I normally don't use the *Scribe* for medical updates, but since I sent an email a few weeks ago asking you to help Brad Schmidt and his family, I felt compelled to do so, especially since I have good news to share. The day I sent the email, it was not clear if Brad would make it. But then, his condition improved and eventually he was able to return home. After sixty days in the hospital, thirty of them in an induced coma, Brad's recovery is expectedly slow. Having therapy is one thing, but finding the patience to rest a lot and to progress in a slow pace is another challenge.

Brad didn't know of our appeal to the community for help since he was unconscious at the time. When he learned about it later on he was overwhelmed with joy and relief. More than anything, he said to me, was the feeling that he was not alone, that people he never met truly cared about him and were willing to help. You should be very proud to know that members of Temple Beth Am donated more than \$10,000, offered help in many other ways and did not stop praying.

While almost everyone recognizes the benefit of good medical care and communal support of an ill person, the effect of prayers on healing is more controversial. Yet, in recent years, scientists have been confirming in hundreds of studies the significant power that prayers have on healing. Separate studies conducted at Duke, Dartmouth, and Yale universities show that people who pray:

- Tend to get sick less often.
- Hospitalized people who never attended church have an average stay of three times longer than people who attended regularly.
- Heart patients were 14 times more likely to die following surgery if they did not participate in a religion.
- Elderly people who never or rarely attended church had a stroke rate double that of people who attended regularly.
- In Israel, religious people had a 40% lower death rate from cardiovascular disease and cancer than non-religious people.

It seems like there is little doubt that people who pray for themselves benefit from doing so. But what about our practice of the *Mi Shebeirach*, a healing prayer in which we pray not for ourselves but for others? Does it have any effect?

As I learned from Brad and many others who have been ill for prolonged periods of time - it definitely helps. I am not sure how exactly it works. That's when faith comes into the picture. What I do know is that knowing people care, having people constantly think about you and wishing that you will get better, strengthen your spirit. And when your spirit is strong, your emotions are intact and your overall attitude is optimistic.

FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Temple Beth Am Community:

Personal travel update: Nothing bizarre happened to me during my travels (up to this point) this month. Federal and international transportation authorities are looking into this unusual situation and hope to issue a report soon. Hopefully, it will contain something ridiculous that I can write about in May.



Temple update: We are three quarters of the way through the fiscal year. So far it's been a pretty uneventful year. Well, aside from initiating a new strategic plan and Kulanu effort fundamentally changing the way the Temple does "business", creation of a new approach to our musical offering and Bar/Bat Mitzvah training, implementation of an innovative Skype Religious School curriculum, planning for facility improvement and expansion, the first true voluntary (dues) financial commitment program in the county, and the successful branding program for The One School preschool.

All of these efforts have been implemented to make our synagogue an actively inclusive Jewish community. We have worked to attract new members, keep existing members, engage all members, increase our volunteer base, create an optimum physical environment for meeting challenges in the future, and select programs that best serve the congregation.

The Board Executive Committee has been meeting to help design an organization more suitable to this new paradigm. This is not to say that our existing organization was not good. In fact, it is good. However, we recognize that some changes can make it better matched to what we see as our level of operation in the future. To that end, an overall plan has been developed to focus staff responsibilities and volunteer efforts on programming, engagement, and membership needs of the congregation.

The result is a reorganization, which includes the elimination of the position of Executive Director. As a consequence, Carol Safran's employment with the synagogue ended last month. I want to take this opportunity to thank Carol Safran for her service to Temple Beth Am. For three and half years, Carol has been our Executive Director, helping to plan and coordinate the behind the scenes work at the Temple. Carol has been nothing but professional and gracious in response to this decision, maintaining a good relationship moving forward. I am certain you will join me in wishing Carol only the best in all of her future endeavors. Thank you again, Carol.

Board update: At the March 24th BoD meeting, the 2014-2015 Temple budget was presented and approved. The 2014 Nominating Committee report for Directors and Officers was discussed and approved. Both will be sent out later this month for Congregational review. The Director's slate for 2014-2016 will then be voted on by the congregation at the June 1st Annual meeting. Other matters discussed at the meeting included discussion on landscaping, well installation, financial performance, and staff and volunteer organizational matters.

One last note: Director Howard Freedland has announced his intention to step down from the BoD this month. Howard has been a very active member for seven and a half years, making him the most senior Director. I want to thank Howard, who has been a good friend to me, the Temple Beth Am Board, and our congregation during his time on the BoD. The good news is that he assures me that he will continue his tireless work for the Temple. To fill Howard's position, the BoD approved the appointment of Ellen Vargas at its March meeting. Welcome to the BoD, Ellen.







Israel: Women of the Wall Update - by Debbie Carr (Hello Gali? Please come bail me out of jail)

Jerusalem, January 2, 2014

A flurry of activity, wrapping tallit, wrapping tefillin, smiles, and greetings of "chodesh tov", so began the service in honor of Rosh Chodesh Shevat – the new moon/month of Shevat. We were 200 women at the

Kotel (the Western Wall) and all was unusually quiet on the men's side. No protests, nothing was thrown at us, there were no whistles to disrupt our service this month.

A young girl in dreadlocks asked me a question in Hebrew. I can't hold a conversation in the language, yet I understood her perfectly. How? She asked the same question Jews ask each other all over the world: "What page are we on?" I opened my book to show her.

I watched a mother and her 6-month old daughter laugh out loud to a bouncy Hodu melody, then rocking gently to Pitchu Li. Lior Nevo, a Women of the Wall supporter, was arrested here when she was eight-months pregnant. It is her hope that in



2010: Yes, those are chairs being thrown by men into the women's section of the Kotel. They are only plastic, and a welcome relief from the fully loaded diapers previously thrown at the prayer group.

12 years, her daughter may become a Bat Mitzvah at the Kotel. Last year, 50 to 100 women were arrested at the Kotel for the felony crime of wearing a tallit. Finally, on April 25, 2013, a judge determined in our favor, declaring that the group's activities are not illegal, that these women may wear tallit and tefillin, and pray out loud. Since then, not one woman has been arrested during the Rosh Chodesh service at the Kotel.

Always pushing the envelope for equality, this morning on Rosh Chodesh Shevat, Women of the Wall attempted to bring in a Torah. Yes, Jews read Torah on Rosh Chodesh, and yes, we are Jews and we want to read. Unfortunately, the Torah was denied entrance. We were informed that there are already over 100 Torahs at the Kotel for public use. We know this. Women of the Wall have asked permission to use a public Torah, but have been told we are not part of the public allowed to use these Torah scrolls – we are women.

So our service commenced without our Torah. The Torah blessing was switched to "La'asok b'divrei Torah", for the study of Torah. We danced and we sang out loud; we blessed the new moon. And we celebrated Rosh Chodesh at the Kotel, as Women of the Wall have done for the past 25 years.

Mission Statement: As Women of the Wall, our central mission is to achieve the social and legal recognition of our right, as women, to wear prayer shawls, pray, and read from the Torah collectively and out loud at the Western Wall.

It was an honor to pray with these women. You can follow their struggle on Facebook: Women of the Wall Nashot HaKotel. And before I forget: Gali, thanks for the offer but I managed to stay out of jail this time.




