A Message from Our Rabbi



I have been reflecting lately on what it means to be creative. With Paper Midrash coming the first weekend in March, as I have been talking to people about it, I keep saying that you don't have to be naturally artistic to take part in any of the activities they lead. (This is true, and if you read this before their residency weekend, I hope you know they will walk us through everything!) This got me thinking about how being artistic is just one way to show creativity. There are many ways to be creative, and I like to think we are all creative in some ways. Some of us are artistic and can create works of art with yarn, paper, or paint. Some of us are creative with our words and can write stories or poetry or prayers. Others are expressive and able to do things like act in plays or are really good storytellers. Some fight for social justice and seek to create a world that is more just and equitable. And others are good teachers who help other people find their creative spark. I have seen all of these types of creativity in our congregation, and it is inspiring.

One concept I love in our tradition is the idea in the *yotzer*, the morning creation prayer, that says that God renews the work of creation day by day. This expresses the newness of each moment, even knowing that God created the world millennia ago. And it reminds us that we, too, have the chance to achieve a fresh start each day. We have a chance to create, to refresh and renew, to change or enhance our lives in some small way.

In our Thursday Adult Education sessions, we have been talking about the Psalms and how they are a timeless collection of poems that still resonate with us today and get used widely in our prayer services and in rituals like weddings, funerals, and baby namings. We are also talking about how people today also write new poems and readings with more modern language and that this can also resonate. In Judaism, we are constantly honoring our tradition and the past, while also creating fresh ways to relate its concepts and its beauty to the modern world around us.

There are many opportunities to express your creativity this month. Whether you join us for Paper Midrash, come to Sit and Stitch, explore the creativity of words with us during Adult Ed, or come up with a really fantastic Purim costume for Purim this month, I hope you find ways to create sparks of newness with each day. May we all find joy and meaning in continuing to create the world we want to see.

Purim - The Feast of Lots

Begins at sunset on Saturday, March 23 through Sunday, March 24

The festival of Purim is derived from the biblical story of Esther and commemorates the Jewish people's success over people who tried to destroy us. The Purim story is all about taking a stand for what is right. On Purim, we celebrate the bravery of Queen Esther, whose Uncle Mordecai, was her directive with his guidance and influence during Queen Esther's trials and tribulations while married to King Ahasueras. Queen Esther learned that Haman, who held a parliament position in King Ahasueras court, was plotting against the Jewish people of Shushan, and was planning to exterminate them. Queen Esther summoned the courage to tell the King about Haman's evil plan and this act of bravery saved her people. Purim is a celebration of the deliverance for the Jews from a royal death decree. With everything said about Purim, it is an occasion about joy, celebration, and fun because of this deliverance. A delicious food treat, Hamantaschen - a three-sided pastry which symbolizes Hamen's hat, has become a favorite tradition which symbolizes, Purim. "Informed Citizen's are Democracy's Best Defense"

The following information was written by Julia Kirschenbaum and Michael Li and posted at the Brennan Center for Justice website:

From the time of Virginia's very first congressional map when Patrick Henry attempted to draw district boundaries that would block his rival, James Madison, from winning a seat, to this past year in Ohio, Gerrymandering has been carried out by both sides. Today, technology has caught up to the process making it more dangerous than ever before. As defined:

Gerrymandering is the act of achieving a result by manipulating the boundaries of an electoral constituency. It is traditionally done by either "cracking" or "packing."

Cracking splits groups of people with similar characteristics, such as voters of the same party affiliation, across multiple districts. With their voting strength divided, these groups struggle to elect their preferred candidates in any of the districts.

Packing is the opposite of cracking: map drawers cram certain groups of voters into as few districts as possible. In these few districts, the "packed" groups are likely to elect their preferred candidates, but the groups' voting strength is weakened everywhere else.

Every 10 years, states redraw their legislative and congressional district lines following the census. Because communities change, redistricting is critical to our democracy: maps must be redrawn to ensure that districts are equally populated, comply with laws such as the Voting Rights Act, and are otherwise representative of a state's population. Done right, redistricting is a chance to create maps that, in the words of John Adams, are an "exact portrait, a miniature" of the people as a whole. But sometimes the process is used to draw maps that put a thumb on the scale to manufacture election outcomes that are detached from the preferences of voters. When this happens the result of gerrymandering is disempowerment of the American public. Regardless of which party is responsible for gerrymandering, it is ultimately the public who loses out. Rigged maps make elections less competitive, in turn making even more Americans feel like their votes don't matter.

This year, in Ohio, we have a chance to break this cycle, and end the unfair practices associated with Gerrymandering, through the Citizens not Politicians ballot initiative. In short, this constitutional amendment will take the act of redistricting away from the state legislature and put it in the hands of a 15 - member Ohio Citizens Redistricting Commission. The members of the Commission will be geographically and demographically representative of Ohio residents. The movement to collect signatures to get it on the ballot is underway and is being supported in a bipartisan manner. 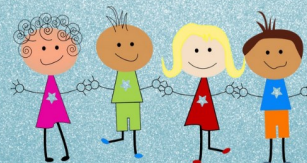

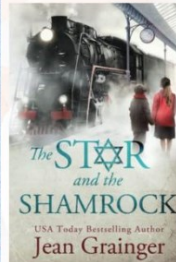
