

2020 Shoresh Preschool Guidelines and Safety Protocols

Our children's health and well-being are our top priority!

As we prepare to open our doors for Preschool at Shoresh, we know that there are many different feelings and mixed emotions about making the decision to send your child(ren) to an in-person program while living through this pandemic. The intention of these guidelines is to help our families understand the steps we are taking to provide the safest possible place for your children to be outside your home.

Opening up our doors is an extremely challenging logistical project, but we are committed to supporting our community and doing our best to provide your children with the wonderful experiences that our quality preschool offers during normal times.

Children thrive when they are able to socialize and play with peers while parents and caretakers get the time they need to resume working, promote self-care, and find time for life's demands. It is with this in mind that we hope to ease some of your fears surrounding the idea of your children attending school.

Included in this packet are procedures that we will follow, policies that will be enforced, and a brief description of how the program will run, based on the information that is currently available. This is all **subject to change** based on final enrollment and modifications that may be required by the New Jersey Board of Health, the Center for Disease Control (CDC), the New Jersey Department of Children and Family Services, the New Jersey Office of Licensing, and the Office of Governor Murphy.

The sole purpose of this ongoing process is to ensure the safety of all of the children in our care as well as all of our staff members. School will look different this year than ever before but there will be no shortage of learning, socializing and fun! Take the time to read this important packet of information thoroughly.



Why Attend Shoresh Preschool?

The benefits of socializing, exercising, playing, and learning are instrumental to children's development, especially at the preschool age. Recent studies* have shown that the risk of children contracting COVID-19 is low and the risk of symptoms and severe illness developing in young children is low. We aim to be a safe place for your children to be outside of their home while having the most fun with peers.

You can look forward to:

- The same high-quality preschool experiences that you have come to expect at Shoresh.
- Low Ratio of Children to Teachers: Maximum 10:2
- Outdoor Activities (weather permitting):
 - Tented lawn space and playground for various outdoor learning, enrichments, and play.
 - O Bikes and scooters in our closed off parking lot.
 - o Tented courtyard for lunch, snack, and arts and crafts.
- Indoor Activities:
 - Arts and Crafts
 - o Manipulatives and Toys
 - o Circle Time
 - o Bathrooms
 - o Naps

Our priority is to provide fun and exciting programming in the safest and most effective way possible. While we will be spending as much time as possible outdoors and offer more programming outdoors than in a typical year, there will be daily indoor aspects as well. This will include daily arrival, table time activities, and dismissal. While weather permits, all classes will be on a schedule for



distanced outdoor snack and lunch. All rainy/cold weather/snowy day activities will be indoors.

All indoor and outdoor activities will follow all safety protocols as well as the regular state guidelines that are in place from the NJ Department of Children and Family Services Office of Licensing.

When outdoors and weather permitting, we will have full use of our large covered playground (minus our playhouse and sandbox), our expansive partially tented lawn for learning and gross motor play, our nature log circle, and our enclosed tented courtyard. We will add spaces as we feel they are needed and be as creative as we can to spend time safely outdoors.

What Are The Health and Safety Protocols At Shoresh?

The following guidelines will be implemented and they prioritize the health and well-being of all. They have been created directly from the guidelines set forth by the New Jersey Board of Health, the Center for Disease Control (CDC), the New Jersey Department of Children and Family Services, the New Jersey Office of Licensing, and the Office of Governor Murphy. We have also regularly been in contact with other area preschools who are re-opening to learn from their guidelines and practices.

