ARTWORK IN THE SANCTUARY

by Rabbi Alon Levkovitz



As our renovation project, *Chidush*, progresses and more elements are installed, I'm asked some very interesting questions. The practical ones I refer to Mark Slifkin (especially if there is a hint of criticism in them), but the religious ones I answer myself.

1. Since we hung the beautiful artwork in the sanctuary, several people asked me if by doing so, don't we go against the *halakha*, Jewish law? Or to be even more specific, don't we violate the second commandment stating that "You shall not make unto yourself a graven image" (Ex 20.4; Deut 5.8)?


The most authoritative halakhic book is the Shulhan Arukh written by Rabbi Yoseph Karro in the 16th century. In his discussion of the issue he lists some objects that are forbidden for Jews to create but limit them only to those objects which were **three dimensional in nature**; this excluded embroidery as well as wall paintings. In other words, sculptures and images of objects that people used to worship

as idols were prohibited, but paintings were not a problem.

Later on, the discussion of the prohibition against pictures and images shifted from focusing on the dangers of idolatry, which was the concern of the second commandment, but simply with the possibility of distracting the worshipper from appropriate devotion in the synagogue or concentrating on the text of a decorated book.

When we look at decorations

found in synagogues both ancient and modern, we see many of them adorned their walls with frescos and mosaics. Take for example



2. As you may know, one of our Torah Scrolls is a Czech Torah that miraculously survived the Holocaust. Since it was obvious that the scroll was in bad shape we asked a *sofer*, a scribe, to repair

it so we would be able to read from it. Unfortunately, the scribe informed us that it could not be repaired.

According to the Halakah, a non-kosher Torah scroll that is beyond repair should not be placed in the ark, but has to be buried. For obvious reasons, we didn't want to go down this path. Instead, we built a beautiful display case and placed it in the Cohn Family Welcome Center. We believe that a Torah scroll on the main wall of the synagogue is the perfect

symbol of our core values and Jewish identity. At the same time, it serves to honor the memory of the Holocaust and to communicate that despite being the victims of the biggest

genocide in the history of the human race, *Am Israel Chai*, the people of Israel are still alive. The case was designed in a way that allows us to take the Torah out. We will read from it on Rosh Hashanah, Yom Kippur and on Holocaust Memorial Day.

Should you have more questions, please share them with me.

BRINGING THE STUDY OF MODERN ISRAEL TO HAMAKOM **RELIGIOUS SCHOOL**

Last spring, the HaMakom Religious School Teachers engaged in a professional development session facilitated by Rich Walter, Associate Director of Israel Education at the Center for Israel Education, to learn about new ways that we can bring Israel subject matter into our curriculums and classrooms. Located in Atlanta, Georgia, the Center for Israel Education, or CIE, is a source destination for learners and educators about Modern Israel. For me, this was eye-opening, as up until now, I have struggled with how I would not only fit the study of Israel into my curriculum, but do it appropriately with sensitivity to some very heavy topics in history and politics that would be above the level of understanding of my second grade students. Since that initial session, I have begun my own journey to learn more about the complicated politics, diverse religions, advances in medical and scientific technologies and culture that all contribute to making modern Israel a part of my own Jewish identity, and to translate all of that into creative and innovative ways for my students to learn to love Israel too.

Educators in the growing field of Israel education face a lack of excellent, highquality teaching materials, especially for the primary grades. Existing curricula or learning plans tend to be for high school students or exist alongside Israel advocacy programs, often focusing exclusively on the Arab-Israeli conflict.

Yet, if we are to truly change the way that Israel is taught and learned in Jewish and non-Jewish schools, we need to develop more sophisticated, learnerfocused, content-rich materials for students of all ages.

In January 2016, the Center for Israel Education launched the Certificate in Israel Education Program (CIÉP) with 12 educators from across the country. Participants in this first cohort sharpened their knowledge of Israel and Zionism through special seminars with CIE staff at the **Jewish Educators Assembly** annual conference and the CIE weeklong summer workshop. Staff placed special emphasis on connecting new content with innovative dissemination approaches.

My attendance at CIE's Teacher's Conference in Atlanta last summer was an intense but extremely motivating experience. I was overwhelmed with the influx of information, but spent time

every evening after a full day of learning, researching material of which I was thoroughly engrossed, but did not understand fully myself. I kept asking myself, "How am I ever going to translate all of this into

lessons suitable for my students?" But the more I engaged, the more I knew this was the right path for me to take. And so, when they introduced the first cohort members, my own experience changed at that moment to belief that I can make a difference not only for my students, but for the children of HaMakom as a whole.

