SOLIDARITY IN TIMES OF RACISM

On February 21, three weeks before a man murdered eight people in Atlanta, six of whom were Asian women, Bekkah Scharf, a Jewish Asian American woman, published an article in Lilith Magazine titled "Where are the Jews?" In response to a sharp rise in hate crimes against Asian American/ Pacific Islanders (AAPI) in the Bay area, the community organized an interfaith vigil and solidarity rally in Oakland's Chinatown. Bekkah immediately decided to attend. She called people and made several signs on which she wrote, "Asian Jews Say ______.". Bekkah intended to hand out the signs to her fellow Jews so they could fill in the blank for themselves, however:

"After an Huichin-Ohlone land acknowledgment from a local indigenous leader, city council members and community leaders spoke about their work and visions for true public safety. Black community leaders voiced allyship and solidarity with the Asian community. There were several pastors present, a visibly Muslim speaker, and a sizable group of young Muslims holding signs in

solidarity. I was proud to show up for my AAPI community with other Asian Jews. I gladly spotted one Asian and Ashkenazi family from my synagogue at the event. However, a question kept crossing my mind: Where are the Jews?"

We don't have a Chinatown or Little Saigon in our back yard, but it doesn't mean that we are free to be oblivious to racist and xenophobic incidents directed at AAPIs in our country. We, Jews, more than any other group in the world know what it is to be the object of hate, and therefore we must stand with any community that experiences racism. When it comes to anti-Asian hatred in the U.S., we, Jews, have a lot in common with them.

Racists typically punch down at their subjects of hate, as they perceive them as inferior, unintelligent, and lazy. But when it comes to the Jews, the punching is "up" since the Jews are perceived as being smarter than they are and as harder workers. The reason for hating us is that we use our skills and intelligence in a cunning and manipulative way to exploit and rob off the communities in which we live to benefit only ourselves and other Jews around the world. Members of the AAPI community, too, are perceived as smart (unless they are perceived as sex objects). They are all math geniuses who steal our kids' places at the Ivy League schools. They, like the Jews, don't benefit their communities in America.

When disagreeing with Israel's actions, the anti-Semite holds all the Jews around the world accountable, and therefore all Jews deserve to be punished. The anti-Asian doesn't bother to recognize the diversity within the AAPI community. For him they are all Chinese, even though many come from countries that are oppressed by China. And since China's relationship with the U.S. is tense, and especially in the past year as China is blamed for COVID-19, all the Asians in America must pay.

During the Passover Seder we recite from the Haggadah, "In each and every generation, a person must see themselves as if they personally left Egypt." It is not only a sentiment about our unbroken link to our oppressed ancestors, but also a reminder of our obligation to empathize and support anyone who stands today in the dark place that we stood in so many times before and extend our hands to pull them out.

Happy Passover.

A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

That's how it works: Two networks crash, and out of the ensuing clashes, conflicts, congruences, you spin off new things. So creativity is very rarely inventing something new out of whole cloth; it's using two or more old things to create new combinations. The theory of why Jews are so accomplished has to do with them living in what one historian calls 'verges'—spots where different cultures come together, whether it's Jerusalem, Istanbul, Baghdad, or New York, places with

a lot of traders, a lot of coming and going, where ideas are clashing. And then as Jews we have our own experience of our minority culture clashing with whatever majority culture we're living in. That gives us the ideal space for new things to come in."

Our congregation is a prime example of David's theory. As the pandemic continues to evolve and safety measures change, how are we going to mark this time in our spiritual lives? For TBA, we are going to continue to be creative. The clergy, professionals, and members of the Board of Directors are going to flip some stories on their heads and keep others. We are going to try our best to deal with what's ahead with thoughtfulness. As you see new initiatives emerge, please tell us how you would like to be involved. I am hopeful that our creativity will lead us to new ideas and even more opportunities for new members to become engaged with the spiritual home we call Temple Beth Am.



THE ONE SCHOOL NEWS FOR APRIL

MORE THAN ONE KIND OF SMART

"He has a low IQ."

"She's very bright."

"Will my child test for a gifted program?"

Sometimes we tend to talk as though intelligence were a single commodity that people have in greater or lesser supply. Yet we see all around us adults and children who are very smart in math but not at all good with words, musically gifted but klutzy on the athletic field, and so on. Most of us, in fact, struggle with some tasks and sail through others.

Fortunately, educators are knowledgeable about the variety in individuals' "intelligences"—

the modes we use to interact with the world, thanks to the work of psychologist Howard Gardner. Seven of these intelligences are described by Gardner.

Children with a musical intelligence have a natural ear for melody, rhythm, and other musical elements; spatially oriented children enjoy reading maps and exploring how mechanical devices work. Other children are more at home using their linguistic aptitudes—telling stories, playing with words, and reciting tongue twisters. Strong logical mathematical intelligence shows up not only in math aptitude but in the enjoyment of games and problems requiring logic and reasoning. Children who learn best when they are moving and handling things rely on their **bodily kinesthetic**

intelligence. An affinity for the natural world and its creatures stands out in children with a **naturalistic** mode of intelligence. Finally, children who make friends easily and have plenty of "street smarts" are **interpersonal** naturals, while quiet thinkers and strong willed debaters shine in the more internal, reflective **interpersonal** mode.


All of us have preferred modes of intellectual functioning. At the same time, we need to use each of the modes in one situation or another. Recognizing the various ways that children think and learn, The One School teachers help children in both to use their individual strengths and to become more adept in learning modes that are not their strong point.

Thanks to all of you who attended last month's Book Club. We had a wonderful discussion of Colum McCann's *Apeirogon* at our most recent meeting of Book Club.

Our next meeting (via Zoom) will be on Monday, April 5 at 10:30am. At that time, we will discuss THE TEA GIRL OF HUMMINGBIRD LANE by Lisa See.



Li-yan and her family align their lives around the seasons and the farming of tea. There is ritual and routine, and it has been ever thus for generations. Then one day a jeep appears at the village gate—the first automobile any of them have seen—and a stranger arrives.

In this remote Yunnan village, the stranger finds the rare tea he has been seeking and a reticent Akha people. In her biggest seller, Snow Flower and the Secret Fan, See introduced the Yao people to her readers. Here she shares the customs of another Chinese ethnic minority, the Akha, whose world will soon change. Li-yan, one of the few educated girls on her mountain, translates for the stranger and is among the first to reject the rules that have shaped her existence. When she has a baby outside of wedlock, rather

than stand by tradition, she wraps her daughter in a blanket, with a tea cake hidden in her swaddling, and abandons her in the nearest city.

After mother and daughter have gone their separate ways, Li-yan slowly emerges from the security and insularity of her village to encounter modern life while Haley grows up a privileged and well-loved California girl. Despite Haley's happy home life, she wonders about her origins; and Li-yan longs for her lost daughter. They both search for and find answers in the tea that has shaped their family's destiny for generations.


