While most difficult things in life get easier with time and repeated occurrences, there are some exceptions. On August 20th 1997 (which happens to be my parents' wedding anniversary) I got on a plane from Tel Aviv to New York. I had traveled quite a lot up to that point in my life, but it was the first time that I bought a one-way ticket: we came to the U.S. not for a vacation but to study and we had no idea how long we were going to stay. In the hours before the flight I worked exceptionally hard to conceal my enormous pain, mainly by making fun (in a loving way) of my mother's tears, but I didn't do it well.

Since then, in the past eighteen years, the whole family crossed the Atlantic Ocean dozens of times to be with each other, but the pain of saying goodbye has not ebbed, only grew stronger. One reason is that the older generation is getting neither younger nor healthier and there is always the fear (no matter how hard we deny it) that it might be the last time we see them. The other reason is that when we left Israel it was just the two of us, and now we are five. Seeing our children's pain when they say goodbye to their grandparents, aunts, uncles and the ever-growing number of cousins, multiplies our own ache.

Earlier this year Gali and I decided that this summer we would not take a vacation that involves airports. But when we received an unexpected invitation to Gali's cousin's wedding in Portugal we knew we had to go. There were many reasons to avoid the trip, including missing the last days of summer break as well as the first day of school, but at the same time, the opportunity to be with family members we seldom see, won. Gali's family is very small but astonishingly, those who attended the wedding came from five countries: Portugal, Israel, USA, Brazil and Angola. The wedding took place in a small village outside of Lisbon where we spent a wonderful weekend together. But at one point when I had a rare opportunity to check my email I came across a message from the airline company reminding us to check in for our flight back to Miami. At that moment, the delightful mood we had throughout the weekend turned 180 degrees. The joy of being together with those we love, but hardly ever see, was replaced with the too familiar sadness of saying goodbye and not knowing when (or even if) we will be together again. I am very grateful for having the life I have and live where I do, but in moments like that I miss the time in which everyone whom I cared for lived within 200 yards from my home.

The pain of saying goodbye is unavoidable, but it also taught us to try our best not to pass up an opportunity, despite cost, time and other inconveniences, to be with our loved ones, for happy occasions as well as sad ones. More than once it was hard to overcome the temptation to sneak out unnoticeably without saying goodbye, but we knew that we would end up feeling worse. And we have learned to try to avoid saying goodbye at the airport. Especially for our children, we wanted them to associate going to the airports with vacations and adventures and not with leaving loved ones behind.

Most of us will not be lucky enough to celebrate the upcoming High Holy Days with our entire family and best friends. But we should all follow the tradition of calling (writing, skyping) all of them to wish Shanah Tovah and tell them how important they are to us.

My family and I are grateful to all of you for being our extended family. We wish you Shanah Tovah, filled with health, peace, family and good friends.

- We completed the first Chidush item for The One School with the addition of new flooring in the hallway and security entry locks in the playground. **Paula Deakter** and the entire One School staff offer special thanks to **Shawn Berry, Richard Remick** and **We'll Floor You** for their extensive efforts in completing the laying of the floor before school started.
- We had an audio demonstration by **Meyer Sound**, arranged by our sound consultant, **ED+A Acoustics**. All I can say is WOW, we have chosen the right system – just ask **Cantor Jessica** what she thought of the audio test. We will also have a new digital hearing impaired system that will not only work in the Sanctuary but the Social Halls as well.
- Capital Campaign will start after the High Holy Days.

REMINDERS – Your High Holy Days tickets will be mailed shortly. If you do not receive them or wish to buy additional tickets, please call the office. Along with your tickets will be your High Holy Days Pledge card. Last year saw record High Holy Days pledges. Please pledge at least what you did last year and slightly more. Last year Julie Littky-Rubin gave a fantastic personal family presentation and pledge request. This year we will have another exciting congregant presentation you will not want to miss.

The Yom Kippur pledge request is one of the 3 times a year we ask for your voluntary financial support (the others are Membership and Spring Drive) – please generously give your support so we can continue to provide all the activities and programming for TBA and the Jewish Community.

