RABBI'S MESSAGE

In-person Greater Montville Interfaith Thanksgiving Service Returns to Our Community

It is with joy and thanksgiving that we announce the return of the Greater Montville Clergy in-person Interfaith Thanksgiving Service. Since the outbreak of COVID-19, we have spoken about getting back to normal. For each of us that may mean something different; however, each step that we have taken to get back to the way we used to do things has, for the most part, been steps back to normal.

In 2020 our Interfaith Thanksgiving Service was a combination of Zoom among the clergy, broadcast via livestream to the community. In 2021 the clergy, for the most part, was back together worshipping in-person; however, we continued to broadcast to the community via livestream. This year, not only will the clergy be together in-person, but we will have an in-person community worshipping together. What will have to wait, perhaps, for one more year is an interfaith choir.

The service, this year, will be held at the Montville United Methodist Church, 29 Whitehall Road, Towaco, on Tuesday evening, November 22, 2022 at 7:30 PM. Cantor Toren and I look forward to joining with our clergy colleagues in taking this step forward in celebration of Thanksgiving and a step forward to an evening of celebration for our community. Masks will be optional.

May it be a *siman tov*, a good sign for us and our community, and one more step to getting back to the way we used to do things in our individual and community lives.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

"Life is pleasant. Death is peaceful. It's the transition that can be troublesome."

Isaac Asimov, atheist and of Jewish blood, said it best. We may know what he means, but when becomes necessary here at PBJC, we aspire to have smooth transitions where a community can speak, have healthy discourse, then forge a meaningful strategy with an informed plan. Leadership has this goal in mind in setting up three Town Halls for your questions and opinions and in offering thoughtful surveys we know will help to inform us of your perspective with respect to the following important information.

As already previously shared at our first Town Hall last weekend, through both a thorough independent assessment of our synagogue and via consultation with our representatives at The United Synagogue of Conservative Judaism ("USCJ"), the Chevra Board of Trustees of the Pine Brook Jewish Center has determined that it makes most sense to migrate from a 2-clergy to a 1-clergy synagogue. A synagogue with a paying membership of our current size is best suited with one full-time Clergy with the expectation to augment as needed. The leadership will formulate a long-term plan to fill the gaps and plug holes with additional staff support (e.g., education/ B'nai Mitzvah lessons). This approach is not new with synagogues in plateauing Jewish communities (there are many according to USCJ) and we will seek their support and counsel, as necessary.

Since PBJC has been sustaining gradual losses in membership units, we need to be realistic in acknowledging and valuing where we are now and we must be responsible to mold a future that is self-sustaining. All should note that our synagogue functioned successfully using a one clergy model for over 100 years and we thrived. Our expectations must always be that we will continue to be a compelling house of worship and center of the Jewish community moving forward and one that is well-positioned for financial viability over the long-term.

As Rabbi Finkel has elected to retire, we are presented with an appropriate moment not only to plan for a thoughtful and seamless transition, but the time (approximately two years) to construct and execute a workable plan. As communicated previously, there will be a Clergy Transition Committee tasked with ensuring the transition runs smoothly and there will be significant time and effort that will go into the planning of this transition. To be clear, the only decision that has been made at this time is the need to transition from 2-clergy to 1-person.

To this point, we encourage all of our congregants to attend at least one of the two remaining Town Halls regarding clergy transition to learn more about the process and to provide your input related to this topic.

The next Town Halls will take place on Sunday, November 6th.

However, all our ancestors agreed on the importance of a holy community a '*kehilah kedusha*,' where everyone is respected, and every opinion is valued.

Transliteration - User-friendly and provided for those parts of the service most often sung or chanted out loud by the congregation.

Egalitarian Text - Egalitarian options for prayers are provided.

Symbols - Icons are used to help readers participate in the service. For example, one symbol indicates when to bow.

Commentary - Provides context for each prayer. What are its origins? Why it is here? What meaning might it convey?

Insights - Prose and poetry, drawn from ancient to contemporary sources, that reflect and expand on the themes of that page.

The committee now provides resources for clothing of children living in shelters as well as supporting nourish.NJ.

Last year a second committee was formed - The Community Scholarship Committee of the Pine Brook Jewish Center. The mission of this committee is to provide scholarships to academically-worthy students of Dover High School who have made a difference in their community. For the first year the committee, comprised of 21 members, provided one scholarship of \$2,400 and two scholarships each of \$400.