While the state of NJ has not mandated it, **Shoresh will be requiring that masks** or face shields be worn by all children whenever practical. Our expectations are for children to wear their masks or face shields whenever they are indoors except while eating. If a child is having difficulty wearing a mask or they are upset in any way, they will not be forced to. All procedures are in compliance with all COVID-19 recommended preventative measures and practices:

- If your child is showing any signs of illness and/or has a fever of 100.4 or more, you are required to keep them home until they are no longer showing symptoms and their fever is normal for 24 hours without any fever reducing medicine.
- It is mandatory that all staff and children, except those under 2 years of age, wear masks or face shields. If your child refuses to wear a mask, send them to school with one every day anyway. We will work with your child to teach them the importance of wearing one and help you work on that at home.
- Every staff member will be receiving training and orientation prior to the start of school about exactly how these protocols and safety measures will be performed and enforced.
- 🎳 All staff members will be assessed daily with temperatures taken.
- All staff members will wear a mask or face shield and a smock at all times throughout the day. Gloves will be worn when necessary or appropriate, any time the teacher is interacting with a child's excrement.



- Hand sanitizer dispensers will be available at several stations throughout the building and used throughout the day by teachers and staff.
- Teachers will have a "toys to be washed" bucket for all toys that children have touched. Recommended products will be used to clean all "small" items in the classroom that are being used (i.e. books, manipulatives, Lego action figures) in between uses by children.
- Table tops and chairs will be cleaned by teachers with warm soapy water followed by the required formula of bleach and water to disinfect, before and after they are used by the class.
- Our custodial staff will clean all larger surface areas i.e. table tops, chairs, cubbies, easel, bookshelves, handles and knobs with EPA required products to clean and disinfect the classrooms daily. (The website where these products are found is provided at the end of this document.)
- Our custodial staff will use these products to disinfect all door handles, toilet seats, sink handles, and highly trafficked touchable surfaces throughout the building, throughout the day.
- Children will be washing their hands frequently. It is recommended that everyone wash their hands for 20 seconds so we will be helping your children follow this guideline by singing songs that last 20 seconds.

The following upgrades will be in place before school begins:

- Newly installed HVAC units which will provide better and more efficient air circulation.
- Use of high-quality MERV 13 filters that are designed to trap viruses (more efficiently than traditional filters), will be used throughout the building in every HVAC unit.
- Portable sinks will be in every classroom for easy hand-washing.
- Cubbies will be located in classrooms to avoid cross-contamination.
- New high-quality air purifiers will be in every classroom.
- Windows will remain fully open in fair weather and partially open in inclement weather (whenever practical).



Teacher Procedures

Each teacher will be provided with several removable smocks in case they get a child's excrement on them. They are required to remove their smock and put on a clean smock and wash their hands before resuming work. They will be wearing masks or face shields throughout the day and will utilize gloves when cleaning surfaces, helping a child blow their noise, dealing with an injury, or any other time when gloves are appropriate. After the use of gloves, they will be discarded and teachers will thoroughly wash their hands before returning to work.

Outside Building Guests

No outside guests will be allowed in any spaces used by Shoresh. The only people allowed in the building other than Shoresh staff and teachers are temple staff and custodians. All temple staff have been given strict guidelines to maintain distance from Shoresh activity spaces and wear masks at all times when leaving the main office.

In the event that contractors are required to enter the building for necessary maintenance or repairs, masks, hand sanitizer, distancing, and proper cleaning measures will be taken. When possible, work will be done while school is not in session.

In the event that there is any in-person programming offered by TNT, they will adhere to the above requirements, most importantly remaining at safe distances from any Shoresh activity spaces.

Regular State Inspections

Per our state license, we are required to provide basic levels of health and safety measures as outlined above. Shoresh will be subject to regular unannounced state inspections (about twice a month) to ensure we are following all the necessary guidelines on any given day. Regular adherence to our policies is a top priority for Shoresh.



How Will Morning Drop-Off Work?

In order to provide as smooth an arrival as possible, we will be requiring that you use the drop-off car line in the mornings, rather than parking your car and walking your child(ren) up to or into the building. We know that this may be a tough transition for both you and your child(ren) after sheltering in place for several months.

Although a staggered drop-off schedule will be in place, you will need to allow extra time and expect this procedure to take more time than usual after your child(ren) exits your car. Make every effort to arrive at your designated time.

