

## ISRAEL: MORE HUMANITARIAN THAN THEY THINK

As I am writing these words, the reports indicate that more than 310,000 people have been killed since the Syrian conflict began, and over half the population has been displaced, with millions becoming refugees. The situation in Aleppo, Syria, has been dire for a long time and got much worse as the Syrian regime took over the city. The tragedy of those who remained in the city is constantly portrayed in the media coverage of this humanitarian crisis along with the opinions of

and shared with us the story of how Israel has been allowing injured people from an enemy country, that does not recognize Israel's right to exist, to enter the country and receive free and high-end life-saving medical care. At this point, the estimate is that thousands of Syrians have been treated in Israeli hospitals and were brought to health before returning to their country. Recently, Prime Minister Netanyahu instructed the Foreign Ministry to find ways to further help on a humanitarian basis, saying that "We have already treated thousands of wounded from the tragedy in Syria. I want us to find ways of bringing women, children and also men, if they are non-combatants, from Aleppo for treatment in Israeli hospitals." While the treatment of civilians who have been wounded in combat has

endless experts and politicians telling us what the West should have done to prevent it. I have no intention of adding to this deluge of words, but wanted to share with you a small ray of light that is often overlooked.

From the get-go of the Syrian civil war, Israel has been taking in injured civilians to be treated in its hospitals. Last year Dr. Salman Zarka, the head of Ziv Hospital in Northern Israel, came to Temple Beth Am

of the war, the Israeli military has been operating daily buses since September from refugee camps near the border to Israeli hospitals and treating refugees that are sick and need medical care.

As this humanitarian crisis escalates, average Israeli citizens have been alarmed and wanted to help in addition to what the government and the Israeli Defense Force have been doing. A crowdfunding

initiative, "Just Beyond Our Borders," has raised one million Israeli Shekels (just over \$250,000) in less than one week. The initiative aims at raising money to help, save and assist the children of Aleppo. Ignoring political boundaries and borders, those Israelis are trying to help save the innocent children who are stuck in a horrible predicament. The money raised would be used to purchase baby formula and nutritious supplements for children. Several other organizations collect blankets, sanitary products, mattresses, coats and jackets.

As you know, it is hard to find a consensus in Israel about anything, but when Israelis from all walks of society talk about the situation in Syria they stress the point that as people who suffered the Holocaust, Israelis cannot and should not sit idly by. In Pirkei Avot, (250 CE) we learn from Shmuel HaKatan: "Binfol Oyvecha Al Tismach"—"Do not rejoice at the fall of your enemy." The people of Modern Israel took it even further. Syria has been a fierce enemy of Israel for almost seven decades and its army killed thousands of our soldiers, but when they suffer, we don't only refrain from rejoicing, we do all we can to save their lives.



## **CONTRUCTION UPDATE**

by Mark Slifkin

### **CHIDUSH**

Interesting Facts about the Jerusalem Stone

- Our Limestone comes from Mitzpe Ramon in the Negev Desert of southern Israel
- The Limestone on the rear wall behind the Ark and the wing walls were cut differently
- The rear wall is slab cut that is horizontally cut and contains limestone created over a more limited period of time
- The wing walls were vein cut that is vertically cut and contains limestone created over a very long period of time
  - Limestone at the bottom of the Makhtesh Ramon Crater is dated around 200 million years ago when it was the sea bed of the ancient Mediterranean
  - The quarry wall is 30 feet high & around 100 million years old
  - The 7-foot section of the wing wall we see took approximately 24 million years to form. That is why you see such color variation from top to bottom





In Afghanistan, a culture ruled almost entirely by men, the birth of a son is cause for celebration and the arrival of a daughter is often mourned as misfortune. A bacha posh (literally translated from Dari as "dressed up like a boy") is a third kind of child - a girl temporarily raised as a boy and presented as such to the outside world. Jenny Nordberg, the

reporter who broke the story of this phenomenon for the New York Times, constructs a powerful and moving account of those secretly living on the other side of a deeply segregated society where women have almost no rights and little freedom. The Underground Girls of Kabul is anchored by vivid characters who bring this remarkable story to life: Azita, a female parliamentarian who sees no other choice but to turn her fourth daughter Mehran into a boy; Zahra, the tomboy teenager who struggles with puberty and refuses her parents' attempts to turn her back into a girl; Shukria, now a married mother of three after living for twenty years as a man; and Nader, who prays with Shahed, the undercover female police officer, as they both remain in male disguise as adults. At the heart of this emotional narrative is a new perspective on the extreme sacrifices of Afghan women and girls against the violent backdrop of America's longest war. Divided into four parts, the book follows those born as the unwanted sex in Afghanistan, but who live as the socially favored gender through childhood and puberty, only to later be forced into marriage and

childbirth. *The Underground Girls of Kabul* charts their dramatic life cycles, while examining our own history and the parallels to subversive actions of people who live under oppression everywhere.



### Friendship

With our youngest children so diligently engaged, why do educators still emphasize cooperative play with peers? Children must develop social skills in their early years in order to make and keep friends. Even at the age of 3 or 4, children learn to communicate, compromise and negotiate in order to develop lasting friendships.

Role model. For children to be successful in making friends, we need to set a good example. In Judaism, we emphasize many values including Gemilut Chasidim (acts of kindness), Rachmanus (compassion), empathy, tolerant language use and cooperation. By watching us interact, children will pick up on culturally accepted social skills. Children need to experience a variety of social contacts to make friends more easily.

Seek quality early childhood programs and playgroups. Programs with trained and stable staff have a positive impact on a child's ability to make friends by promoting attachment and self-esteem. Competent teachers encourage children to describe their feelings and to communicate directly with their peers to appropriately resolve problems. Remove the batteries. Give children the opportunity to experience unstructured play

with peers, using open-ended materials such as puppets and blocks. Electronic devices do not provide the face-to-face feedback needed to develop empathy and compassion. Children develop friendship skills best when they have an opportunity to direct their own play.

Friendships create a sense of belonging and acceptance. Building friendships during the early years gives children the cooperative skills needed for interacting with siblings and classmates, and eventually coworkers and spouses.




