POLAND AND THE HOLOCAUST

On February 6 of this year, Poland's president signed legislation making it a crime to suggest that Poland bore any responsibility for atrocities committed by Nazi Germany. The law threatens up to three years imprisonment for anyone who "publicly and untruthfully assigns responsibility or co-responsibility to the Polish Nation or the Polish State for Nazi crimes."

Growing up in Israel in the 1970s, not only were my own grandparents Holocaust survivors, but so were many of my friends' parents and grandparents. Some hardly ever talked about their horrific experiences, and some cherished any opportunity to tell their stories. It is not that any of them who are still alive would have cared much. but under the new Polish law most of them would have been subjected to incarceration in a Polish prison should they ever go and visit. "The Poles were worse than the Nazis" was a common phrase uttered by the former Polish Jews. One of the only times I can remember my grandfather being short with me was when I asked him to teach me some words in Polish. "I swore to never say another word in Polish," he said and changed the subject. The irony is that neither

he, nor anyone else I knew, had such a deep level of resentment toward the Germans. Of course, they knew that it was the Germans who murdered their families and destroyed their community. But it seemed that their deep sense of betrayal by the Poles was stronger than their hatred of the Germans.

This is the place to note that there are more Poles on the list of the Righteous Amongst the Nations (non-Jews who risked their lives during the Holocaust to save Jews) than any other nationality. We also have to remember that over 2 million Poles were killed during the war (not including the 3 million Polish Jews). But still, it's impossible to deny that many Poles collaborated with the Nazis because of greed, religion, or self-preservation.

Even prior to World War II, anti-Semitism was a prevalent factor in Polish society, and the government took steps to exclude Jews from key sectors of public life. On the eve of the Holocaust, Polish Jews made up 10 percent of the population (one-third of the residents of the capital city of Warsaw). Some Polish politicians were bothered by what they saw as vast Jewish influence, and pressed for a mass emigration of Poland's Jewish population.

It is true that all the Death Camps on Polish land were built and operated by the Germans, but we also know that as the Germans implemented killing on an immense scale, they drew upon Polish police forces and railroad personnel for logistical support and to guard the ghettos. The Polish Blue Police enforced German anti-Jewish policies such as restrictions on the use of public transportation and curfews, as well as the devastating and bloody liquidation of ghettos in occupied Poland from 1942-1943. There are endless stories of Poles who often helped in the identification and exposure of Jews in hiding. Many Jews who were able to obtain false documents were subjected to systematic blackmail by their Polish neighbors who stripped them of their last possession and forced them to flee for their lives.

There are also well-documented incidents where locals carried out violent riots and murdered their Jewish neighbors. The most infamous episode is the massacre in the town of Jedwabne in the summer of 1941 when hundreds of Jews were burned alive by their Polish neighbors.

My goal in writing this article is not to cause any of you to hate the Poles, but rather to illustrate how important it is to have an honest discussion of the past, and not to bury it under cowardly laws. Poland, which is located between Germany and Russia, had more than its fair share of suffering, and despite that, some Poles sacrificed their lives to save Jews. But unless we learn the entire story's history, good and evil, we will never be able to learn from it and are therefore bound to repeat it.

RECAP: Taking Care of Yourself While Taking Care of Your Children

Led by Dr. Carri Lager, Licensed Clinical Psychologist

Thank you so much to Dr. Carri Lager for presenting a motivating Parent Education Workshop on February 5 on *Taking Care of Yourself While Taking Care of Your Children*. Dr. Lager began by asking all the attendees "What is your happy place & what is your passion?" A common theme in the responses focused on the idea of freedom...or lack thereof as a parent. Our children view us as superheroes, however it is unrealistic to expect parents to truly "do it all". Parenting can often enhance stressful situations and the question we have to ask ourselves is how do we cope & manage this stress? Dr. Lager touched on the warning signs of parent burnout (a state of chronic stress that can lead to physical exhaustion, cynicism, detachment or feelings of ineffectiveness & lack of appreciation) & other common psychological issues that parents face, stressing that the stress we embody is contagious with other members in our family.

