PLANNING THE HIGH HOLY DAYS SERVICES

When I studied at Tel Aviv University I took a class on American Jewish History. My assignment was to write a paper on the Reconstructionist Movement (which I hate to admit, but until that time, I had not heard of). The first book I read, which is one of the many reasons that directed me eventually to Rabbinical School, was Mordecai Kaplan's "Judaism as a Civilization" (published in 1934). The first line of that book reads: **"Before the beginning of the 19th century, all Jews regarded Judaism as a privilege; since then most Jews have come to regard it as a burden."**

I remember a friend telling me that he considers it a miracle that he remained Jewish. "I hated Hebrew School more than anything else I can remember from those years," he said. "And when I complained to my parents about how boring school was and how mean the teachers were my father's response was, 'Listen, I went to Hebrew school when I was your age, and I hated it. It was boring and the teachers were mean, but my parents made me go. And now you're going to go to Hebrew school just like I did.'"

Hebrew Schools have come a

long way since, but sometimes I get the impression that many Jews still believe that anything authentically Jewish must be painful, difficult and somber, otherwise it is not the "real thing." It is not a new phenomenon and some rabbis in the last 500 years have been trying to change it.

One of those rabbis was Rabbi Isaac Luria (known as the Ari). The Ari was one of the most important rabbis in our history. He lived in the middle of the 16th century in the city of Safed (Tz'fat), in Israel. In one of his most puzzling statements, he said that the festival of Purim has greater holiness and sanctity than Yom Kippur. Some understood this as a mere exaggeration attempting to elevate the importance of Purim. I understand him differently. I think that Rabbi Luria is trying to teach us that to make the High Holy Days more meaningful and spiritual we must borrow the key element of joy from Purim and apply it to the Days of Awe.

Rabbi Luria teaches us that there are two primary emotions that lead us in our spiritual journey. One is awe and the other is love. Both are necessary and that's why we refer to God as *avinu malkeinu*, our "parent" and our "King." God is simultaneously very close to us and, yet, very separate and removed from us. We feel awe when we perceive God as the Eternal One, Maker of Heaven and Earth, whose essence is far beyond our ability to grasp. But it is love that draws us close. We

understand how love leads to joy, but I believe that awe does it too. The way I understand awe is as a mixture of fear and extreme joy and appreciation. Remember the first time you saw the Grand Canyon or Niagara Falls?

Many of us grew up when Services were very somber, as someone told me last year, "I loved the Services even though they were a bit too happy for my taste." I have to admit that I never saw happy as the opposite of serious. We believe that there is a time to be solemn, a time to laugh and a time for all the emotions in between. Therefore, we work hard when we plan the Services for the High Holy Days to strike a balance between all the emotions mentioned above. We do it through the prayers we choose, the readings, our comments throughout the Service and the variety of melodies. I hope that you find Services this year as meaningful as we do.

