# THEY ASKED ME, "WHAT DID I LEARN?"

# by Rabbi Brett Tancer



I was recently asked if I'd be willing to go into one of our Religious School classes to answer a series of questions. I received a list of what they were going to ask a little bit ahead of time and quickly read through them. It seems they had a whole lot of questions about becoming a rabbi and what I had to do in order to receive my "smicha", or as we would say in English, what I had to do in order to be ordained.

I arrived in the classroom where I was given a seat of honor in the circle (the seat in question was built for people under the age of four, and so I sat down in a tiny chair and began the process of trying to answer the questions the kids had for me). We went around the circle and each child posed a different question. I have to admit, some of the questions were easier than others. They asked questions about how long I was in school for and whether I liked the people in my class. One question in particular stayed with me though; "What did you learn in school?" I gave them a few different answers all about the different types of classes that I took and the various subjects that we covered. I think they just assumed it was one long class, something like Rabbi 101. Many of them were a bit

surprised when I began rattling off a long list of subjects, none of which had Rabbi in the title. We talked about classes on the Bible and classes that dealt with liturgy, etc. I have to admit though, the question really stuck with me. I looked back over the last five plus years and the 90-100 some odd classes that I took and I really began to ask myself, "What did I learn in school?"

It's a somewhat funny thing trying to boil down all of that material into something tangible that I can explain and point to, and while I looked back and did a mental inventory, class by class, subject by subject, and reflected on the takeaways from each one, that question still burned inside of me. The reality is that so much of what I learned isn't something that I can pinpoint; a lot of it is something that can only be felt. Sure, I learned facts and languages and the traditional Halacha or laws that govern daily life, but I also learned how to listen and how to be there for people during their good times and bad. I spent hours listening to people speak about their lives, their troubles, their pain, and I learned how to be present without inserting myself or my narrative or story into what they were sharing. It's not an easy thing to take the "I" out of a conversation. So often when we talk to each other, we can't help but share our own experiences with them in return. "Something happened to you? You'll never believe what happened to me!" It takes a lot of practice to censor oneself and to just be present.

Another big takeaway for me was that spirituality and prayer is kind of like studying music. Growing up I remember hearing on a regular basis that the way to get to Carnegie Hall is ... practice, practice, practice. I'm not sure that I ever would have compared personal spiritual practice to learning an instrument, but the reality is, they aren't so dissimilar. Both require time, effort, and dedication, both are a little bit scary to start, and both do in fact require practice. Although there's no Carnegie Hall equivalent for an individual's prayer and spiritual life, the end result can be incredibly rewarding.

At the end of the day, what I learned in school could fill months worth of articles, but I think for this month at least, the answer to the question I was asked, if it was posed to me again, would probably go something like this: "The Jewish tradition dates back thousands of years and contains wisdom and depth on more subjects than I can count. For us today, life moves at such a fast pace and we often forget that there are thousands of years worth of teachings that can inspire and guide us even in this modern world of ours. The 'thing' I learned in school was how to navigate those teachings and not only help people to find the relevancy but also, I hope, how to teach and demonstrate how we can incorporate those Jewish nuggets of wisdom into our daily lives."
