

A famous line in the *Haggadah* (the book we use on Passover) instructs us to see ourselves as if we were personally liberated from Egypt. It is a wonderful idea that makes us put ourselves in our ancestors' shoes, feeling their physical and mental agony and thus learning about gratitude, compassion and empathy. The poor slaves who had just been set free from Egypt were able, in time, to heal from the wounds of slavery, yet some wounds remained open and kept bleeding as long as their hearts were beating.

One of these open psychological wounds was their inability to dream and to aspire to greatness. Time and again the Israelites pleaded with God to send them back to Egypt. They were scared of the endless opportunities embodied in freedom and independence. A life of a slave is harsh, but after a while one gets used to the meager food and strenuous work and finds comfort in the familiar structure. The daily tasks and the habitual routines become the slave's entire world, leaving no space for dreams. God tried to change the Israelites with miracles, promises and threats, until He gave up.

One of the greatest Yiddish writers, I.L.Peretz, wrote a story named *Bontsha the Silent*. Bontsha lived unknown, in silence, and in silence he died. "He existed like a grain of sand at the rim of a vast ocean, amid millions of other grains of sand exactly similar, and when the wind at last lifted him up and carried him across to the other shore of that ocean, no one noticed, no one at all."

But when he died, there was a great excitement in Heaven. There, in paradise, two angels came bearing a golden throne for Bontsha to sit upon, and for his head a golden crown with glittering jewels. And what was the reason for the honor bestowed upon this simple poor man? Despite unspeakable suffering and being more tormented than anyone before him, "He never complained, not against God, not against man; his eyes never grew red with hatred, he never raised a protest against heaven."

At the end of the story, God tells him "Everything in Paradise is yours. Choose! Take! Whatever you want." Bontsha had but one humble request, that every morning for breakfast he would like to have a hot roll with fresh butter. Hearing this request, God and the angels bent their heads in shame. What was stolen from Bontsha, and all who live like him, was the ability to dream.

Today, in the U.S., our lives couldn't be more different from those of Bontsha and the Israelites. We have unparalleled abundance and easy access to knowledge, but do we know how to dream? Is the sky really the limit or is it more like the mere tips of our fingers?

In the book *Fame Junkies: The Hidden Truths Behind America's Favorite Addiction*, author Jake Halpern asked high school kids this question: "When you grow up, which of the following jobs would you most like to have?"

The results among girls were as follows:

- 9.5% Chief of a major company like General Motors,
- 9.8% Navy Seal,
- 13.6% United States Senator,
- 23.7% President of a great university like Harvard or Yale, and
- 43.4% Personal assistant to a very famous singer or movie star.

Halpern goes on to hypothesize why so many boys and girls are obsessed with fame. His research showed that kids, especially those with low self-esteem, would rather be famous than smart, strong or beautiful. I find these results to be troubling. I am far from promoting an aspiration of being famous, and it is very disturbing that so many kids can only dream of being *an assistant* to a celebrity, enjoying but a few sprinkles of someone else's stardust.

So, as you sit around the Passover Seder table with your family and friends, ask the question, why have so many people in the Western world lost their ability to dream, and how can we restore that God given gift?

FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

For those of you who don't know, my brother has cancer. David was diagnosed ten years ago and immediately underwent surgery and experimental radiation treatment. For the last nine years he's done OK. Sure, he's had some symptoms, but David is a doctor who is used to dealing with other peoples'

diseases and impairments, so he just made accommodations and soldiered on. In fact, over the past ten years David has accrued more professional accomplishments and life experiences than anyone else in my family. He travelled to Southeast Asia for a month. He spent several weeks living in a hut in a tiny village in Africa as a volunteer surgeon. Since the beginning of the summer, though, David's health issues have been quickly multiplying. He was excited to start a new chemotherapy in January, but he got the flu or some virus and ended up in the hospital instead. He's home now, but hasn't really recovered. My sister, my mother and I have been working together to try to coordinate his care so he can get healthy enough to restart the chemo. It's been draining and stressful for all of us, but at least we were each able to share the responsibility and lean on one another for support.

