukkot, preparing decorations for our temple sukkah, learning about the meaning of the lulay, and, of course, shaking it in six directions, and even preparing a sukkah style photo frame while learning about the holiday traditions.

On Sunday, October 16, in preparation for the upcoming holiday of *Simchat Torah*, our students witnessed our temple Torah being unrolled, while learning about its five books. They were in awe listening to our educators share that the process of writing can take about a year since it is entirely written by hand. There are 304,805 letters in the Torah scroll, all inscribed with a quill and especially prepared ink. The parchments are made from the skins of a kosher animal. The Torah scrolls are written without vowels or accents. Once the writing has been completed, the parchment sheets are sewn together to make a very long scroll.

Of course, our students are continuing to have fun while learning Hebrew. During recess, they were encouraged to play games while counting in Hebrew.