At the Jewish Educators Assembly conference in Los Angeles this past November, CIE launched a second cohort composed of 16 educators, of which I am now an extremely proud member. The cohort includes eight classroom teachers in congregational schools in addition to full-time lewish educators. Collaboration with this group of Jewish educators and mentors is an invaluable experience for me, both personally and professionally. I am confident that my students will walk away feeling a strong connection to Israel and the Israeli people as an integral part of their lives and that of our Jewish homeland.

The core of the certificate program requires each participant to develop and field-test a curricular project in his or her respective work setting. These projects have included a New York scavenger hunt that explored how Israel is portrayed in the American public domain; an arts-based, multisensory approach to Israel education for second- to fifth-graders in which students explored Israel through cooking, music, dance, literature and visual arts; an experiential learning unit about LGBTQ rights in Israel and how they have evolved over time; a studentled Yom Ha'atzmaut program with a student-created Israel museum in which each grade represented a different aspect of Israel; and an early childhood education project that used sensory materials and basic science projects to engage learners.

connect my students to modern Eretz Yisrael, the land of Israel. We have begun by dispelling the myth that Israelis today still live in tents and wander the desert. Together, we will explore the land, people and culture that exists in some very modern settings, right alongside the ancient history that is such an essential part of each of us as Jews. In June of 2017, I will present my project to another group of educators at this year's Teacher's Conference and complete the certificate program. But I will have come away with so much the connection to other educators, now friends, an immeasurable amount of knowledge and the confidence to teach my students in a way to pique their

A CIE mentor recently commented to the group on a webinar that it is exciting from their perspective that many of the participants this year will be creating projects for children in the younger grades. He asserted that once our projects are published, we should expect that teachers from all over will be looking to use our ideas and lessons, and even possibly to contact us to engage in discussion. The thought that we can impact Jewish education in this way is huge.

CIE's Certificate in Israel Education Program is the only North American project-based initiative for achieving standards and excellence in the teaching of Israel for professional Jewish educators. The program participants represent 27 institutions in 11 North American communities, including Mexico City, Winnipeg, Manitoba, and Austin, Texas.

Pending future funding, CIE will engage a third cohort next fall. For more information about the Certificate in Israel Education Program and for examples of the first cohort's projects, visit israeled.org/certificate-israeleducation-program.

my peers and has created a deeper connection for me with Temple Beth Am.



Cultivating our Garden It seems that the statement, "cultivating one's garden," refers to making a garden. And it does refer to the wonderful experience of developing and tending to a garden, but it can also refer to how we nurture children and ourselves. Children deserve to be raised by people who delight in the wonders of the world and are eager to share them. As parents and teachers, we must provide the optimal conditions that help children grow to understand themselves, others and all of life as truly miraculous.

A great way to start is spending time outdoors. For the teacher, spending time in a natural outdoor environment helps our children strengthen their creative thinking muscles, and develop problem solving capabilities. They will also come in contact with the realities of life and death, beauty and decay, gentleness and aggressiveness.

What are those optimal growing conditions for children? Carl Rodgers, the Nobel Peace Prize nominated psychologist, talks of having unconditional positive regard, a kind of love that is more meaningful and based on accepting people for who they are, not for what they do. This unconditional

positive regard can be compared to the sunlight that helps the seeds and plants to grow. As our children grow and learn, we must use authentic praise which helps to motivate them. Research has shown the children's intrinsic motivation to work actually decreases when they are peppered with lots of "good job" and "good work" comments.

Noticing their work, or describing exactly what the child has done with the comment of good job builds relationships with children. They do not have to do things to please us, or worry about being good enough. So how did the garden become the subject of this article? As educators and parents, we can encourage children to enjoy caretaking in nature, and they learn to be caretakers for themselves. The natural world provides us with so many ways to learn to take care of the world and ourselves (Tikkun Olam).

Yiddish folk saying

At The One School, we have realized that a community garden provides rich curriculum within the preschool setting. It provides the ideal platform for experiential learning about insects, fruits, vegetables, trees, flowers, herbs, seeds, life cycles, seasons, weather, water conservation, teamwork and solitude.

Our children participate in all aspects of the garden. They help prepare the soil, plant the seeds, weed, water, pick and harvest. Indeed, the children are often more willing to try new vegetables that they have planted and cared for themselves! This encourages healthy diet and living.

In the garden, the children observe first hand an ecosystem and discuss the roles of bees, ladybugs, beetles, and other insects. They experience teamwork as they work together throughout the planting cycle. And they learn to connect with and respect the natural world and everything it provides.

So as we prepare to celebrate Tu B'Shevat, the Jewish Arbor Day, let us cultivate our garden, our children and help them to be the best they can be! Chag Sameach!






