

ADULT LEARNING WITH RABBI ALON



Rosh Hashanah, Yom Kippur, Sukkot and Simchat Torah are behind us and I'm excited to begin my Adult Ed classes. This year I'm inviting you to join me in three classes:

Mussar:

This class is a new territory for me, since it combines learning and practice. Last Fall I flew to Chicago for a special seminar to learn how to facilitate it effectively. It was one of the most spiritual experiences way my daughter took Physical Education in high school – online. While she acquired some knowledge relating to the human body and nutrition, it had no effect on her physical fitness. In the teachings of the Mussar movement we find some of the deepest intellectual ideas, but learning them without the appropriate practice will not advance us spiritually.

So, what is Mussar? In modern Hebrew, it means Ethics, but it is much more. Mussar is a thousand years old school of thought that helps us to honestly reflect on and recognize our characteristic and traits to allow us to move from where we are to where we want and should be. The premise is that all our traits can be placed

I ever had. Because of the special nature of this class the number of participants is very limited and it has a cost that goes directly to the Mussar Institute.

I was introduced to the teachings of Mussar early on in my Jewish studies. But only recently did I understand that the way my teachers taught me the material was akin to the

on a spectrum. For example, let's take the spectrum pride-humility. The idea is not that we should move from pride to humility, but rather, find where we are now on the spectrum and where we should go. Too much humility is as bad as too much pride, and we therefore should find the right balance between them (see more details in the ad on page 15).

On Sundays, when our wonderful Religious School is in session, I invite the parents and other adults to learn some Torah. I will be leading an hour of a discussion-based study either on the weekly portion or another Jewish theme. Everyone is welcome to buy a bagel from our Youth Group and join us. No RSVP or long-term commitment is required.

Intro to Judaism:

Last May we celebrated an Adult B'nei Mitzvah with 17 of our friends. When I asked them how they wanted to continue their Jewish Education, many of them told me that they feel the need for a comprehensive knowledge of Judaism. That may include Jewish history, understanding the meaning and practice of festivals, Jewish philosophy and more. I loved the idea and decided to invite anyone who wants to embark on this journey. The course will run for 16 weeks. Everyone is welcome: Jews and non-Jews, those who had Bar/Bat Mitzvah and those who have not, those who have prior knowledge and those who don't.

I am looking forward to seeing you in these classes.

CHIDUSH CAPITAL CAMPAIGN KICK-OFF 2.0

Dear Fellow Temple Beth Am Member:

By now, most of you have probably been to the Temple for High Holy Days or some other reason and have seen the Chidush renovations ongoing in the Sanctuary, Welcoming Center (formerly known as the ho-hum Lobby), and the Social Halls. Soon you will be able to see the completed improvements, as well as similar changes to the Youth Lounge, offices, kitchen area, the Clergy study, and the Chapel/Crying Room. We hope you like what you see.

Here are four very important points to consider:

- 1. The Temple really needed this face lift. Times have changed. Trust us, we have required these improvements for years. And now we have them. Yay!
- 2. The design incorporates everything we needed. Not everything we wanted. But what we needed. That is an important distinction. We don't have unlimited time and money. However, every light, speaker, fixture, and color combination has a purpose. It all works.
- 3. This is your Temple and these are your improvements. The people who helped design, plan, and run the committees, including this Capital Campaign Committee are doing this for you. Your job is to be a part of it, talk to us, participate, support it, and yes—provide constructive criticism if you want. Constructive input means you care. Caring is better than apathy any day. Caring leads to improvement. Improvement leads to sustainability and strength.
- 4. Last spring's Capital Campaign effort raised over 80% of the money

we need. But we need more. We can only get that from you. We are a voluntary dues Temple; one of only a few in the nation. We cannot easily impose a building fee and we do not want to financially burden members to the point where they are not able to support the voluntary financial commitment for membership or the High Holy Days appeal. That would be a problem. Fortunately, we have some very generous, caring people who have given so much to Chidush already. Now we need all of those other generous, caring people that have yet to give to Chidush to step up and help.

