AS SIMPLE AS GOOD VERSUS BAD?

At one point I had to make peace with the realization that while my to-read list is constantly expanding, my reading time is shrinking. The summer is the only time when the pile of books (in my case a virtual one since I use a Kindle) is declining. Normally, when I finish a book I immediately start a new one, but occasionally it feels wrong if not disrespectful. Some books require a day or two to take in, and to use their wisdom to reflect on my own life. With those kind of books, the act of reading is like the data collection phase that awaits the analysis and contemplation at the end.

This summer it was Little Fires *Everywhere* by Celeste Ng. The book provided me with deep insights into the issues of parenthood, social class, race, art, and the struggle of choosing the proper life's path. But what affected me the most was the realization that none of the main characters are either good or bad. They were all lying, manipulating, betraying friends, and reneging on promises while always motivated by the sincere conviction to do the right thing. And yet I found myself strongly associating with some of them, easily explaining away their

immoral acts, while hating others, rendering their licentious behavior as pure evil. They were often facing the struggle we are all familiar with of choosing not between right and wrong but between two rights. Nonetheless, I created in my head two teams, mine was good and should be forgiven for their faults, and the others, of course, were incapable of doing good.

I fell even deeper into the hole of moral discomfort when I realized that if I had been in the situations described in the book, most likely I would have acted like the characters I disliked and not like those I favored.

This message is immensely important today when our discourse has become so black and white, binary, clearly divided between good and evil, us and them, Trump and Obama, Fox News and MSNBC, that we so often miss out on a large spectrum of colors and shades.

"One had followed the rules, and one had not. But the problem with rules was that they implied a right way and a wrong way to do things. When, in fact, most of the time they were simply ways, none of them quite wrong or quite right, and nothing to tell you for sure what side of the line you stood on."

As readers of the Torah we are used to taking sides. We side with Jacob and not with Esau because we are on his team. He is our patriarch, and the one whose name

was changed to Israel, the name of our people and our state. But it is important for the Torah to tell us that it was Jacob who deceived his blind father, Isaac, and stole from his brother, while Esau was the most loving and loyal son. This complexity characterizes most conflicts in our bible, Isaac and Ishmael, Sarah and Hagar, David and Saul, because even God is criticized by Abraham, Moses and many others for being wrong.

"In Pauline and Mal's house, nothing was simple. In her parents' house, things had been good or bad, right or wrong, useful or wasteful. There had been nothing in between. Here, she found, everything had nuance; everything had an unrevealed side or unexplored depths. Everything was worth looking at more closely."

This is exactly what we should start doing with the approach of the High Holy Days, looking at everything, ourselves and the world around us, more closely, and even better, more compassionately.

A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Last year when Rabbi and Gali announced the Temple trip to Israel, I jumped at the chance. I had been leery of going on group trips in the past, but knowing Rabbi and Gali would be a large part of leading the tour, and that the guides they chose would be among the best, I knew we were in good hands.

For me, our tour of Israel really started at an overlook of Jerusalem. Just a couple hours before we met our tour guide Lana, we had learned about some of the history of Israel on our bus from Ben Gurion Airport to our hotel to pick up others who flew in earlier. At this overlook we could see a large portion of Jerusalem, directly across was the oldest Jewish Cemetery, to the left was the Old City, and to the right was the West Bank, which is attached to the eastern portion of the city just miles away from where we were starting the tour. The next thing I remember was walking through the old city to the Western Wall, which I have heard about and have seen pictures of all my life. Then, I realized that I really was in the homeland of our people and was a little overcome by all of this, since I had waited 58 years to finally make this trip. For the next

few days we toured the Old City, various local markets, and listened to scholar **Paul Liptz** of Tel Aviv University and the Hebrew Union College. I remember thinking the hour-and-a-half talk could have gone on for hours because he was such a wonderful educator. We toured the Western Wall Tunnels and got to see Leah's Balcony, where women can pray at the most holy place, which was dedicated by Temple members Leah and **Ed Frankel**. We spent about three hours at the Yad Vashem World Holocaust Remembrance Center led by our tour guide on this sobering walk through our people's worst times. Though I had been to the Holocaust Museum in Washington, I will admit I was quite shaken by Yad Vashem and how well things were explained in words, pictures, and artifacts.

On the day we went to Masada, we had the option to leave at a reasonable hour and take the cable car, or leave at 3:45am to walk up the snake trails to the top. I chose the early option, and along with our group, we made our way up. We then swam in the Dead Sea (floated, really).