All parents/caregivers will follow a new traffic pattern through our parking lot to minimize traffic build-ups on Broad Street. It is imperative that all your child(ren)'s belongings are easily accessible to the teacher who will be helping them out of the car.

If your child exhibits any of the following symptoms, or you think they are showing any signs of illness, **KEEP THEM HOME**. Some of the common signs of COVID-19 are:

- 🖐 Cough
- Fever
- Shortness of Breath
- Muscle/Body Aches
- Unexplained Loss of Taste/Sense of Smell
- Diarrhea
- Headache
- Fatigue

Breakfast Club

We will no longer be able to offer morning Breakfast Club as an option due to the low demand. It is not possible to staff as many groups as would be necessary to accommodate this program while maintaining "pods".



Car Line Drop-Off Procedure*

- Drop-off times will be assigned in 15-minute increments starting at 8:30am and ending at 9:15am based on class age. More information about this will be coming out in your fall packets. It is critical that you arrive at your assigned time as this process will take longer than normal.
- Drivers and children will need to be wearing a mask during the drop off period.
- All cars will pull into the parking lot on the right side of the driveway as normal. At the top of the driveway by the island, a custodian will be standing there directing the driver to enter through the traditional exit or to wait for exiting cars to your right.
- Drivers will then proceed through the lot, driving towards the back of the lot, then bearing right with the playground on their left side. Drivers will be required to stop near the entrance to the playground, all parties will stay in the car, and a staff member will do a temperature check, a visual medical assessment of each child, and ask the following questions:
 - Has your child been given any fever reducing medication within the past 4 hours?
 - Have you been in close contact with anyone diagnosed with COVID in the past 14 days?
 - Have you, your child, or any household member been coughing, sneezing, experiencing shortness of breath or having trouble breathing?
 - Have you, your child, or any household member had any 2 of the following symptoms: a headache, muscle pain, fatigue, chills, repeated shaking with chills, or new loss of taste or smell?
 - Have you travelled to any of the states on the required selfquarantining list in the last 14 days? (Current list of states is provided at the end of this document which is subject to change)
- If your child has a fever of over 100.4, they are coughing, sneezing, exhibiting any signs of illness, or the answer to any of the required



questions is yes, **they will not be permitted to attend school** and the driver will be asked to take them home until a further evaluation is made.

- Once cleared, drivers will pull up to the front of the building entrance with the driver's side closest to the curb.
- Drivers must turn off the car's engine (this extra measure is to ensure safety).
- Drivers or passengers are NOT permitted to exit their car at any time during drop-off or enter the building at any time during the day.
- One of your child(ren)'s teachers will be outside ready to greet your child(ren), unbuckle their car seat and take them into the building.
- Once the child is taken into the building, the driver will exit down the driveway on their right side as normal, watching for incoming cars and taking cues from the custodians. No cars are allowed to pass other cars in the line, even if their child has exited their vehicle. They must wait until the car in front of them has begun to exit the lot.

Temperature checks and health assessments will be done every day that your child(ren) attend and will be logged as a mandatory state requirement. This information will be sent daily to the New Jersey Department of Child and Family Services office of licensing.

If at any time during the day, a child complains about any of these symptoms, they will be brought to our café, which will be designated as our "sick room". They will remain with a staff member, socially distanced, until a parent or caregiver arrives to take them home. Be sure to make arrangements for a parent or caregiver to be within 1 hour of the building at all times.



