Rabbi Gelber's Monthly Message

Wednesday, July 19, 2023/1 Av 5783

Dear Friends,

I just returned from a time of deep intellectual, experiential, spiritual and emotional learning in Israel. The temperature's hot, on the thermometer and otherwise.

Residents have gathered enmasse on Saturday evenings for over seven months to protest extreme judicial overhaul.

I joined one protest in proximity to the President's residence in Jerusalem. What did I notice? People of all ages, listening, cheering, waving flags and holding one another up. Space for elders to sit not just on the margins but in the thick of things. A gathering time for all, post Shabbat, to intentionally include traditionally observant protesters. These gatherings are of the people, for the people. Following the protest, I found myself shoulder to shoulder with former MK Tzipi Livni. We introduced ourselves as rabbis from America and she gladly took a photo with us. We wished her long life - ad meah v'esrim (until 120) - on the occasion of her birthday,

something we knew about from the beautiful blessing of yom huledet sameach that rose up from all in attendance during the protest.



Following the protest, I saw no garbage, no water bottles strewn around, not even cigarette butts. The group protesting the protest near the second site of the rally was not even enough for a minyan. I returned to America grateful my heart and body were both in the east for a time.

And, the heat continues to rise. It is unclear how long these gatherings can go on without real violence. We feel this in other spaces as well. This morning, The Women of the Wall - Nashot HaKotel - succeeded in bringing a Torah scroll into the Kotel. The Kotel, a sacred place in the hearts of so many, lives in reality as an ultra orthodox synagogue without space for all Jews . The Bat Mitzvah

received her blessing amidst shrieks of whistles used to drown out the sacred moment of celebration and leadership. Deliberate acts designed to desanctify a holy moment. Fortunately, Nashot HaKotel demonstrates unending resilience. They continue to show up to honor Torah, community, and the potential for kedushah. For how long must we endure hostility in the name of Judaism and Jewish law before an internal awakening brings us together in support of one another?

Tisha B'Av, for which we will gather in just one week, commemorates the destruction of the Temple and other tragedies in our history. The rabbis accredit these calamities to sinat hinam/baseless hatred. It is easier than we think to descend into the sticky and sinister space of hatred for others. This, in turn, has the potential to manifest in hatred of all things created in the image of the divine. We can change this trajectory. Instead of drowning out the unfamiliar and uncomfortable, we can listen actively and remember we have only one world and one life to live. We can learn to appreciate interpretation, difference and diversity. We can instill in ourselves a practice of gratitude to open the

heart and mind and see more of the world than we might otherwise. At the closing session of the Shalom Hartman Institute Rabbinic Torah Study Seminar, my colleague Rabbi Lauren Berkun, Vice President Rabbinic Initiatives, thanked everyone. I was most moved by her naming individually of the maintenance staff of the Institute who managed space for nearly 400 lay leaders, philanthropic professionals, rabbis, Hillel professionals, Day School educators and college students over the course of the summer. That ability to notice and name key partners in the everyday, so easily unseen, added sweetness to weeks of complexity and joy. The inclination to name the holy, especially in places one takes holiness for granted, can transform.

As we begin this month of Av - often accompanied by the word Menachem/comforter - let us really look at what causes us pain, and then commit to adjusting our ways so that we may build up from the ashes, investing in the world as we know it can be.






Momentum Sports NYC
