Rabbi Gelber's Monthly Message

August 18, 2023/1 Elul 5783

Dear Friends,

With the arrival of Elul, we turn to the practice of t'shuvah, turning within to examine and connect with Rav truest selves. our Joseph Soloveitchik sees t'shuvah self-creation, of the process responsibility of fashioning a new self to accompany the new year. Rav Kook, the Abraham Isaac first Ashkenazi Chief Rabbi of Israel, envisions t'shuva as a rediscovery and re-embracing of the true and whole self.

Whether you engage selfreflection to transform your behaviors and intentions, and pave the way towards a new future, or immerse yourself in self-discovery to reveal and reclaim the self you are at your core, t'shuvah invites us to acknowledge where we've been wrong and how we've missed the mark. At the conclusion of Yom Kippur, when we've made havdalah and heard the blast of the shofar, l'shanah we'll sina haba'ah b'y'rushalayim hab'nuyah/next year in a rebuilt Jerusalem. We acknowledge could things better. We be


demonstrate hope through doing. T'shuvah prepares us to improve the world by understanding and reclaiming the ways in which we can change.

This year, in preparation for the



holy days, I invite you to set aside a few minutes each day to mark down - either on paper, a computer screen, or voice memo - the actions and inclinations that block your path to being who you are meant to be. One or two items a day. More if you're so inclined. Maybe there's only one thing. This process of gentle examination and honest assessment can pave the way to releasing ourselves from patterns that bind us solely to a past that might not reflect and honor the best we can be. May this month of Elul and the work of t'shuvah bring us closer to the sh'khinah and may gd's light illuminate our path.