We started each morning with the most amazing buffet breakfasts with what seemed to be over a hundred foods and ate our way through Israel with some of the most amazing cuisine.

Earlier in the year, Temple Beth Am members **Michael and Kathy Azeez** brought speakers in from an organization called Yemin Orde, with which they are involved in Israel. Many of you attended this lecture at the synagogue. We were lucky enough to have the opportunity to visit their **Youth Village**, one of Israel's most innovative educational institutions, specializing in integrating new immigrant youth into Israeli society. This was really one of the highlights of our trips.

We toured the rest of the country to the North where we saw in Upper Galilee how close Israel is to Syria and Lebanon. Tzfat, Acre, Caesarea, Tel Aviv, an archeological dig in caves, the historic bullet factory, I could go on for hours about everything we saw and did, but you can ask anyone in the group and we will tell you.

I left Israel with a better understanding of the history of our people, and a love of the country, yearning to come back soon. I want to thank Rabbi Alon and Gali for organizing the trip and making it such a wonderful experience. When you travel with such a great group of people on such an impactful trip, and share the Israel experience together, I think you develop a special bond. To all the people I traveled with, and the new friendships I made during the two weeks, I send a heartfelt thank you, and highly recommend this trip to anyone considering visiting Israel.

SISTERHOOD SCOOP

You just might want to continue your July 4th Independence celebration to August 2. While we celebrate our country's independence from England on July 4, that date was just one significant date during that famous revolutionary summer. A resolution for Independence was made by Virginia delegate Richard Henry Lee (yes, a later relative of his would be the Confederate General Robert E. Lee) in June 1776, and unanimously accepted on July 2. That resolution was then adopted by the Second Continental Congress on July 4, and a final draft of the Declaration of Independence was sent to a local printer, John Dunlop. Broadsides were printed as well as an embossed copy of the Declaration. At that point, only John Hancock's name as a delegate and President of the Continental Congress was on the copy. It was not until August 2, 1776, that a majority of the delegates from the 13 newly proclaimed states, signed the Declaration.

The original handwritten Declaration of Independence adopted on July 4 is lost to history, perhaps unceremoniously, thrown away by the printer once printed. It is the embossed printed copy that was signed on August 2. (The remaining signers put their signatures to the document soon after.) It is this document that you will see in the

National Archives. Now you have the rest of the story.



Myles enjoys spending time with friends and family and is frequently found binge-watching shows on Netflix.



Ready to Learn at School: Family Fun Facts and Setting Up Routines

Summer camps, vacations, and laidback lifestyles may have thrown a curve ball to our school habits, but finding ways to return to more solid, everyday routines doesn't have to be a daunting task for parents or children.

In Hebrew, the word for family is *Mishpacha*. The value of family support highly influences a child's positive day at school. The following fun family facts are from the Harvard Family Research Project.

Did you know?

- Children who eat dinner around the table with their families do better in school.
- Children who take family trips do better in school. Simple, free trips to the park, beach, or library are as good as expensive trips away from home.
- Children who are read to frequently read earlier and better.
- Children who see their parents read regularly are likely to read more themselves.

 Spending 30 minutes of quality time a day with your child can help them to achieve better success or grades at school.

You may also like to consider the routines below to make your child feel more...

- Relaxed. Music can help your child avoid the morning rush. Play music that is soothing and familiar to your child. Ask him/her to accomplish a morning task(s) by the time playing time is over.
- Energized. The morning struggle is not a time to skip a good breakfast. Healthy breakfast choices increase concentration levels.
- Connected. Talking about the school day lets your child know you care. Ask your child to share a good thing that happened during the day. Also, ask specific questions, such as "What colors did you like in your art or play activities?"
- **Prepared.** Being prepared for the next school day is less stressful for everyone in the family and a positive start to the day.

• Rested. A set bedtime helps children fall asleep more quickly. Bedtime routines 15 minutes prior to bedtime to read, chat, and/or make up stories is a wonderful family bonding time to end a day.

We should also remember that a feeling of spirituality provides a calming and stress-free environment for families at home and at school. The celebration of Shabbat on a weekly basis reminds our children that there is an appropriate time to slow our lives down and to rest our bodies and our minds. It is our weekly day of rest, a reminder that after having created the world, God rested and looked around to see how good it was. For us, it is also a time for our One Schoolers to feel the spirit of their school environment and to know that it is good.

For me, the routine that will make my day a positive one is to greet many of you each morning upon your arrival at The One School!