It is imperative that we be made aware if any of the following circumstances occur:

- A parent/caregiver or your child(ren) have been visiting any of the states on the CDC's quarantine list in the past 14 days (a list is provided at the end of this document).
 - o You and your child(ren) will have to self-quarantine for 14 days.
- A parent/caregiver has cared for or lived with a person who has tested positive for COVID-19.
 - o Your child(ren) will have to quarantine for 14 days.
- A parent/caregiver has been tested for COVID-19 and is waiting for results or the result was positive.
 - Your child(ren) will have to quarantine for 14 days.
- A parent/caregiver works at a skilled nursing facility OR assisted living facility that has a concern for COVID-19.
 - Closely monitor your and your child(ren)'s symptoms and get tested if possible.
- A parent/child/caregiver received a positive COVID test result.
 - The Department of Health in the State of NJ and the Bloomfield Department of Health will be notified, per the Office of Licensing and CDC requirements.
 - o The child's class will be shut down and all families will be expected to quarantine at home for 14 days.
 - An evaluation will be made by the local health department as to whether or not the entire program will be required to shut down. This evaluation will include the severity of the symptoms of the infected person and the current status of confirmed cases in our region.
 - o If a child is positive, a negative test result will be required after completing quarantine before the child may return to school.



What Will the Day Look Like for My Child(ren)?

At this time, we plan to use as much outdoor spaces as possible while the weather permits, in addition to utilizing our classrooms, for programming. Your child will be assigned to a class of no more than 10 children and 2 teachers. All classes will function as "pods" and they will not mingle with any other classes or children. Aftercare participants will be placed, by age group, in a single classrooms so there is no cross-contamination or mixing of children from different classes later in the day. We will achieve this by ensuring that the group they are with in the classroom is the group they will be with throughout the day. Our teachers will be vigilant in preventing children from spreading germs through too much touch or being too close to one another.

Each child will have their own labeled bin with high-touch items, manipulatives and art supplies (scissors, glue, markers, crayons). These items will change at least once a week and will be better matched to their individual preferences once we get more familiar with your child(ren).

In-classroom activities will include a few classroom centers which will be open but will also be limited to those that can easily be disinfected. There will be a circle time area, a book center, an art easel, a Lego table, and arts and crafts, manipulatives, plastic dolls, strollers, and doll shopping carts. There will not be a kitchen, a dress up area, dolls, doll clothing, sensory tables, blocks, towels, or plush stuffed animals available in the classroom.

Bathrooms

All children will either use the bathroom in Room 1 or the public bathrooms upstairs and downstairs which will be used by one class at a time and disinfected by custodians (toilet seats, toilet paper holders, stall walls and door handles, sinks, stools) immediately following use. All temple staff or other adults that may enter the building are instructed to use only the main office bathroom. There will be mandatory class bathroom visits twice a day, before snack and before lunch. Individual bathroom needs will be met in Room 1 upstairs and one of the bathrooms downstairs. Teachers will be cleaning all surfaces touched by children with proper wipes, before going back to classroom.



Diaper Changing

Room one and the upstairs public bathrooms are equipped with a standard changing table. The provided pad covers are disposable and will be replaced after each use. Teachers will use gloves to change children and will use items provided by the family. In the event that there are no diapers or wipes provided or replaced, teachers will use items provided by the school. Dirty diapers will be disposed of properly, and each table and changing area will be disinfected by teachers after each use.

Arrival and Free Play

Upon entering the classroom, your child's backpack will be placed in their cubby and they will immediately wash their hands. They will then be free to play throughout the room, until all children arrive.

- 2-3 children will be permitted at small group play areas for a period of time determined by the teachers i.e. 2-3 children at the Lego table or 1-2 children with paintbrushes in paint cups at the easel.
- When it is time to switch groups, each piece touched by children will be placed in a "to be washed" bucket.
- Teachers will wash down Lego table/paint easel surfaces, sides, and top.
- Fresh Lego pieces and paint brushes will be added for another small group to interact in that area.

Snack and Lunch

All children will have snack and lunch outside (weather permitting). **We highly recommend that snack be provided by the family** in order to decrease the possibility of spreading germs. If a snack is not provided from home, we will provide one for your child (wheat crackers, pretzels, or similar item). Families will provide a lunch every day for their child (ren).



Shoresh is a **dairy-only and nut-free** preschool. We follow the dietary rules of the temple so be sure your child's lunch contains no meat or meat products (recommended lunch items list will be provided). In order to maintain the safety of every child with allergies, peanut and tree nut products are not offered or permitted. If your child brings something in with nuts in it, it will be sent home unopened and an alternative item will be provided by Shoresh.