"Selfish isn't a dirty word", but how often do you actually put your own needs first? Can you truly take care of others if you don't take care of yourself? Dr. Lager presented techniques to enhance parental self-care, which can aid in the connection between parent and child. Concepts discussed included: Being mindful in the moment and present without judgement; Taking time to breathe and engage your relaxation response (even if only for a minute or two); Making our own sleep, nutrition, and exercise a priority (as we do for our children); Setting realistic expectations for ourselves and what we expect from our little ones.

THE ONE SCHOOL NEWS FOR MARCH

As Jewish early childhood educators, part of our mandate is to teach Jewish values in a developmentally appropriate way. We are blessed with the opportunity to have an impact on children at a very young age. Service learning fits comfortably.

EMPOWERING PROCESS service-learning is defined as a teaching and learning strategy that includes the elements of learner involvement in identifying a community need and involving the community. The nurturance of caring relations in children and adults is an important goal of early childhood professionals.

At The One School, we work using this approach to understand and follow Jewish ethical values.

Every year at The One School, children from Children's Outreach, Inc. are invited to share in our Thanksgiving program and luncheon, sponsored by the Temple, as well as our PTO. We send our guests home with gifts for the children and for their teachers. We also share in a Thanksgiving sing-a-long, where each of our classes and guests sing uplifting Thanksgiving songs. We would like to extend this wonderful one-time event into a continuation of service learning by inviting our friends for subsequent visits and to raise some money for their classrooms and playground as well.

To help our children to study the Jewish value of welcoming guests, or Hachnasat Orchim, (hospitality of guests), Lorraine Arcus, Jewish curriculum specialist, worked with our children to act out the story in Genesis 18:1-15. (See photos on next page) Just as Abraham and Sarah welcomed strangers into their tent, so do we welcome guests to our school community.

On March 7, we will bring our friends from Children's Outreach, Inc. to celebrate and learn with us. As we have an organic garden on our campus, we would like to share our proceeds by making a meal from the garden for our guests. With the help of our children, we would like our guests to visit the garden and see what we grow. We will plant with our guests and read stories about the importance of trees. We will also donate books and games for their classroom, some new and some gently used from our families. Parents, teachers, and children will be involved in this event.

The culmination of this will involve our Shining Stars. We will host a tricycle-athon to raise money for some equipment for their playground. The plan is for our families to sponsor our children as they ride on the playground. For each lap, they will earn money. All classes in the school will participate in this fundraising event in different ways. The school and PTO will match funds to help buy the equipment for our friends.

Teaching Jewish Values Through Early Childhood Books

The Little Red Hen and the Passover Matzah, written by Leslie Kimmelman and illustrated by Paul Meisel.

The story of The Little Red Hen and the Passover Matzah focuses on the following values: *Arevut*, responsibility to others, *Hachnasat Orchim*, welcoming guests, celebrating Pesach (Passover), and eating matzah (unleavened bread).

Our children can continue the understanding of community service by enjoying a book teaching important Jewish values encompassed within the celebration of Passover.

Summary of the Book

The Little Red Hen asks her friends to help her make matzah for the upcoming holiday. The animals had excuses why they could not help. Though the other animals in the book were not acting in a caring manner through much of the story, the Little Red Hen continues to do her work, and in the end, the others learned from all that she modeled. They learned that as members of a community, we are each responsible for the welfare of other community members.

When we welcome guests and practice the Jewish value of Hachnasat Orchim, we go beyond opening a door and saying, "Shalom." We share whole-heartedly. Our ancestors, Abraham and Sarah, modeled this when they kept their tent flaps open and greeted visitors with joy. Though the Little Red Hen struggles with how to greet those who were not helpful to her, in the end she chooses to act in a way that reflects her caring values.

Jews throughout the world celebrate Passover each spring, often inviting family and friends of different faiths and traditions to join them. We are once again reminded of our responsibility to our community and the concept of welcoming guests.






