## FROM OUR RABBI'S STUDY

#### Celebrate Purim with Shir Ami | Rabbi Charles Briskin

One of my favorite child-hood memories from my synagogue was the annual Purim spiel and carnival. The clergy and teachers acted out a funny play retelling the tale of the story from Megillat Esther—the Scroll of Esther. The play was followed by a big car-

nival in the social hall with games, prizes, food, and a lot of fun. In truth, most synagogues' Purim spiels and carnivals have not changed much since I was a child. It becomes an enduring and unforgettable memory for many that passes from generation to generation.

It is interesting that so much fun and frivolity is associated with Purim. After all, the story itself is serious, sobering, and definitely not meant for children. A wicked aide to a feckless king devises a plot to destroy the Jewish people all because the aide felt one particularly proud Jew disrespected him.

It takes the reluctant intervention of the proud Jew's niece, who becomes queen, to expose the aide and ultimately save the Jewish people. It's a story filled with deception, corruption, sex, and violence. And yet, we often transform it into a play that is appealing to children.

#### Why do we do this?

In part because of the carnival atmosphere, the dressing up in costumes, and the wearing of masks appeal to children. Purim can be the Jewish response to Halloween or Mardi Gras. Furthermore, many customs surrounding Purim call for it to be a day of joy, celebration, and partying; as Rabbi Dana Evan Kaplan writes, everything that is normally true in the regular world is turned upside down on Purim. Fortuitous events just happen. People overhear things that they're not supposed to overhear. Nothing is as it seems. And while God is notably absent from the story, many coincidences appear, which can be God being present while staying anonymous.

Despite the serious nature of the story, Purim has become associated with silly spiels, carnivals, masquer-

ades, and more. Many communities have turned Purim into a children's celebration. At the same time, some have also created adult-only versions of the spiel and party where some of the more tawdry themes can be more appropriately played out.

Purim is a children's celebration at Shir Ami. Our SHAFTY Teen youth group puts on a great Purim Carnival every year. Our post-b.mitzvah students lead a Purim spiel for our kindergarten through fifth grade students just prior to the carnival.

However, we don't limit our celebration to children only. We've also made Purim more of an adult gathering that befits its adult themes. Our Adult Purim Spiel and Party has become one of our signature events of the year, a night out that you won't want to miss. This event, our annual Hamentashen baking party, and the delivery of our Mishloach Manot Purim gift baskets have made Purim a focal point of our year.

Over 100 volunteers join to participate in one or more of our Purim activities. These different opportunities bring people together from across the generations and demonstrate some of the best that Shir Ami offers. We build community while touching the lives of every member positively. Many of your friends devote hours of their time and energy to organizing everything that Purim has become at Shir Ami.

We invite you to join us to bake Hamentashen, pack and deliver our Mishloach Manot, help with our Adults- Only Purim Spiel and Party on Saturday, March 23, or simply come and join us to celebrate this festive time of the year.

Purim is a time to make memories for our children that will pass from one generation to the next. It's also a time for us to make new memories of our own, memories born from the simple act of gathering as a community to help contribute to the vitality of our community.

We look forward to seeing you in the weeks ahead, whether to bake Hamentashen, deliver Mishloach Manot, support SHAFTY and our Kids Purim Carnival, or join our Adults-Only Purim Spiel and Party. Much fun is in store and we hope you will celebrate with us.

On the anniversary (yahrzeit) of the death of your loved one, it is customary to light a candle in memory of that person. The yahrzeit candle burns for twenty-four hours serving as a sacred and somber symbol of your mourning while framing this period of remembrance (yizkor). Before lighting the candle, you may choose, on your own or with family and friends, to recall the everlasting gifts that your loved one left behind for you to cherish and protect. As you prepare to light the candle, you may recite this benediction to help you focus your attention and to create an intention for this solemn moment.

"Ner Adonai nishmat adam; The light of god shines in our soul." (Proverbs 20:27)

[I/we] give thanks for the blessing of life, for companionship, and for memory.

Our tradition teaches us that we never lose those we love, for love is stronger than death.

So [I/we] kindle this light now, and as it burns, so may the memory of \_\_\_\_\_\_continue to be an inspiration.

## What Will Your Legacy Be? | Stephanie Kravatz

The definition of "Legacy" is something that is passed on. Legacy can take many forms. A Legacy may be of one's faith, ethics and core values....A Legacy may be financial, wealth passed to the next generation. A Legacy may come from one's character, reputation and the life one leads - setting an example to guide the futures of others.

In January, Shir Ami embarked on a Life and Legacy project. It is the first time in the 48 years of our existence that we have committed to creating an endowment that will sustain our congregation into the future. It is hard to imagine 100 years or even 50 years from now, and

I am sure, if you do, you probably do not see yourself in that portrait. We can envision the lives of our children and grandchildren. Perhaps we picture them living in Bucks County or maybe in the far reaches of the world. Some might even imagine a futuristic scenario where humans have inhabited a far off, distant planet. Our creativity helps us to dream of technological innovations that reach far beyond today's capabilities. Many of STEPHANIE KRAVATZ father-in-law and mother. I have repaid Shir Ami for

us harbor hopes for world peace and acceptance for everyone. As Jews I hope we all have visions of a thriving Jewish culture embracing the past traditions and creating new ones.

When I think of the Jewish people of the future I hope and pray that they will still have synagogues comprised of similarly-minded people who engage in both Torah study and Tikkun Olam. "This gift is the least painful gift I have ever given to Shir Ami because I will be gone when it is time to part with it".

No one wants to think of their demise and for some this reality is much closer than for others. I remember the first time I traveled after my daughter Hannah was born. In addition to plane tickets and hotel reservations Alan and I made a trip to a lawyer to draft our will. It was un-imaginable to me that we would ever need to use it but we wrote it anyway. Twenty-seven years later, having added 2 more children as beneficiaries we have realized that while we still hope no one needs to use our will anytime soon, maybe there are other people and organizations besides our children that are important to us and deserve a portion of what we will leave behind.





#### **Shir Ami Code Blue 2023 Report**

In association with AHTN (Advocates for Homeless and Those in Need), we completed 10 Code Blue nights during the month of December. During those nights, a total of 265 men and women took shelter in our building. Each night, our guests arrived at 8:30pm and were housed in Shalom Hall. They received hot, nutritious buffet dinners that were graciously served by our volunteers. Cots provided by AHTN allowed our guests to have a warm, restful night's sleep. In the morning we served them breakfast and provided them with sandwiches to go before they left at 6:30am. Each guest received toiletries, coats, socks and shoes as needed plus a small gift on Christmas Eve.

We want to thank our staff and maintenance team for all of their support in this wonderful Tikkun Olam initiative. The congregation came together and we were blessed to have so many fantastic volunteers who were ready and willing to organize, cook, clean and be the welcoming force in this amazing partnership with AHTN.

a tasty and traditional meal. Again, bring a friend or introduce your next generation to our history.


