RABBI DR. GIDEON M. GOLDENHOLZ



We have been living through some very challenging times recently. The Pandemic is still raging, and if that was not enough we also went through a very mean and painful election season. The hatred that has been vocalized in the public discourse, has left many people dispirited and disheartened. Thank God Channukah is right around the corner. It's appropriate that we'll kindle lights

and remind ourselves that more light and more warmth are indeed needed. In the Talmudic discussion of Chanukkah (Shabbat 23b), the rabbis discuss the importance of the mitzvah of kindling the lights of the Chanukkiyah. Most of our other holidays have a many mitzvot and practices associated with them. Chanukkah has one Mitzvah: light the candles, and put them in an easily visible place. This mitzvah is so important, according to the rabbis, "because of the mitzvah of publicizing the miracle." What is the miracle that these lights symbolize? In the book of Maccabees, the miracle is that a small, zealous band of Jews could withstand the pressures of the Hellenizing empire, fight back against religious persecution, and win the right to maintain our traditions. The rabbis of the Talmud, not wishing to encourage a Jewish rebellion in the time that they were writing, spoke instead of the miracle of the oil for rededicating the Temple, oil which should have lasted only one day but instead lasted eight. In any case, the lights symbolize the possibility of a miracle: the possibility that seemingly hopeless causes can indeed be won. The Channukah candles remind us that illumination is possible even in what looks like the darkest, most frightening circumstances. We will get through the cold, difficult and dark times. And until then, we will kindle lights and celebrate.

I am grateful to see our children celebrating Jewish holidays.


