L'Dor V'Dor From Generation to Generation

My grandson Ari called and told me that he has a history class project - to write about people's experience during the Holocaust. He asked if he could sit with his Bubbe (my mother, a Holocaust survivor) and ask her questions.

Early last month he came to sit with Bubbe with a prepared list of questions. It was quickly pushed aside as Bubbe told him about her family's Holocaust experience: what life was like in their village before the war and what happened when the Nazis stormed into their town.

Bubbe told Ari about the ghetto and how her father and two uncles, along with the town's Jewish men, were taken on a death march and about the killing of her 6-year-old brother [Bubbe was 12, at that time, the same age as Ari is now]. She described the horror of being sent to Auschwitz, including how she saved her mother from being sent to the gas chamber by Dr. Mengele.

She showed Ari her Auschwitz tattoo number and told him what it was like to shovel snow in pajamas and how her mother each day would lick the jam off of their two slices of daily bread rations and then hide the bread for her. Ari learned how Bubbe sensed that Hashem was, somehow, watching over them - surviving five labor camps with her mother and their ultimate liberation from Tereizenstadt, the night before they were scheduled to be killed.

He heard how they were rescued by a young Russian officer who told Bubbe's mother that her husband and brothers were alive in Russia five years after their death march. That young officer ended up marrying Bubbe and became Ari's Zayde.

Ari has an amazing memory and didn't think it was necessary to record the session with his Bubbe. Afterwards, he confided in me, saying "I'm sorry I didn't record it. I will always record our sessions in the future."

If you listen to a Holocaust survivor's story you become a witness. Ari is now a witness. With tears of joy in her eyes, Bubbe shared that "In Auschwitz, I never dreamed that someday I would sit with my great grandson to tell my story."

Sisterhood Programs: From Musicals to Museums

Did you know that there was no song called "Oklahoma!" in the out-of-town tryouts of "Oklahoma!" that Rodgers and Hammerstein wrote some flops, and that Stephen Sondheim was their "go-fer?"

Participants learned all about those and more when our own Jill Kaplan offered up "some enchanted evening" full of information on Rodgers and Hammerstein, the fathers of the modern American musical, on January 18. Presented via Zoom, Ms. Kaplan peppered her discussion with rare videos and interviews with those who worked in or on their shows, including footage of early dances in "Oklahoma!" by Agnes DeMille (she choreographed the show within three weeks!) and an interview with Lesley Ann Warren ("Cinderella", 1965). She also served up some "dish," such as why Richard Rodgers started collaborating with Oscar Hammerstein II instead of Lorenz Hart on "Oklahoma!" (Hart was too drunk and troubled to do it) and that Frank Sinatra was supposed to star as "Billy Bigelow" in the movie version

of "Carousel", but bowed out with an excuse to cover that he left because his wife, Ava Gardner, was having an affair with Clark Gable. (Shirley Jones suggested Gordon McCrae, and the rest is remarkable history.)

Another great Sisterhood-sponsored program, "Breakfast with Brad," will take place on Sunday, March 26 at 10 AM. The congregation is invited to enjoy a delicious spread and hear author/photographer Brad Kolodny discuss his book, "Seeking Sanctuary: 125 Years of Synagogues on Long Island" (which has a rather familiar shul on the cover). Kolodny is president of the Jewish Historical Society of Long Island and curator for the Long Island Jewish History Museum Exhibit at the Holocaust Museum and Tolerance Center in Glen Cove. Copies of the book will be available for purchase and signing.

Sisterhood's Easy-to-do Mitzvah Programs

The need for food assistance peaked during the pandemic but hasn't gone away. As this need grew, so did Sisterhood's commitment to helping fight hunger here on Long Island.

We are now supporting two local food pantries, the UJA-sponsored Rina Shkolnik Pantry and Sharon's MLK Pantry. Help us help them by dropping off canned goods and other non-perishable food items in the designated bins in the CBS-BD lobby. Sharon's MLK Pantry bin is outside the coat room. The Rina Shkolnik Pantry bin (kosher items only) is outside the sanctuary.

Another easy-to-do mitzvah is to support recovery efforts in Ukraine by purchasing sets of 10 blank notecards, usable for any occasion. Each card has

one of three sunflower designs on it that represent the national flower of Ukraine. Out of 200 sets of cards, we have approximately 50 left and will continue to sell them until we run out.

So far, Sisterhood has raised \$1,749, all of which is profit, and is donating the funds to HIAS, earmarked for Ukraine. HIAS is matching our donation, bringing the total to \$3,498 raised.






