Rabbi's Message Leap Year Unites Thanksgiving and Hanukkah

This year, 5782 on the Jewish calendar, is a leap year. And, no, this does not mean that one of the months gets an additional day as would occur during a secular leap year. Rather, when this occurs on the Hebrew calendar, we add an entire month: a second Adar, which is one of the traditionally joyous months, of course.

This phenomenon, while being incredibly interesting, especially if you are born during a leap month, effectively ensures that all of the holidays are quite early when juxtaposed onto the civic calendar. Indeed, this year the first night of Hanukkah does not fall near the end of December as it sometimes does. Rather, it falls on Thanksgiving weekend at the end of November.

I always love when deeply symbolic Jewish holidays coincide and overlap with those on the civic calendar or those of other faiths because they can engage in beautiful and enriching dialogue. Jewish tradition doesn't believe much in coincidence. (I once read that coincidences were G-d's way of waving hello!) So, when holidays coincide, it should spur us to take notice and act.

Thanksgiving and Hanukkah, if I may, Thanksgivikah, encourage a look at our present with an appreciation and critical understanding of our past. Let us learn a bit more this week of our Jewish and American history. Both holidays urge us to be grateful for the gifts in our lives. We are able to celebrate a bit more openly with family this year. Let us embrace our loved ones a bit more this week.

Both holidays call for an unfathomable amount of caloric intake, with Hanukkah including foods fried in oil to commemorate the sole remaining flask of undesecrated oil found in the Temple. Let us give tzedakah or donate food this week to care for those who may be food insecure.

Lastly, these holidays are about perspective. In our Hanukkah liturgy we pray and rejoice in gratitude: "al hanisim, v'al hapurkan, v'al hag'vurot... bayamim haheim bazman hazeh." – As we gather this year with our family and friends, may G-d grant us the strength to see the miracles all around us, to see the light each of us has in ourselves, and all the goodness, all the chessed, in the world.

Chag Hanukkat Sameach – A Happy Hanukkah, and Happy Thanksgiving, to you and your family!

A Season of Joy in a Time of Hatred

We live in a time of increased hatred and bigotry. Anti-semitic incidents reached an all-time high in 2019 before dipping very slightly in 2020, according to the Anti-Defamation League, which has been tracking these incidents since 1979. As the Hanukkah season approaches, I can't help but be reminded of a story from 25 years ago of a community banding together to stand up to hatred.

In December 1996 Judith and Martin Markowitz of Newtown, Pennsylvania, were awoken by the sound of breaking glass. When they went downstairs to investigate, they found their living room window broken and the electric menorah that was placed there in pieces on the floor.

While this incident brought pain to the Markowitz's, what happened next is the real story. Neighbors started to hear about what happened and wanted to help. One of their Catholic neighbors decided to put a menorah in her window in solidarity with the Markowitz's. Others followed suit. Soon most of the town was displaying

menorahs. It may have spread to the entire town and neighboring communities had the local stores not run out of electric menorahs.

This was, of course, in the days before Amazon. The town collectively took a stand that hate has no place here. The incident was similar, but unbeknownst to them, to one that occurred in Billings, Montana, in 1993, where 10,000 Christians put printed pictures of a menorah in their windows to support the local Jewish community.

Between November 1 and mid-January there are approximately 25 religious holidays celebrated by people throughout the world. While we often think the "holiday season" is about Christmas and, to a lesser extent, Hanukkah, it is important to remember it is a special time to everyone. As we enter this time of year, my wish is that we, as a people, learn from the communities in Newtown and Billings and perform tikkun olam: heal the world.