Lunches/snacks will be stored in the children's cubbies until lunchtime, so you will need to pack foods that can be kept at room temperature, or use an ice pack. Disposable lunches that include utensils, cups, bowls and plates are highly recommended. Staff will wear gloves when handling any food items and will not touch surface foods. Microwave reheating will not be offered. **Label all bags and food items** with your child(ren)'s first name(s) and last name(s) or initial(s).

Sample Schedule

The exact times and activities of daily schedules will vary and the number of group schedules will vary based on total enrollment. We will offer as many group schedules as needed in order to maintain social distancing between all classes. The length of each activity period will vary in order to allow for cleaning and disinfecting in between groups. The following is an example of a schedule:

Outdoor Play, Snack, and Lunch Areas

All outdoor equipment including playground equipment, ride-on cars and scooters, tables, chairs, and sports equipment, will be sanitized between group uses.

Children Who Stay Until 3:00pm

- 2-year-old groups will rest in their classrooms on individually assigned cots that will be placed head to toe, placed 6ft apart, from 1:00pm 3:00pm.
- 3 and 4-year-old groups will enjoy a shorter rest time on individually assigned mats combined with an outdoor enrichment activity (weather permitting) and playground time. Dismissal will take place from the lobby in the same fashion as the 1pm dismissal (described below).

Licensing no longer requires that 4-year-olds have mandatory rest time. Your child's needs will be determined upon final enrollment.

Indoor activities will be incorporated into an unexpected rainy-day schedule, or due to excessive heat/cold, and include all activities above.

Aftercare

Aftercare will be offered but we will no longer be offering a "drop-in" option. You will have the option of signing up for 1-5 days and given the option to switch the particular day your child needs additional care during the week. Space is limited in our aftercare podded classes, so reach out to the Shoresh director as soon as possible if you are interested.

At this time, we are unable to offer our optional enrichment programs such as sports, yoga, or soccer due to the drop-in and mixed class nature of the offering.

Dismissal Process

All parents and caregivers are required to wear masks at pick up. Times for dismissal and procedures will be staggered and similar to morning drop-off.

Classes will be brought into our large social hall and front lobby with all of their



belongings at the appropriate pick-up time, with socially distanced measures to keep groups separate.

Parents/caregivers will follow the same drop-off car line driving pattern for pick-up. When the parent/caregiver arrives at the pick-up point (the same place as drop-off), your child will be escorted to the car. You will be expected to put your car in park, turn off the engine, and help your child into their car seat.

Late Arrivals/Pick-Ups

It is imperative, in order to keep this process fluid and moving efficiently, that you arrive on time at the time of your scheduled pick-up and drop-off. We know that sometimes there are extenuating circumstances making this difficult. In the event that you are running late, you will need to call the director on the mainline or on a cell phone (to be provided) so we can make the proper accommodations. If a child is perpetually late, it will necessitate a conversation to work out a mutually acceptable arrangement.



What Should My Child(ren) Bring/Not Bring to School?

DO SEND:

Every child should have no less than 3 LABELED masks or face shields, a LABELED full set of weather appropriate clothing. This should include a bottom, a top, 3-4 pairs of underwear (when used), socks, shoes, diapers and wipes (when used) to remain in school. These items are required to be in a closed bag (Ziploc or tied). Children play, have accidents, splash water and get dirty. IT IS IMPERATIVE that these LABELED items be available should your child need them.

We will no longer be able to provide back-up clothing options. If a child spoils his or her clothing in any way, and they do not have these items, parents will be called and the child will have to wait, possibly in wet or soiled clothing, for the necessary items to be brought to school. You will need to evaluate the items you send with your child regularly and exchange items as the weather changes or your child grows.

