HOW IS TEMPLE BETH AM DOING?

The most common question I am asked lately is, "How is the Temple doing?", which translates to, "Do we have enough cash to pay our bills?" The unequivocal answer is "yes". We are still strong and have the means with which to live up to our mission to provide our members and the larger community with the highest quality and most spiritual and creative way to live Jewish life. But, you need to know that the pandemic hurt us. A few days ago I gave a message to the board that I would like to share with you:

The past decade and a half were usually good for TBA financially. In most years, at the October board meeting (after closing the books of the previous year), we learned that we ended up with a modest surplus and received a cautiously positive projection for the existing year. The board responsibly and wisely transferred the surplus to a collection of rainy-day funds, such as Capital Replacement and Operating Reserve.

Today, unfortunately, we are not going to give you the same kind of a report. This is our rainy day. It is true that, against all odds, we ended the year 2019-2020 with a surplus, but the projection for 2020-2021 is unsurprisingly gloomy.

There are two main reasons for our current predicament. First, because of the pandemic we ended up with significantly less children in The One School than we had originally projected. When we prepared the budget, before COVID-19, not only was the school full, but we also had a long waitlist of families hoping to send their kids to our excellent school. Unfortunately, we started this school year in August with 30% fewer students. Since then, more children have enrolled, but we are still far from our target number.

Secondly, some TBA members decided to take a "year off". Not having in-person High Holy Days Services and starting Religious School virtually caused some families not to join this year.

We will be having a long discussion about what we have already done in response to the situation and the steps we would be taking in the future. But I want to start such conversations by emphasizing three things we must avoid:

1. *Panic*. The main reason not to panic is that no one makes a sensible decision when being in this state. We know that we have to work harder while at the same time cutting our expenses, but I have no doubt that the staff and leadership of TBA have what it takes to overcome this challenge.

- 2. Being too calm. "The good Lord will provide" is not the right strategy right now. We must understand the magnitude of the challenge and be aware that it may take more than one year until it is fully met.
- 3. Wasting the opportunity. Just trying to go back to where we were before COVID is not good enough. For many years, we have been experiencing a shift in all aspects of Jewish life in America and we were among the first congregations to adapt. The pandemic accelerated these changes, but it also cleared the path to identifying new opportunities and to envision ways to celebrate Jewish life like we have never seen before.

In the early stages of the pandemic, I attended a class in which the instructor challenged us to think deeply about what kind of ancestors we want to be. I never thought of myself as an ancestor before. I thought of myself as a father, and one day, I hope, a grandfather, but never as an ancestor. So, it took me a while to come up with an answer. What would make us ancestors is our ability to successfully solve the problem of the present time, while laying the foundations for a better future. This is our time to do so. and I encourage each and every one of you to take this opportunity and think and act in a different way to the unique challenge that we are facing.

"LET THERE BE LIGHT" IN THE DARKNESS

I was thinking this week about Havdallah, the ritual that we perform at the end of Shabbat each week. I thought of several from my time in rabbinic school, I thought of a few in Israel, and I thought of the countless hours I spent working on and leading Havdallah at various summer camps throughout the years.

The word Havdallah means division, from the word to separate in Hebrew, *l'havdil*. The ceremony is one of my favorites for many reasons. We use all of our senses tasting wine, smelling the spices, feeling the warmth of the flame from the candle, seeing its reflection in our fingertips, and finally hearing that sound, that tsssssss as the candle is extinguished in the wine. I love this act of marking the end of one thing and the beginning of something new, and it makes sense that I am particularly drawn to it at this time of year.

Last week marked Simchat Torah, when our cycle of reading from the Torah ended and began again; where we read the end of the book of d'varim (or Deuteronomy) and then immediately from Genesis (or in Hebrew, b'reishit), which means in the (a) beginning. The word for separation or dividing appears several times in the story of creation. The first verb in the Torah is "to create" as in, "God created the heavens and the earth." Not long after God makes a havdil, a separation between light and darkness, making day and night. There's a separation between the heavens and the earth, the waters above from the waters below, land and sea, and then...well, and then we don't hear a whole lot from the verb "separate" for a long time. It's not until the book of Leviticus that the word re-emerges, only now, not as a separation between good and bad or the darkness and the light, but a separation between what is holy and what is not (profane).

We are now entering into the darker time of the year as the seasons move from summer to fall and into winter before spinning us back into the renewal of spring, both in growth as well as light. Just as in the creation story, God looked at the light and saw that it was good. I know many of you can relate that darkness and this time of year brings with it a slight foreboding. As we grow up we do our best to remind ourselves that all manner of spookiness and things that go bump in the night are not ideas grounded in fact and yet, we still prefer to turn the lights on when we go hunting for a midnight snack.

I suggest that this year in particular, we could all use a little extra light, as even in south Florida, it feels a little cooler and a little darker. When during Havdallah we look at the reflection of the light in our fingertips, it is not just for the sight of it, it is also to try and carry some of Shabbat into the coming week. As the weather changes and the days shorten, it is my hope to carry some of the light from the holy days with us.

