CANTOR'S MESSAGE

CANTOR MENACHEM TOREN

Greetings, my dear friends,

Shavuot, the holiday of receiving the Torah, is coming in a few weeks. Naturally, I wanted to write something about the holiday and its meaning, but instead I am bringing up a big auction that will take place in New York, just one week before *Shavuot*. Is there a connection between the two? Maybe...

On May 16, at Sotheby's New York, a very rare, maybe the rarest find in our history, is going up for auction. This is the Codex Sasson. Codex Sasson is the oldest, most complete copy of the Bible, not only the main 5 books, but the entire 24 books. It weighs 26 pounds, it was made from the skins of 100 different animals and was enriched with remarks that have been added in for hundreds of years.

It made an appearance last month for one week in Israel; the last time it was displayed for the public was in 1982 in the British museum in England. This Codex, with its 400 pages, is the missing link between the Dead Sea Scrolls and the complete current version of the Bible. It has remarks, explanations of the grammar, and even owners' exchange notes.

It took experts two years to determine the historical value of it due to the manufacturing cost of 100 animal skins and the very beautiful handwriting of a single scribe! Not to mention, of course, the fantastic historical value. The experts also took into account previous historic documents sold at auctions to get the estimated value of it. For example, in 1994, Bill Gates bought the Lester Codex (documents by Leonardo da Vinci) for 30.8 million dollars. In 2021 Ken Griffin bought the first print of the American Constitution for 43.2 million dollars. The estimated sale price of the Codex Sasson is projected at 30-50 million dollars.

There were several owners prior to the 13th century and their names are inside the Codex. However, when the area was destroyed, the Codex was taken by a person who hid it and was supposed to bring it back when the synagogue was rebuilt, but the synagogue never got rebuilt and the Codex was lost for 600 years.

In 1929 the Codex showed up in an auction in Frankfurt and was purchased by David Sasson for 350 British pounds. In 1978 the pension fund of the British railroad company purchased it for \$320,000. In 1989, it was sold to a merchant for 3.19 million dollars, and then to Safra, who owns it today.

I have a feeling, and of course I may be wrong, that the timing of this auction one week before *Shavuot* is not a coincidence, as it is the holiday that we celebrate the receiving of the Torah. Hopefully, the next owner will put it on display in a museum, so people will be able to see the marvel.

The Community Outreach Committee began almost 10 years ago with a simple mission: to provide living necessities to those with a defined psychiatric illness who are clients of the Mental Health Association of Essex and Morris Counties. This committee continues to thrive under the leadership of a Board of Directors comprised of dedicated young adults who receive guidance from Abby Edelman, Jamie Kideckel, and Ali Wise. The committee now provides resources for clothing of children living in shelters as well as supporting nourish.NJ.

Last year a second committee was formed - The Community Scholarship Committee of the Pine Brook Jewish Center. The mission of this committee is to provide scholarships to academically worthy students of Dover High School who have made a difference in their community. For the first year the committee, comprised of 21 members, provided one scholarship of \$2,400 and two scholarships each of \$400.