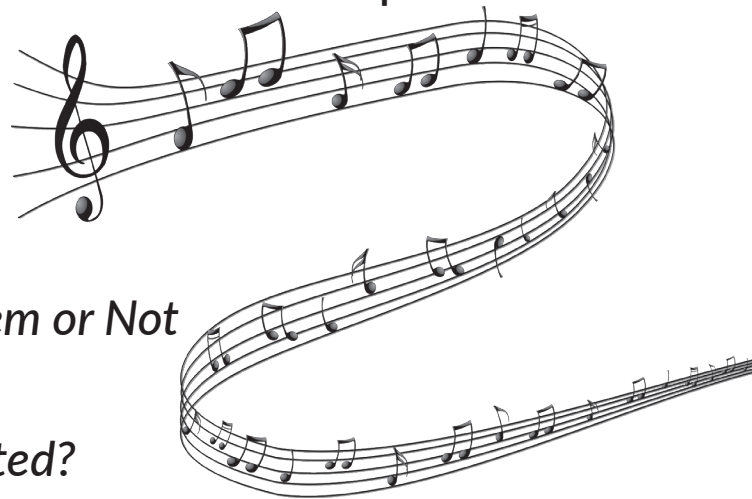

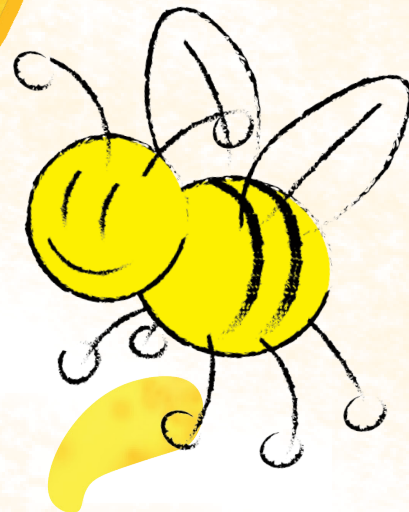

COPING WITH THE HIGH HOLY DAYS AFTER THE DEATH OF A LOVED ONE

The High Holy Days are almost here and you're not sure of how that makes you feel. If you have experienced the death of a family member or friend within the past two years the holidays might be daunting, for example: facing yizkor for the first time, the person will not be seated next to you as in the past, or you're not sure you want to host your annual Rosh Hashanah dinner or festive break-fast.

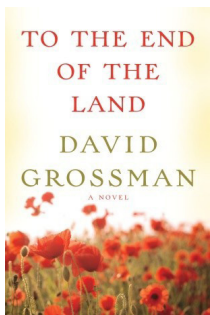

With the wit, heart, precision, and depth of understanding that has characterized his work, Roger Rosenblatt peels back the layers on this most personal of losses to create both a tribute to his late daughter and a testament to familial love. The day Amy died, Harris told Ginny and Roger, "It's impossible." Roger's story tells how a family makes the possible of the impossible.

This Rosh Hashanah, I Challenge You to Focus on the Positives

Two essential parts of preparing for Rosh Hashanah, our clean slate for the year, is asking forgiveness from anyone we wronged and making a list (mental or written) of the ways we fell short since the last time we heard the shofar. Ideally that hard work of going to friends, family, and anyone else deserving of our forgiveness happens in the weeks leading up to Rosh Hashanah. By the time Yom Kippur rolls around 10 days later, we should be ready to confess our mistakes as a community, having already considered our personal paths to teshuva, repentance, and how we will do better this year.

If, like me, you're the kind of person with a high capacity for guilt, you probably find that task easy, too, since we already felt badly about it during the year. I regret contributing to any gossip. I regret listening to any gossip. I regret not helping individuals or organizations more than I could have.

I find that children, perhaps through nature and nurture, also have no problem (OK, after some prodding) coming up with people deserving of apologies and ways they could have behaved better during the year.

In Rabbi Joseph Telushkin's book "A Code of Jewish Ethics Volume I: You Shall Be Holy," he suggests that in addition to focusing on our transgressions before Rosh Hashanah, we also make a list of the good we did this year. He provides a sample prayer modeled after the Al Chet ("For the sin I committed by...") recited on Yom Kippur. Instead of "For the sin I committed," he starts each line

with, "For the mitzvah we (or I) performed." He ends the prayer with these encouraging words: "All these things, God, please remember and inspire us to do more acts like these in the year ahead."

I find the "For the mitzvah I performed" exercise a great exercise for children. We are not just focusing on mistakes, but position actions, encouraging our kids to think of their good deeds as well. But the power of focusing on both the mistakes and the positive actions we performed this year is about

as powerful of a Rosh Hashanah preparation that you can get.

One mitzvah that is a major mitzvah for Rosh Hashanah is to hear the shofar. The shofar is our spiritual wake-up call. It would not be required every year if we were expected to have lived flawlessly.

For the mitzvah I performed I shared with my community the importance of focusing not only on our mistakes, but also positive actions for the year!
