Shir Ami groups are up and running. The recent empty nesters group, Shabbat dinner group and born in the 50s have met. Next up bourbon group at the end of the month and wine group, and JRA groups shortly thereafter. Rebecca has communicated with all those who have signed up and our goal is to have everyone settled into one group before they are placed into a second or third. We will also do another round of outreach later this spring once all of the initial groups are running.

Purim spiel practice is well underway. Folks at the meeting tonight can provide updates from the rehearsals the show and the band practices too. Please sign up and bring your friends. This is one of our signature events of the year.

# **Religious School Update**

- 1. Religious School: Over the past month we have had classes on Sundays, Tuesdays and Wednesdays. In addition to our ongoing curricular focal points, the past month has provided opportunities for us to emphasize the following ideas, Jewish values and people: a. Tu B'Shevat/The unofficial start of Spring in Israel/Our connections to Israel/the 7 species of Israel (this included many grade level Tu B'Shevat seders); b. The rise in anti-Semitism and what we can do about it as individuals and a community; c. That Jewish teachings, values, ethics and rituals can be just as meaningful for us today as they have been for centuries. Our focus in the coming weeks will turn to Purim, and the themes associated with it, including: a. Speaking out when there is injustice/hate/oppression; b. Taking pride in being Jewish and honoring those who came before us; c. Being Jewish can and should be fun!
- 2. February is JDAIM (Jewish Disabilities Awareness and Inclusion Month). The ideas and concepts associated with this month (i.e. we are all created in God's image) are being included in lessons both in the classroom and throughout our Religious School experience. One of our teachers, Staci Kincus, has been working closely with Gabby Meyer at Jewish Learning Venture over the past two years in this area. In addition to the students learning/experiencing more, we are planning to have a teacher workshop in April/May as we plan ahead for the '23-'24 school year and integrate more ideas and curricular pieces into our Religious School program.
- 3. Our 5th Grade Family Tree Program took place Sunday 1/29. Students taught us about their family history through special recipes that have been passed down from generation to generation. The students did a wonderful job teaching us about their family stories and the recipes were shared so that everyone can make them at home!

- 4. Looking ahead, we have our 1st Grade Family Program on Sunday 2/26. We will focus on themes connected to Purim and JDAIM/inclusion.
- 5. Prayer Labs for our 6th-7th graders are back in full swing on Sunday mornings. Prayer labs are designed for 6th/7th grade students to work in small groups on specific prayers and Hebrew in general as they prepare for becoming b.Mitzvah. Prayer Labs meet in-person only from 9-10am. Then students join our Shir Ami family for Tefillah/Song Session from 10-10:30. After Tefillah/Song Session, 6they can either be picked up at our usual drop off/pick up spot (back/sanctuary parking lot), or continue working in small groups until 11:30am pickup.
- 6. Our 6th and 7th graders will have several very special opportunities to engage in mitzvot in the coming months. On both 2/26 and 3/26 students will have the opportunity to make meals for local organizations (i.e. Caring for Friends) while learning more about food insecurity in our area and broader community. We are also going to encourage students and their families to join us for the 'Be Kind' 5K on Saturday April 15th. This race benefits Kin Wellness and Support Center, Bucks County's new innovative cancer center that 'provides FREE services to LOCAL cancer patients in treatment and recovery and their caregivers by offering a full range of integrative services, fitness, yoga, therapy, and support.' We will also ask members of the Shir Ami Run/Walk group and the entire Shir Ami family to join us for this special event.
- 7. Steve Rosenberg and I continue to work on programming for older teens and their families re: Israel/anti-Semitism. On Wednesday 5/17, we will have a follow up program to our ADL program last month. We are honored to have Jason Holtzman, Director of the Jewish Community Relations Council (JCRC), lead an interactive program for teens and their parents focusing on what is happening on college campuses and how to respond both before going to college and once on campus.
- 8. Preparations have begun for the '23-'24 school year. In addition to working together with our amazing team, I look forward to partnering with Cantor Berlin and have set up meetings for us to discuss Religious School, b.Mitzvah and to just get to know each other better.
- 9. Last, but not least, we cannot wait for the Purim Carnival on Sunday 3/5! In addition to all that SHAFTY is doing, we are going to have a very special Tefillah/Song Session just like we did last year.

# **Lifelong Learning (LLL) Update**

- a. iEngage continues with Rabbi Briskin. Through the consideration of major historic moments, this year long series grapples with the different ideas and values that shape the meaning of modern Israel, Zionism, and Jewish identity today.
- b. Thursday 1/26 was 'Dinner and a Movie' on Zoom. We watched 'Abe,' a movie about a twelve-year-old boy with a 'complicated family: part Israeli, part Palestinian, and constantly fighting. But when he meets chef Chico and his fusion cuisine, he's inspired to unite his family through food. Abe wants to cook a meal that will bring everyone to the table, but he's about to learn that the kitchen can't heal some divides.' Themes connected to the movie led to a meaningful discussion and provided an opportunity for those participating to connect with each other and share their beliefs.
- c. Tuesday 2/7 we welcomed Rabbi Stacey Blank from Israel for Lunch and Learn. She spoke about her life and experiences as someone who made aliyah and is a female, Reform, rabbi in Jerusalem. She also shared her thoughts on the current political situation in Israel and both successes and challenges facing the country in the coming months and years.
- d. Looking ahead, we have: a. 'Israeli Book Club: Where the Desert Meets the Sea' on 2/23 with Cantor Kohlbrenner and our 3rd Jerusalem Masterclass ('Secrets of the Old City') on Sunday 2/26 with Kobi Cooper joining us live from Israel!

The Tikkun Olam has several concurrent efforts in progress. Each has a congregant leader.

- Code Blue AHTN (Advocate for Homeless and Those in Need)
  - o We are working on providing dinner at Shir Ami once a month for the homeless.
- Food Drives Marc Luber
  - February donation was 3,000 pounds
  - 25 volunteers participated.
  - We did not get the participation we had hoped from 6/7th graders for this event, but we will try again in April.
  - We currently have a surplus of inbound donations, which will be spent for the April distribution. This will mean a larger than average distribution.
- Caring for Friends
  - The number of groups who want to prepare meals for Caring for Friends is increasing – friend groups, auxillaries, youth groups, religious school
  - Meals will be delivered to the Caring for Friends Warehouse from the Shir Ami freezer twice a month.
  - Maria Pisano from Caring for Friends will be visiting Shir Ami on March 3. She will speak briefly following services about needs and opportunities at Caring for Friends. She would also like to see our facility and talk to congregants.
- Pendel Drop-In Center
  - We have committed to providing lunches every Wednesday for the homeless at the Penndel Drop in Center
- Jewish Relief Agency (JRA)
  - We have had groups of congregants, individually and through the Auxiliaries, volunteering to pack food boxes at the JRA warehouse and deliver them to those in need.
  - We are working to increase the number of volunteers and possibly combine it with getting the group together for lunch after volunteering.
  - The next distribution is March 12.