Lunch and snack! These items will not be reheated, should be dairy food items only, and contain no tree nuts. Use **labeled** freezer packs to ensure lunches stay fresh. All containers and bags should be **labeled** with their first name and last initial (minimally – full name preferred). As much as possible these items should be disposable in order to minimize touching of food and containers to be placed back in lunch bags, eliminating cross contamination.

DO NOT SEND:

- Leave all personal toys, books, etc. at home. Plush or soft material items are not permitted in school. Any items you would like your child to have at rest time must be something that can be cleaned with the proper products previously mentioned. Stuffed animals, soft dolls with any clothing or hair, or towels will **NOT** be permitted. Special consideration will be made for younger students who require a blanket for their naps.
- Food items that contain tree nuts of any kind, or meat of any kind.



Frequently Asked Questions

1) If I give my child Tylenol at 6:00am and by 8:30am when we are getting ready to leave for school they seem fine, can I send them?

NO - **keep your child home if they exhibit any sign of illness**, necessitating the administering of Tylenol or any medication. Only children who have been fever free without the use of any fever reducing medicine for 24 hours will be permitted back into the building.

2) If I wash my child's hands before we leave our house for school, do their hands have to be washed again?

Yes, every child and staff member will be required to wash their hands immediately upon entering the building.

3) Can my child(ren) bring their favorite stuffed animal to school?

No, we will not be permitting any plush toys to be brought from home.

4) What should I do if someone in my household is diagnosed with COVID-19 while my child(ren) are at school?

Immediately tell the Shoresh Director, Wendy Blum. The local health department will immediately be notified and offer guidelines as to how long the child must remain home and if/when they should be tested. The health department will work with the Shoresh director to determine whether or not the entire center must be closed.

5) Will my child (ren) be socially distanced from their friends during activities and at lunchtime?

Children within the same group do not have to be 6 ft apart at lunch time or throughout the day. Teacher discretion will be used and children will be gently encouraged not to stand too close, hug, kiss, wrestle, or do anything that requires physical contact.



6) Will hand sanitizer be used on my child(ren)'s hands?

While hand sanitizer can be used on older children, it is not recommended for the ages of children attending Shoresh. They will be assisted in washing their hands with soap and water frequently.

7) Will staff be tested for COVID-19?

It is not required by the NJ Division of Youth and Family Services (DYFS) that staff be tested unless they are exhibiting signs of the illness. However, we are requiring that staff get tested before school begins. Shoresh Preschool will provide a test to any staff member who feels ill and cannot work or would like a test to ensure a negative result before returning to work.

8) If my child hugs or kisses another child will he be reprimanded?

NO! Teachers will closely follow children in the classrooms and physical contact/touching will be discouraged, but no, they will not be reprimanded.

9) If my 4-year-old refuses to wear a mask, will they be forced to?

It is strongly recommended that children over the age of 2 wear masks or a face shield and staff will gently encourage and explain the importance, but children will not be forced to, ostracized in anyway or be asked to leave the program. Parents will be asked to work in conjunction with teachers until the child is comfortable wearing their mask or face shield.

10) Will you provide masks or face shields or do I have to send my child(ren) in with their own?

Shoresh will have a supply of masks available if needed but it is recommended that you have several available for your child(ren), send them with their own masks or face shields, and wash/clean them daily.



11) Will toilets be disinfected after each child uses it?

Not after each **child**. As per the guidelines for allowable **groups**, toilets, handles, sinks and doors shall all be disinfected after one **group** of no more than 10 children uses the bathroom, and before the next **group** uses it.

12) If my child doesn't finish their lunch, will it be sent home or thrown away?

In order to minimize the transmission of germs, it is highly recommended that all uneaten lunch foods and items be disposed. Teachers will use their discretion in disposing of uneaten items while preserving any reusable containers to be brought home.

Now, Let's Get Back to School!

We are really looking forward to a fun and exciting school year with your children. While this is a lot of information to digest and the guidelines may seem too rigid to follow, we hope to give your children the chance to be kids again, interact with their peers and enjoy school in the most safe and fun way possible!
