MARK SLIFKIN, MAN OF THE YEAR

*On Sunday, March 19, Temple Beth Am celebrated **Mark Slifkin** as our **Man of the Year**. I want to take this opportunity to thank Mark publicly for all he has done for us over the years and share with those who could not attend the event the words I used to celebrate, honor, and slightly roast Mark.*

Normally, when 200 people gather at a synagogue to talk about one of their friends, the event is called a funeral. But once a year during our Men's Club's Man of the Year, the honoree is very much alive, sitting among the guests and listening nervously as one person after another gets up to roast him. I remember times when I compassionately looked at the trembling victim, enduring the pain of such sharp and piercing comments that I knew exactly what he was thinking: "Please God, I wish this chair was a casket."

The Man of the Year for 2017 is Mark Slifkin. As tempted as I was to join the parade of roasters, I decided that as a rabbi I cannot do it. I must teach by example how inappropriate it is to shame a friend, so I will be speaking only respectfully and lovingly about my friend Mark. If any of you think that it is only an excuse because I know that no matter how hard I'll try, Hal Baseman (*emcee of the event*) will always be funnier than me and will push the limits of propriety far beyond the point that I can, you are not completely wrong.

No matter what the real reason is, I am here to be the responsible

adult in the room and to defend the honor of Mark Slifkin. I noticed that when people talk about him, there are some problematic phrases that repeat with high frequency. Normally, it is done, according to Jewish tradition—behind his back, so no harm is done. But my fear is that today some of our speakers may decide to mention his attributes to his face, and since he has no sense of humor he may get offended. So I chose to be preemptive and as the first speaker I will present the not-funny, yet accurate and appropriate list of Mark's qualities.

If you hear for example someone calling him a "control freak," you should immediately translate this unsuitable phrase in your brain to "perfectionist." Only a completely ignorant person would confuse Mark's concern with the length of each nail, the diameter of each screw and the exact number that were used per square foot of drywall (and of course, how much they cost) with control. The smart ones among you know very well that God is in the details, and Mark is a true believer.

Some cynics around here may say that Mark spends more time at the Temple than Debbie Baseman because Arline doesn't want him in the house from sunrise to sunset. But of course, they cannot be more wrong; Mark does have a life! And Arline wants to spend every free moment with him, only that we, the people at TBA, need him more and we bring him much greater happiness.

If you hear that Mark is "bossy," it is only because the speaker is not familiar with the more sophisticated concept of "mentorship." Being bossy is when one is fond of giving people orders. But if one does it not for his personal satisfaction, but because he recognizes the full potential in a person and wants to help him reach it—this is mentorship. And Mark is a true mentor for many of us.

If anyone dares to use the word "temper" to describe Mark, you



should see it as a clear sign of ignorance and automatically switch it in your heads to "passion." Mark's mood is as even as the green line in the ICU monitor after the patient dies. But sometimes to make his point clear, and only for our benefit, he has no choice but to fake a temper tantrum. A few times he even fooled me.

If most of your interaction with Mark was around Chidush, you may think that he is "boring." He is not. He is an "engineer."

Calling Mark a "micromanager" is a gross overstatement. He is simply a "detail-oriented manager." Yes, it is true that he has a tendency to tell people exactly how to do their job, even when they have an advanced degree and 40 years of experience, but that's only because he knows better and cares more.

And now after I have provided you with the tools with which to accurately understand the other people's remarks, I would just say that Mark is a true friend, a real leader and the ultimate giver. It is not only the thousands of hours that he has dedicated to TBA. His strong character became evident when he effectively dealt with an enormous amount of frustration, complaints, second-guessing and disappointments thrown at him from all directions. Mark, you are a real smart mensch.

Did you hear about the Jewish woman who always cut the ends of her roast off before she cooked it? Her husband asked her why she wasted so much meat, and she said because that's how her mother always did it. She asked her mother why. Her mother didn't know—she said her mother always cut the ends off the roast, so that's how she learned to do it. The woman eventually asked her grandmother, “Why do we always cut the ends off the roast?” Her grandmother said, “Because I never had a big enough pan.”

As Jews, we value passing on the blessings and teachings of our heritage.

This class will explore the benefits of these blessings as well as implications of new research which indicates that children of holocaust survivors have biological markers for trauma, even though they did not experience the trauma in their own lives. What struggles, idiosyncrasies, and genetic markers might also be passed from generation to generation? We will also consider emerging ways of bringing healing to our lineage.

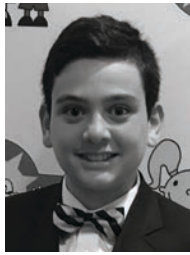

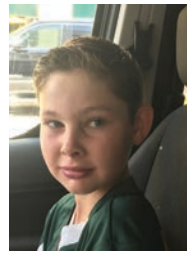

Making the Jewish Holidays Come Alive

This school year, our three and four year olds have been learning about the Jewish holidays in a whole new and most experiential way. Having partnered with the Commission for Jewish Education, our children have a monthly lesson encompassing storytelling, customs and rituals of the holidays.

Led by renowned Jewish Educator and expert storyteller Lorraine Arcas, each lesson begins with a re-telling of each holiday's story. Prior to Lorraine's visit, our children have created something—either a prop to be used or a piece of the scenery that is displayed, so that they have a stake in the story. Then, each child is given a character part to play and a costume to wear. Finally, with Lorraine acting as the narrator, our children are able to see the story unfold through their actions and reactions. By playing the part of someone in the story, each child is able to understand how that person fit into the story and had an impact on the lesson to be learned.

**School Success Workshop
with Dr. Myles Cooley**

Thank you to Dr. Myles Cooley for presenting our final Parent Education workshop of this school year. His seminar on What Predicts School Success offered many areas of research with children that identified characteristics which help forecast academic success. Dr. Cooley discussed the profound effect developing will power & self-discipline can have on our children. By giving children tools to enhance their emotional regulation and ever changing growth mindset, they have greater prospects to handle frustration and increase their problem solving skills.

In this day, we often set expectations with our children that they find hard to live up to. One example of this is continuously telling them they are smart. We focus on the product instead of the process. In order for children to believe that they are capable of achieving more, parents & educators can try using phrases such as "You worked really hard on that" instead of "Good job." When it comes to times of failure it is important that we emphasize the process of problem solving rather than the outcome of the event. A go to phrase could be "What do we need to solve this a different way" rather than "That was hard." Utilizing such techniques can aid in developing the growth mind set in children, which can only build perseverance, resilience and the inner sense to not give up, which supports future academic and lifelong success.

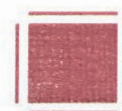

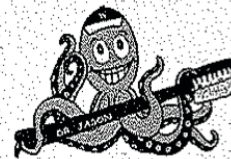