Here is what we are planning next:

- In the next month we will contact those of you who have not yet given. Most of you will be called by a fellow Temple member during a telephone solicitation campaign. This will happen from November 10-20. When our volunteers call you, please answer and listen. Remember it is not easy asking for money, even for a very worthy, selfless cause. By the way, you do not have to wait until the call to give. You can contact the Temple office at any time and get more information on giving opportunities.
- Besides the money, it is critical that we get all of you to participate. Seriously, it is not just about the money. Many of us were around when we built the existing building, before that the trailers, and before that the Parkway facility. Each time, everyone who participated, and that was nearly everyone, played a vital part in the Temple life and in growing and sustaining the Jewish community in this part of the world. When we participated

we transformed from a congregant receiving a service to being a part of something really good. The feeling is indescribable. Ask any of the people who were around then. Do not miss the opportunity. There may not be another one like this for a long time.

- If you cannot give much, then give something. Keep in mind there are many ways to give. There are dedications starting at \$1,800 and going all the way up to \$150,000—payable over five years. And we have commemorative bricks starting at \$250 and going to \$1,000. Or if you have another idea, please let us know. This is your Temple. You have a say.
- If you cannot give, then we won't pressure you. We are friends and it would not be right. But if you can give, now is the time. There is no better place to give than giving to your place, your Temple, your community.

Let us close by saying it once again. We are asking you for help. If we cannot ask you, then who can we ask? You never let the Temple down in the past and we are confident the Temple can count on you now. We are all in this together, Kulanu as we say.

And so on that note, as the High Holy Days close and we look forward to the next year, we wish you and your family a very healthy, happy, and good year. We hope to see you often and for many, many good times in our new and improved Temple.

"Education is not the filling of a bucket but the lighting of a fire." *W.B. Yeats*

There is much talk about the need to ignite a passion for learning in young children. In truth, the passion is there from the beginning. Anyone who observes a newborn's fascination with a ceiling fan or mobile sees the excitement of the child to make sense of her world. Too often as educators, we smother that passion with rote learning and standardized expectation. Our responsibility as educators and parents is to find a way to keep children's passion for learning. Perhaps if there were fewer requirements for sitting still, standing quietly in lines, less emphasis on learning by rote and more realistic and age appropriate expectations for children, we would inherently see children's passion for learning.

Dr. Lillian Katz, well known and respected researcher and author, contends that some early childhood classrooms are academic boot camps. Lillian Katz says that we cannot continue to stuff our children with academics, but that we must become more committed to understanding the whole child as a social and emotional being. Although math and science are important and necessary, knowing how to work together, think creatively and engage in investigation, observation and problem solving, are also important.

A child's passion for learning is visible in a playful classroom. It engages children and builds on their interests. The playful classroom has time and space for dance,

music, gross-motor play, childled storytelling and open-ended process oriented art. Children develop autonomy and have choices that determine their own level of participation. They are encouraged to express their opinions and ideas, and their voices are heard.

A joyful classroom also encourages a passionate way of feeling. Children and teachers sing together, dance together, cheer for one another and learn together. The teacher facilitates, rather than dictates, the process of learning which in turn enhances skills such as building social relationships and problem solving. The classroom has many opportunities for celebration, whether to honor accomplishment or commemorate an important event. Teacher and children engage in child-like wonder, recognize all that is good and give thanks.

To keep children's passion for learning alive, we say "no" to rote learning. Rote learning is learning by memorization. We find out what excites children by observing their play and listening to their conversations. Our teachers give them chances to share their knowledge and to look for answers with experts. Children can create displays of their new ideas. They use authentic tools and materials that they may physically touch and manipulate to inspire their creativity and passion. The passion is there and will stay as we create a love of learning that will last a lifetime!




