ANTI-SEMITISM VS. OUR REAL AMERICA

A few weeks ago, I officiated at the funeral of an 84-year-old man, Sigmund Rotenberg. Sigmund had the unfortunate luck to be born in 1934 in Berlin to a Jewish family. When he was eight, his parents did the unthinkable, ultimate, selfless act of bringing him and his older brother, Wolfgang, to a church in Belgium, asking the priest to take care of their children until they could come back to collect them when things calmed down. They never did.

The priest, Father Celis, knew that by saying yes to the request of the Rotenbergs, he was seriously risking his own life, but it didn't stop him and his housekeeper, Marie Tabruyn, from taking the boys in and raising them as their own.

They changed the boys' names and taught them how to live and pray like devout Catholics, but every morning the priest insisted that they recite their Hebrew prayers so they would not forget that they were Jewish. In a testimony that Sigmund taped before his death he said that he never felt so Jewish in his life as he did while living in the church.

A little over a year ago, as I was watching the hate-laden people marching with swastikas and torches outside of a synagogue in Charlottesville, SC, chanting Nazi lines, I had a disturbing feeling that perhaps we, American Jews, are reacting in a similar way to that of our European brothers and sisters in the early 20th century, convincing ourselves that "this too shall pass."

Today, as our people bury the 11 victims of the Tree of Life Synagogue Massacre, we know that things just got worse.

On November 9, we commemorated the 80th anniversary of Kristallnacht, the night of the shattered glass, when 267 synagogues were destroyed, 96 Jews were murdered, 30,000 Jews were incarcerated, and thousands of Jewish businesses and schools were torched.

Is this going to be our future?

I want to shout, "No way!" but can we honestly do that, knowing that since Charlottesville, there has been an increase of more than 50% in anti-semitic incidents in our country? And this is not just a number—many of our kids feel it in their schools.

Can I honestly say, "No way!" when in the first 24 hours after the killing in Pittsburgh, on Instagram alone, 12,000 anti-semitic posts were displayed, including hashtags #Jewsdid911 and other hashtags using the number 88, an abbreviated version of "Heil Hitler?"

But do I have some good news? Yes I do. Our Jewish anthem is Hatikvah, "The Hope".

During the Holocaust there were thousands of individuals like Fr. Celis, who were willing to give up their lives to save Jews, but there were hardly any communities that had the strength to stand up to the Nazis saying, "enough," "this is not okay," and "we will not tolerate it."

But here, in America of the 21st century, there are thousands of those communities, and we are blessed to be among them.

We are a community showing the world what the real America is, as we stand together against hate.

Our real America is the America of the police officers who ran straight into the line of fire to save as many worshipers as they could.

Our real America is the one that sent money and other resources to the Jewish community in Pittsburgh to help them to rebuild what hate destroyed. The Muslim community alone, which endures its own share of hate, raised over \$150,000.

Our real America is the country of Master Sgt. Roddie Edmonds, who, when he was ordered by the Nazi officer at the POW Camp to separate the Jewish American soldiers so they would be sent to the death camp, ordered more than 1,000 of his captive soldiers to step forward with him as he pronounced, "We are all Jews".

If there is one thing we need to learn from history, it is that when Jews are attacked, other groups will soon fall victim to hatred. And it also works in reverse, when others are hated—be it African-Americans, Muslims, LGBTQ, immigrants—the hatred will surely find its way against the Jews.

My friends, we live in the greatest country with the greatest people. But as a few drops of ink muddle a pool of pure water, a small group of

Now you might think that after all of this preparation, and having completed her big day, she might be thinking that it's time to take a break from Temple. But thanks to the relationship that she developed with the person who was her mentor throughout this process, she looks forward to continuing and staying involved in the Temple. This makes me so happy and I send a great big thank you to Marcy Morris for teaching, inspiring, and setting such an amazing example that has encouraged Maddie to want to continue. As we watched her dancing with her friends after the pressure of the Service had passed, I began to recollect every time we went through the negotiations of just how long practice would be for that particular day. I can only imagine that each

child who works with Brett or Marcy, and Rabbi Alon, and undoubtedly goes on to blow us away leading their Service, that the confidence they gain will help them in innumerable ways not only as they move into their teen years but into adulthood and beyond.

I believe the significance of this day in each child's life cannot be overstated. Yes, bubala, there is a Chanukah Mensch! He visits all nice Jewish children around the world on Erev Chanukah and leaves lots of toys and socks. The Chanukah Mensch arrives at Jewish homes through the front door. Long ago, he decided that he need not make a dramatic entrance like his friend from the North Pole. Parents prepare for the Chanukah Mensch's arrival by sweeping the front walkway of snow or palm leaves so that he can swiftly come and go without falling.

So, as is tradition, parents leave the front door ajar, put a glass of hot tea (maybe some sugar cubes) and rugelach near the Chanukah Menorah, and retire to bed. 





THE ONE SCHOOL NEWS FOR DECEMBER

Thanksgiving and Chanukah have many themes in common, but the most significant one is the importance of gratitude in our lives. This is the season to be grateful, to learn and teach about the importance of gratitude. Researchers in the relatively new field of gratitude studies are finding that thankfulness can indeed be nurtured and taught. Further, there appears to be plenty of compelling reasons to help a child along in the count-your-blessings department. Being appreciative and thankful for what we have and what others do for us are values most parents want their children to develop as they grow.

Gratitude isn't just a lesson to be taught to children, but also an ongoing exercise in learning for parents. Children need role models for positive behavior. As we experience the eight days of Chanukah, how can we make sure that our children appreciate and are thankful for what they have?

Keep gifts reasonable: As tempting as it is to shower or allow others to shower your children with gifts, there are two important reasons not to. First, as children grow, it can be challenging to teach gratitude if they receive everything they ask for. Also, lots of gifts overwhelm small children. Children will play with and appreciate fewer gifts more.

Serve others: Service can be part of a child's life from a young age. Get young kids involved in decorating thank you notes, baking cookies for a friend, or donating belongings to

less fortunate children. Point out how good it feels to make someone else's day brighter.

Teach thankful words: Prompt children to use thankful words, but more importantly, polite words. Children are sometimes encouraged to say please and thank you without politeness. Politeness is being conscious of other people and using your voice and actions to convey respect for them. Please and thank you mean so much more when said with a kind voice.

Start a family tradition: Make gratitude a habit. If your family's tradition is to give your children gifts each night, set aside one night as a night to give to others. Go to a toy store together and pick out a toy to donate to a local drive.

Add prayers of gratitude to our

lives: Since food is symbolic of plenty and well-being, this is also the time to encourage your child to give thanks for what he has at meal time, especially at your Chanukah dinners. A simple prayer like the Hamotzi, or a sentence expressed about how they are thankful, can help children express gratefulness.

Help us spread kindness in our garden. Come to Kids' Shabbat in the Garden on December 14 and paint kindness rocks for our garden. See page 15 for details.