My mother (knock wood) is a strong, independent woman who will celebrate her 80th birthday in May. She's as sharp and active now as she ever was - so much so that I tend to forget she's aging. When Mom called me last week to tell me that her doctor thought she had breast cancer, it was an unwelcome reminder how much things can change in a second. One minute she was a member of the "team" taking care of my brother, and the next minute it looked like my sister and I were going to have to figure out how to care for Mom in South Carolina and my brother in New York.

With all that's been going on in my family, I admit I haven't been making the effort to get to Friday Night Services very often. Instead, I'd go home on Friday evening and try to relax before the next round of weekend phone calls and emails about tests and rehab and home health care. Truthfully, if it wasn't for Friday Night LIVE with Dan Nichols last week, I probably would have missed Services again. But I've loved Dan Nichols and his music since hearing him at Camp Coleman several years ago and seeing him interact with kids (especially little ones) makes me smile, so I made a point of staying for Camp Shabbat and then Friday Night LIVE.

So there I was, enjoying the Shabbat Service. Then we reached the Mi Shebeirach. Usually when we get to the prayer for healing during Services, I'm too upset to say David's name out loud. As Rabbi Alon was reading the names of the ill, though, I realized that David was on his list, but not Mom. I quickly rushed up to the front of the Sanctuary to add both their names to the prayer.

During the Oneg after Services, several people came up to me to ask after my brother and my mother. Even though I really didn't want to go into my whole tale of woe, their concern was very comforting because I could feel it was genuine. That feeling of support helped me get through an emotionally challenging weekend.

If you've read my past Scribe articles, you know I often refer to Temple Beth Am as a community. After this past weekend, I know it's true. We ARE a community. That includes all of us, whether you set foot in the Temple or not. It doesn't matter whether you know everyone's name, have dozens of friends in the congregation, or just recognize a familiar face or two. The fact is you have a really strong support system behind you, whether you know it or not. This is a congregation that helps one another.

So, thank you to everyone who expressed their concern to me over the past few days or just held my family in your thoughts. I hope to be able to do the same for you one day so that you can know how good that feels.

By the way, Mom called yesterday. Her biopsy came back clean. She's fine.

Help families in our area by bringing in something for the **Head Start Food Pantry collection**. Please bring in a canned good or anything else on the list any time you are at the Temple. A simple act of kindness will go a long way.

CURRENT EVENTS

On Friday, January 25th, Rabbi Alon graciously gave up his sermon for a guest speaker. The speaker was identified by the Men's Club's Vice-President of events, Harvey Silverman. Harvey worked diligently to research the speaker, Ms. Kyra Schuster, Curator of the Holocaust Museum, in Washington D.C.

Ms. Schuster's presentation was breathtaking. Through her research she discovered that the USA had sent a relatively newly trained company of 325 soldiers to Germany as replacements. These young soldiers were immediately captured by the Germans, and interned in a Concentration Camp (NOT A POW CAMP). The difference being that these young soldiers were treated as political and Jewish prisoners, and not as captured soldiers. This was against the Geneva Convention.

The Sanctuary was filled that Friday night, and you could hear a pin drop during the presentation. Again I'd like to thank Harvey Silverman for his tenacity in bringing this speaker to us.

On Saturday Night, January 26th the Men's Club arranged a dinner out at LeMetro, a French style bistro in Downtown at Abacoa. The dinner menu had three courses, and included your choice of four different entrees. The entire dinner was presented for \$30 a person, all inclusive, except for libations. Everyone who I spoke to had a great time. The food was good and so was the company, a total of 36 people attended. The dinner start time was 6:30pm and it didn't end until almost 10:30pm. 

TEMPLE BETH AM FOOD PANTRY- COLLECTION FOR HEAD START FAMILIES: The TBA Head Start Food Pantry, in its second month of operation, has already surpassed expectations. In January, our collective donations filled enough bags of food to feed 22 families (115 people)! This month we exceeded that by having enough non-perishables to add 4 additional families to our roster, thanks to your support, the support of local businesses and the Palm Beach County Food Bank.

ST. GEORGE'S SOUP KITCHEN: March 18th (3rd Monday every Month): We continue to serve between 170-200 hungry adults and children every month.
