If you made a New Year's resolution, you have kept a tradition that may well have started with the Babylonians some 4,000 years ago. During their New Year celebrations, they made promises to the gods to pay their debts and return borrowed objects. If they kept their word, the gods would favor them for the year; if not, they would fall out of favor with the gods, which was a very bad omen. Their New Year began in mid-March when the crops were planted, and this was not changed until the Roman, Julius Caesar, decided to reform the calendar. The first month was named after the Roman god, Janus, whose spirit inhabited doorways and arches as his two faced image was looking both backward and forward. Romans promised the God, Janus, that they would behave in the new year to gain his favor.

While the early Christians, early Methodists, and some African-American Protestant groups today have New Year Services in which they not only pray but make New Year's resolutions, this practice is mostly secular. Of the approximately 45% of Americans who make resolutions, only about 8% are successful in achieving their

goal. Hopefully, you will be amongst the 8% if you made a New Year's resolution.

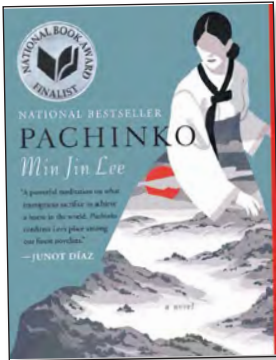

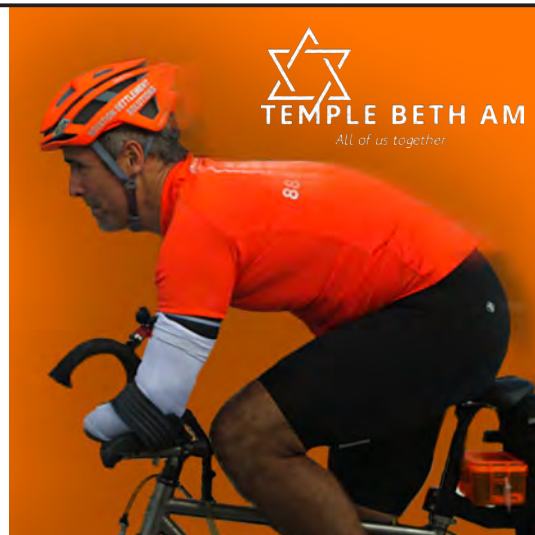

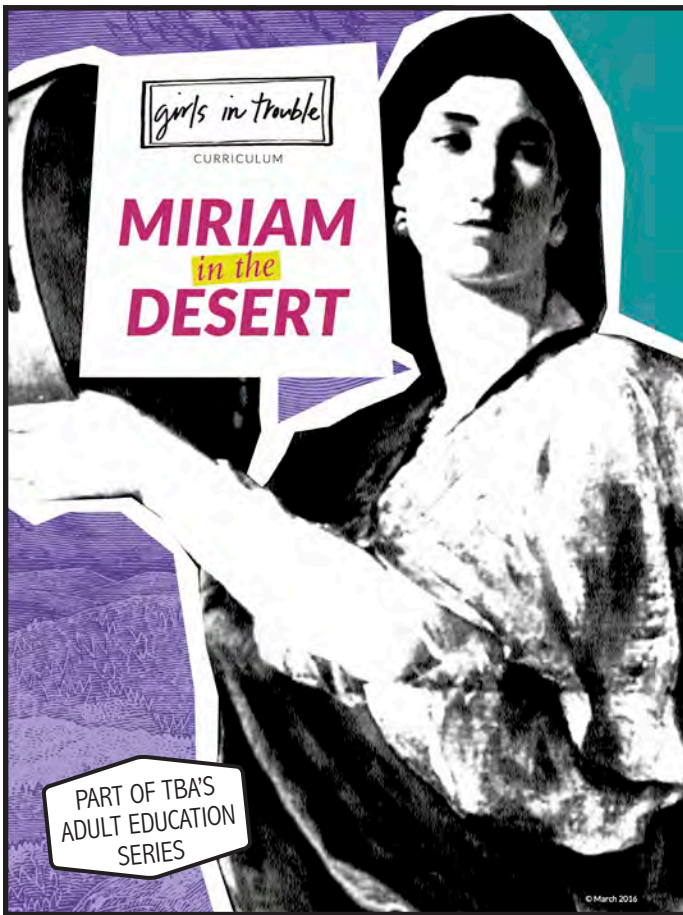

**WHY DO WE
CELEBRATE
TU B'SHEVAT?**

Tu B'shevat or the "New Year of the Trees" is Jewish Arbor Day. The holiday is observed on the 15th (tu) of the Hebrew month of Shevat. Scholars believe that originally **Tu B'shevat** was an agricultural festival, marking the emergence of spring. In the 17th century, Kabbalists created a ritual for **Tu B'shevat** that is similar to a Passover seder. Today, many Jews hold a modern version of the **Tu B'shevat** seder each year. The holiday also has become a tree-planting festival in Israel, in which Israelis and Jews around the world plant trees in honor or in memory of loved ones and friends.
