President's Message

Consolidation Will Strengthen Rockville Centre Jewish Community

Some months back, the treasurers of Congregation B'nai Sholom-Beth David and Central Synagogue-Beth Emeth met to talk about their synagogues and the challenges each community faces in today's environment. Between lagging membership, rising costs, and other external and internal forces, it can be challenging to navigate choppy waters.

With this in mind, these two financial advisors went to their respective leadership groups and proposed a meeting to see if each would want to sit down and talk. Talks are continuing and there are still issues to resolve. But with hope, understanding, and resolve, our two organizations have a chance to become a beacon of Judaism on the South Shore of Long Island. In the meantime, there are many CBS-BD committees that can use the talents of our members. From communications to the Never Again committee, your time and abilities are essential to a radiant community. Please volunteer. It is a mitzvah to serve.

Is It Ever Okay to be That Cozy with Friends?

The other day my daughter texted me from school to say that some of the people she eats lunch with every day made some Holocaust jokes. They were not meant to be taken in a threatening way or even thought of as hurtful by the ones telling them. It was more along the lines of "We're all friends here. We can say anything amongst ourselves." The offending party happened to be African American in this case, but that shouldn't matter. She has heard similar things come from Jewish friends as well in recent years.

In my daughter's lunch group, she is the only Jew. The group consists of African Americans, Hispanics, non-Jewish Whites, and my daughter. It is an ethnically diverse group of students at an ethnically diverse high school. In a country that seems to be getting more voluntarily segregated, it is what many of us still like to see.

The question here is when do people become too chummy to realize there are some words or subjects that shouldn't be casually thrown around? It's not just about the Holocaust either. One of the African American boys regularly uses the N-word and has even gone so far as to offer a "pass" to my daughter for her to use the word in this group. Thankfully, she was horrified by the thought.

When did it become okay to use vile words or joke about genocide amongst friends? Is it due to immaturity or something else? Being part of a group is supposed to bring with it a certain level of comfort. However, this behavior has had the opposite effect on her. I don't know a solution other than letting people close to you know that some things are okay to joke about, but this crossed a line. Hopefully, this may serve as a lesson for the future that some subjects are never okay to joke about even with friends.

SEEKING SANCTUARY: 125 Years of Synagogues on Long Island

The towers of the Moorish-style building on the cover of the book, *Seeking Sanctuary: 125 Years of Synagogues on Long Island*, soar into a blue sky. They illustrate the function of a synagogue: a solid foundation that inspires reaching towards HaShem.

Brad Kolodny, the book's author and founder of the Long Island Jewish Historical Society, believes the original home of Congregation Beth David to be the most beautiful exterior of all Long Island synagogues. He said as much at a Sisterhood-sponsored breakfast program on Sunday, March 26, much to the delight of the Beth David contingent of CBS-BD. Considering that there are currently 219 synagogues in Nassau and Suffolk, that is a major distinction.

After a traditional Sunday breakfast of bagels and an assortment of spreads, salads, and pastries, Sisterhood Co-President Linda Schwartz welcomed everyone to the event and introduced the speaker.

The more than 40 attendees listened with fascination as Kolodny spoke of the history of local synagogues. He quizzed the audience about where the first synagogue was built on Long Island. Most guessed it had to be in Nassau County. They were surprised to find out that it was in Setauket in Suffolk County in 1896. They were pleased to learn that the first synagogue built in Nassau was our own Temple B'nai Sholom. (The first building was built in 1915; the current one, in 1949.) He also discussed the different architectural styles, from humble, non-descript buildings to elaborate and elegant, and how some synagogues incorporated features, such as glass ark doors, from ones that either closed or merged.

Co-President Bonnie Friedman thanked everyone for coming, and announced another exciting event coming up on June 8 when Samantha Berman-Melendez will be honored as a "Woman of Achievement" by the Brooklyn, Queens, and Long Island Chapter of Women's League for Conservative Judaism.


Samantha Berman-Melendez is Sisterhood 2023 Woman of Achievement


