# DISAGREEMENTS VS. DEALBREAKERS

It is not unusual for me to work together with people with whom I disagree on a variety of issues in order to promote a common goal. I learned long ago that if I'm looking for political candidates, organizations, or movements that perfectly reflect my opinions and beliefs, I would never be able to vote, write a check, or participate in any political, social, religious, or charitable event. I normally live by the principle that if we agree on 75 percent of the issues, then we can work together.

So why was it that, when I read in *The New York Times* that, "Smaller Crowds Turn Out for Third Annual Women's March Events", I wasn't really unhappy? Why don't I support The Women's March when, in fact, I agree with most of what it stands for, from abolishing gender inequity to promoting

anti-discrimination protections for lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender Americans?

When it comes to any kind of relationship, we need to be able to distinguish between disagreements and dealbreakers. We can work out disagreements, or respectfully agree to disagree, but sometimes we must choose to step away from the relationship. And this, for me, is the case of The Women's March.

Linda Sarsour, co-chair of the Women's March, tweeted that "Nothing is creepier than Zionism", echoing the groundless and vicious view equating Zionism to racism. This opinion is not simply a criticism of Israel, which is legitimate, but a clear anti-Zionist sentiment with which I cannot find any common ground.

Tamika Mallory, another co-chair of The March, posted a photo on Instagram of herself and Louis Farrakhan, one of the biggest antisemites and homophobes in our country, calling him the "GOAT" which stands for "Greatest Of All Time". Not just Jews, but anyone who cares for truth and justice, must disassociate themselves from any organization headed by

a person who is an admirer of a man who calls us "Satanic Jews", and blames us for having "infected the whole world with poison and deceit." He goes as far as calling Jews "termites", a term taken from Nazi propaganda.

I'm writing these words on Martin Luther King Day, as I'm reminded of the overwhelming support the American-Jewish community gave to the Civil Rights Movement. Our commitment to being champions of social justice has not diminished since the 1960s. But when organizations like The Women's March demand of us to strip ourselves of our Jewish identity and denounce our love for Israel, we ought to sever the relationships with them and find other venues to fight for the same values we've maintained for over three millennia.

# A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

For Temple leaders, the word "retention" is always something we are interested in learning more about, both within our synagogue, and for Judaism as a whole. I was reading about the different movements within the Jewish community and realized a common theme amongst them all seems to be conservation—conservation of the values and traditions that comprise Judaism and carried it through countless generations. Now, what conservation means specifically to each of us can be different. We all practice Judaism in our own ways. Some of us keep kosher, some don't. Some attend Shabbat regularly, some of us go only at High Holy Days. Some of us were brought up in a conservative or orthodox home. and others were brought up Jewish,

but with very little Judaism as part of day-to-day lives. I fall into that latter category. But while I may not have gone to Shabbat Services and I didn't have my Bar Mitzvah until I was in my 50s, my parents somehow instilled Judaism in me. I am the first to admit I am no expert when it comes to all our traditions and the stories of the Torah, and I don't know why we do a lot of the things that we do—I'm ok with that. That is my Judaism. And I, in turn, do my best to pass along my Judaism to my children. And it's not just about "being Jewish", but "doing Jewish".

Many parts of Judasim and how we practice it have remained the same over hundreds, sometimes thousands of years. Other aspects have changed and kept up with the times. That's what I think we do so well here at Temple Beth Am. We strike a balance between maintaining the traditions that are important and relevant, and have sustained us, with a sensible acceptance of the day and age we are in. We are open to and respectful of each person's Judaism. We offer tons of ways to become active, to learn more, to celebrate

together, and this togetherness is what has provided the foundation that has allowed Judaism to continue for longer than so many other civilizations. But as we move into a brave new future with so much access to...well...everything, along with this togetherness, we also have to rely on our own personal practices to sustain us and to pass down to those who will follow us.

In my case I believe my children already know more about, and feel a stronger connection to, Judaism than I did for most of my life. My Judaism was always there, but it wasn't until coming to this Temple that it grew into something much bigger than it had been. I had always "been" Jewish, but now I am also "doing" Jewish. To me, that means always striving for the balance between conservation of the ancient traditions that have carried us through so much, and the modern aspects that keep us up to date with our present and will prepare us for our future.



# THE ONE SCHOOL NEWS FOR FEBRUARY

**Kindness** is defined as the quality of being friendly, generous, and considerate. Affection, gentleness, warmth, concern, and care are words that are associated with kindness. Being kind often requires courage and strength. Kindness is an interpersonal skill. There are different ways to practice kindness. One way to be kind is to open your eyes and be active when you see people in need. Do you notice when someone could use a helping hand? A sense of community is created when people are kind to those in need.

On December 14, we painted kindness rocks for our garden before Kids' Shabbat. Our children explored kind words with their parents, and chose a specific word for their rock. These rocks were placed in our garden. This is an ongoing project that our children at The One School will complete throughout the year.

This experience was the beginning of exploring Jewish values: kindness to others, welcoming guests, and understanding how we can take care of our world.

Again this year, we are proud to receive a grant funded by the Friedman Commission for Jewish Education for use in The One School. To help our children to study the Jewish value of welcoming guests, *Hachnasat Orchim*, (hospitality of guests), Lorraine Arcus, Jewish curriculum specialist, worked with our children on January 23 to act out the story in Genesis 18:1-15. Just as Abraham

and Sarah welcomed strangers into their tent, so do we welcome guests to our community.

As part of our grant, we practice service learning. Service learning is defined as a teaching and learning strategy that includes the elements of learner involvement in identifying a community need and involving the community. The nurturance of caring relations in children and adults is an important goal of The One School.

Each year we invite guests to be part of our Thanksgiving celebration. We have now extended this wonderful one-time event into a continuation of service learning by inviting our friends for follow-up visits and to raise money for their classrooms and playground as well.

Again, our friends from the Bentley Child Development Center and Safe Haven Community Resource Center will spend a morning with our children to learn about taking care of our world. Lessons will be centered around nature, trees, and ways to take care of our earth. We are also donating books about these values, with follow-up activities they can do at their school. We will enjoy a lunch together to further our friendships and to fully understand ways to welcome our guests. We are looking for volunteers to be part of this learning experience. We need help with lunch, as well as serving and talking to the children.