Regardless of what Service you choose to attend, for security purposes, you must have a ticket.

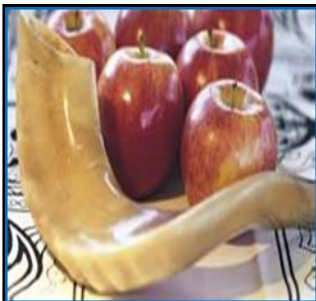
SPECIAL THANK YOU FROM DEBBIE BASEMAN

Children K - 6th Grades

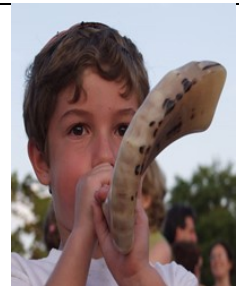

A Season for Life-Learning Skills...



How lucky we are that Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur fall at the beginning of our school year! As our children start fresh in their new grade or class, they relish in their new beginnings and feel the chance to start all over again. It is their opportunity to reflect on a New Year and a new beginning.

Rosh Hashanah combines both solemn and joyful elements. Another name for Rosh Hashanah is Yom Hadin, the Day of Judgment. This is a time when each of us is judged for both good and bad deeds done during the past year. We also celebrate the arrival of a new year and the blessings it will hopefully contain.

Yom Kippur, the day of Atonement, is the holiday that concludes the Days of Awe; a period of ten days that begins at Rosh Hashanah. This is a time for personal introspection and reflection of our behavior.

The book of Jonah is read on the afternoon of Yom Kippur. The story of Jonah includes themes of personal responsibility and repentance. The prophet Jonah after much reluctance goes to the city of Nineveh to tell the people of their impending destruction because of their sins and transgressions. After hearing Jonah's prophecy, the people repent and God forgives them.

The message of this story is empowering. Even small children learn that mistakes can be repaired; that there is always an opportunity to change and that they have this power to heal through forgiving others. How can we share this deep philosophical idea with our children? First we can ask our children, "What have you done wrong in the past?" Also, "Say you're sorry to those you have hurt," and finally, "Ask God to forgive you."

Modeling: The Best Way to Teach

Don't be afraid to share your own feelings with your children, too. By modeling *t'shuvah*, you're not only teaching them a lesson, you are deepening your own relationships. Let your children know when you feel sad or hurt and why. Say, "Mommy's feeling sad today because a friend at work said a mean thing about my project and that hurt my feelings." Knowing how you feel will help them understand how our actions affect others. Try to talk about feelings, happy or sad, angry or mad!

The beginning of the school year is a perfect time to talk about Rosh Hashanah and new beginnings. Things you can do as a family!

1. Write down each of your family's wishes for a sweet year. Read these at the table on Rosh Hashanah.
2. Commit, as a family, to follow the steps of *t'shuvah* by recognizing and saying sorry for wrong behavior, as well as making a vow to not do that again!
3. Follow the customs for the New Year! Eat sweet foods as a symbol of our desire for a sweet year! Dip apples in honey for a sweet year!
4. Attend children's High Holy Days Services so children have the opportunity to hear the shofar and prayers!
5. Attend Tashlich Service at the beach on the afternoon of Rosh Hashanah, as we go to a body of water, say a prayer, and empty our pockets into the ocean to symbolically cast away our sins.

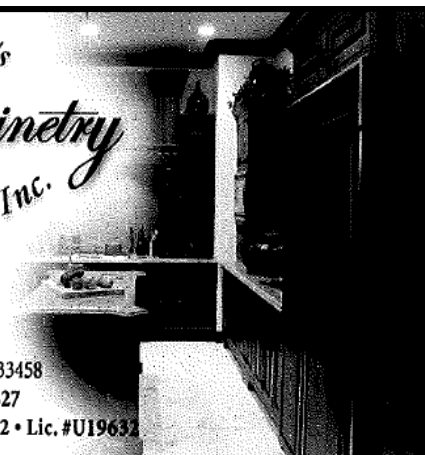