May we all be blessed with a little more light, a little more hope, a little more joy, and I wish, whether people can see it behind our masks or not, a lot more opportunities to smile.

WHO KNOWS ONE?

I have always loved a good game of Jewish geography. Whenever anyone tells me where they grew up, what camp they went to, or their temple youth group, I must ask, "Hey, do you know...?"

This past week, I started watching an online game show called "Who Knows One?" with 300 other Jewish peers on Facebook. The game's tagline is "It's not who you know. It's who (who you know) knows."

Here's a quick rundown on how it's played. There are two contestants who have to find a Jewish connection to a random person (the chosen one) with some simple facts. The contestants are given their name, age, and current city, then as the game goes on they get other hints like what summer camp they went to, their home city, synagogue, and youth group. The contestants call on friends in their contacts (known as connectors) and

find out who may know the mystery contestant, then that person can contact someone else. It's "6 degrees of kosher bacon!" And when the mystery guest enters the Zoom room, whichever contestant connected to them wins!

I have no idea how I ended up sitting for over an hour each week watching people call other people trying to play the ultimate game of Jewish geography. They have been playing since early in the summer as a way to connect those who were grieving the loss of their summer homes and missing their camp, religious school, youth group friends, etc.

I felt like a giddy teenager watching it because I loved seeing and hearing familiar names and chatting with old friends. The best was watching people call Rabbis and colleagues they haven't spoken to in years, and—no questions asked—

they pop right on to connect them to the chosen one. Many of them are watching along too and put on old camp or youth group shirts, making it even more interesting. And secretly I am hoping I get a text with a random Zoom link to play along!

I always want to express the importance of Jewish community and youth groups and why we do what we do to our families. It can be hard to articulate how religious school, youth groups, and camp influences your future, but when I watch Who Knows One?, it reinforces one of the most important things I've gotten out of those experiences—community. I reflect back on my own journey while watching a game show of Jewish geography, missing my old friends but also excited to connect with them in other, new ways.

"The Importance of the Navy Seal in Protecting Our Country"

Lieutenant Commander Hector Delgado is a retired US Navy SEAL, with 29 years of active and reserve service. His tours of duty have included the Middle East, Europe, Africa, and South America. PARENT AS EDUCATORS IN THE YEAR 2020

Last January, many of us toasted to what we thought was going to be a good year and the sound of "2020" seemed upbeat. Little did we know that the world would be enduring an unkind pandemic that would bring taxing and unfamiliar challenges. Parents creatively transformed areas of their homes into offices and classrooms. Despite the efforts of online curriculum, parent involvement in their children's education was inevitable. The good news is that there were and still are silver linings to parent involvement in educating their children.

When parents are involved in their children's education, both children and parents are likely to benefit. Researchers report that parent participation in their children's schooling frequently:

- Enhances children's self-esteem
- Improves children's academic achievement

- Improves parent-child relationships
- Helps parents develop a better understanding of the schooling process

The One School values the triad of communication between the home. school, and child that we share. Communicating through our Bright Wheel app, emails, and phone conversations bridges the home and school with ongoing interaction. This is particularly important as we adjust to the COVID-19 health and safety protocols of parents not being able to be within the school building and limited conversations at carlines. There are many ways that we can team together as educators and support your children to do well in school.

Ask your child about their school day. Keep informed of the class's planned events so you can ask specific questions rather than general questions that result in oneword responses. Sometimes telling your children a little something

about your own day starts the conversation ball rolling. Your child may get the idea of sharing news and feelings about his or her day.

Continue to make home a place for learning, as well as school. Read with your child or have him or her read to you every day. Make it fun, talk about what you have read! Stimulate your child's creativity and sense of wonder.

Be a role model. Your child admires and learns from you! Be positive about education and show that you enjoy learning too. Make school important and fun.

Implement family rituals and traditions that are values you want to instill in your children for a lifetime.

Build success. Help raise your child's self-esteem by setting reachable goals and praising your child's efforts, not just their results.





Our next selection for discussion on Monday, November 2 at 10:30am is <u>THE DUTCH HOUSE</u> by Ann Patchett:



At the end of the Second World War, Cyril Conroy combines luck and a single canny investment to begin an enormous real estate empire, propelling his family from poverty to enormous wealth. His first order of business is to buy the Dutch House, a lavish estate in the suburbs outside of Philadelphia. Meant as a surprise for his wife, the house sets in motion the undoing of everyone he loves.

The story is told by Cyril's son Danny, as he and his older sister, the brilliantly acerbic and selfassured Maeve, are exiled from the house where they grew up by their stepmother. The two wealthy siblings are thrown back into the poverty their parents had escaped from and find that all they have to count on is one another. It is this unshakeable bond between them that both saves

their lives and thwarts their futures.

Set over the course of five decades, The Dutch House is a dark fairy tale about two smart people who cannot overcome their past. Despite every outward sign of success, Danny and Maeve are only truly comfortable when they're together. Throughout their lives they return to the wellworn story of what they've lost with humor and rage. But when at last they're forced to confront the people who left them behind, the relationship between an indulged brother and his ever-protective sister is finally tested.
