Bullying has captured our attention in recent years, especially as we become aware of how social media dramatically increases its destructive effect. While I am yet convinced that there is a foolproof method for kids to avoid becoming victims of bullying, I do know of a way to significantly alleviate some of its pain. Most children belong to a school community where the majority of bullying incidents occur. However, when children belong to additional groups such as athletic teams and religious youth groups, or have neighborhood friends, the emotional effect of school bullying is relatively subtle and often less detrimental.

Those children successfully draw strength and support from their non-school networks. School may not be their favorite place while the bullying is going on, but they don't feel as isolated and hopeless as long as they feel connected to and appreciated by the members of their other communities.

I shared this thought with many parents (mainly to encourage them to sign their kids up for Shalom Chai, our post B'nei Mitzvah program) before I realized how important it is for *adults* to belong to multiple communities as well. It is true that bullying is rare among adults; but belonging to different communities also reduces stress and increases happiness. For most of us, our work place, at least socially, takes the place of school. Only that in this stage of our life we typically don't play team sports, we don't go to youth group meetings, and certainly don't ride our Penny Skateboards with our neighborhood friends. What seems to be natural and easy for the young becomes more complex as we grow older.

Temple Beth Am is a community and this is one of the reasons people join us. For some, the Temple is their main community where they worship, study and socialize with their friends. For others, the connection with the synagogue is quite loose, as it is only one community among many others to which they belong. And it is all good. The goal of TBA is not to compete with the other groups in your life, but to be there for you when you need us. We are not a homogeneous group of people; the needs of our members are diverse and they change over time. A young couple initially spends no time thinking of schools until one day it's all they think and talk about for the next several decades. Spirituality is usually less of an interest for those in their 20's and 30's as they establish themselves professionally and are busy taking care of their families but then they might feel a spiritual void they want to fill. No matter what your needs and priorities are, we want you to consider TBA as one of your communities, and we need you to help others to fulfill their need of belonging.

We learned from our Town Hall Meetings that while we pride ourselves as being warm and welcoming, and indeed many were amazed of the ease and speed with which they felt part of TBA, it was not the case for everyone. We work very hard and are fully committed to being as accessible to you as possible. Our objective is not to require that you do more with TBA than you want, but rather to make it simple and effortless to join us for any activity you choose.

As human beings we are programmed to live in communities. We are happier and healthier (really!) when we are with others. TBA can be a minor or a major community for you and we promise to make it both meaningful and fulfilling.

A fun event where TBA's members, families and friends come together is our annual Summer Picnic. This year we are gathering at a new venue - the Palm Beach Gardens Aquatic Center on Burns Road. Come join us on Sunday, July 21st from 10:00am to 12:30pm for a casual and fun celebration. I hope to see you there!

If you have not, please know that you can speak to me anytime, or to any of our Board members, because this is what we want for you. I feel that each year we accomplish a little bit more, and do a little better. Imagine what will happen over the next three years!

I appreciate the input that each of you have had during my time as President. The suggestions, comments, even the criticism, is all constructive, it helps us learn and shape our direction. None of what this Temple does would be possible without our amazing members. Thank you, thank you, thank you!

IMPORTANT NEWS ABOUT MEMBERSHIP AT TEMPLE BETH AM

July 1, 2013 - June 30, 2014

It's here. It's new. It's revolutionary... and yet it is a return to our true Jewish values. It's a way for all of us to foster the kind of open, inclusive Jewish community of which we would all like to be a part.

You have undoubtedly heard some of the talk, and may have even attended a Town Hall meeting about our new approach to Temple membership. We are scrapping the outdated traditional dues structure, in favor of a more modern and engaging approach based on a voluntary financial commitment.

The burning question in everyone's mind, of course, is how will this work? How will the Temple meet its financial obligations without traditional "dues"?

Change is challenging, but we are so excited about re-energizing TBA, and trying to make us more of a true "community", believing that it will yield the intangible rewards we are envisioning (and have seen occur at other synagogues in the country of our size and demographics). Of course, our success will turn on each of us believing this can work, and each of us doing our part to make sure it does.

So here's the plan. We will no longer issue "dues" statements in June for the upcoming fiscal year. Instead, based on the projected budget for the fiscal year, we have created a "Sustaining Financial Commitment" amount. As reflected on the Voluntary Financial Commitment Pledge Card you should have already received in the mail, we are ideally hoping that two-adult households will give \$2,000, and that one-adult households will give \$1,000. Those levels are a starting point; it is our hope that those who can give more, will, and those who cannot afford that level will give what they can—NO QUESTIONS ASKED. The annual pledge card also allows you (and us) to plan an annual budget (with many options to pay as you wish).

In a nutshell, your voluntary financial commitment will:

- Entitle you to High Holy Day tickets (regardless of your commitment level).
- Allow you to choose the schedule that is most comfortable for you to make the payments to fulfill your commitment: annually, semi-annually, quarterly, or monthly.
- End the need to request financial assistance regarding dues.
- Establish you as a vital supporter of an inclusive Jewish community here in Northern Palm Beach County...and provide many new opportunities to volunteer and get involved with your Temple.

Your voluntary financial commitment will NOT include tuition or fees for Religious School or Shalom Chai, or B'nei Mitzvah fees; those will still be borne by those utilizing specific fee for service programs.

To ensure that we can plan responsibly **please return your Voluntary Financial Commitment Pledge Card to the Temple office by June 15, 2013.** As indicated, the Pledge Card has slots for your "pledged" amount, and your preferred payment schedule and method of payment.

If you have not received your Pledge Card, or if you have any questions about your membership or ways you can get more involved in TBA, don't hesitate to call the Temple office at (561) 747-1109. We're always happy to hear from you!

We hope that you share in Temple Beth Am's excitement and pride in making this momentous change. We want to thank everyone in advance for trusting our Temple's leadership, and for your willingness to make this leap of faith, *together*. In our hearts, we sincerely feel that this new approach will bring us closer together as a Temple family!

TBA Kulanu Update

- We've rolled out the new Voluntary Financial Commitment for Temple membership.

- We've started to reorganize staff to better serve the TBA Kulanu initiative and make it easier for volunteers to get involved.

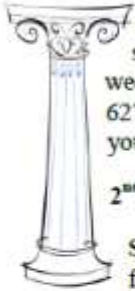

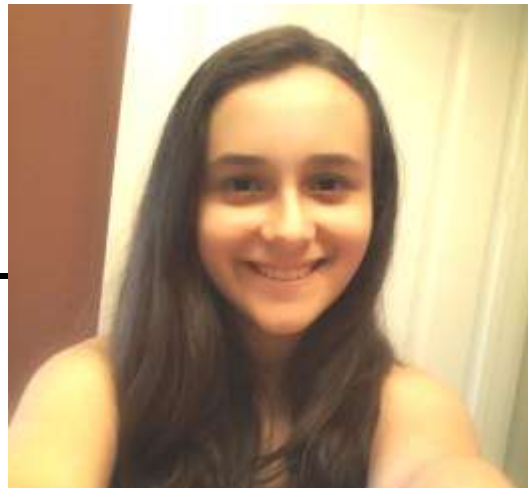

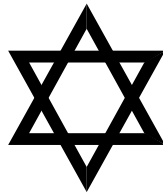
