OPPOSITE SIDES OF THE SPECTRUM

There is a popular Jewish song in Hebrew called *kol haolam kulo*, that means “The whole entire world is a very narrow bridge and the main thing is **to have no fear at all.**”

The lyrics, so we are taught, were written by the famous Hassidic Rabbi, Rabbi Nachman of Breslov. But when you go to Reb Nachman’s original text, you find a similar, yet far from identical version, “Know that a person needs to cross a very, very narrow bridge, and what is essential is **not to be consumed by fear.**”

There is a big difference between having fear and being consumed by fear. They represent opposite sides of the spectrum. Fear is not only normal, but essential to our survival (when you see a bear in the woods you should be afraid and start running) and I don’t think that Rabbi Nachman had a problem with

it. But being consumed with fear can be dangerous, as it often leads to inaction.

The pandemic put us all on the fear spectrum. The positive effect was that it protected us as we learned to diligently wash our hands, use masks, and get vaccinated. But it also deprived us of many events and activities that bring meaning and joy into our lives, including being in the synagogue for Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur.

But this year is different. Most of us are vaccinated, and adding another layer of safety by wearing masks significantly reduces the risk of infection. We are fully aware that some degree of risk still exists, but we want to give each and every one of you the option to decide for yourselves how to celebrate this year. Your clergy and staff are here to serve all of you. Those who feel comfortable are welcome to attend Services in person in our beautiful Temple. And for our friends who, for a variety of reasons may not feel safe, we are committed to making the online experience meaningful and spiritual. On the technical side, we hired videographers, sound engineers, and even installed a

new lighting system to enhance your viewing experience. On the spiritual side, we designed the Services in a way that encourages not only passive watching but also participating.

People like to say, “You cannot make everyone happy.” It is probably true, but it doesn’t mean that we should not constantly try. We follow Rabbi Nachman’s teaching of not being consumed by fear, but also know that some controlled fear is essential. Whether you get to see me in person or through a screen, know that I wish you and yours a year of health, tranquility, and laughter.

A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Every family has different traditions and ways they come together to celebrate the Jewish New Year. Last year, I told you a little about my family and the way we bring in Rosh Hashanah. The kids and I will still be in the kitchen having cinnamon sugar and honey permeate my house this year. We will continue to use my grandmother's china and I know my dad will ensure that flowers have their place on the table. I am so glad that nothing has changed in that regard, and I can count on the fact that those three elements will exist, shortly reminding me that it is in fact a time for renewal, regardless that it feels earlier on the calendar. I also mentioned that a new tradition we began was having a large dinner on the first night of Rosh Hashanah with friends who have become as close as family.

Each year, we seem to add something new to the list of traditions. For the past few years, it was new friends around our table, a new fruit, or even accepting the loss of someone

who couldn't be with us for one reason or another. Something that these friends taught me is that it was customary to eat a new fruit, a symbol of newness, yearly. For us, it was a fun new way for the kids and me to approach Rosh Hashanah and have conversation about what all of this means. More so, throughout the years when I have been at a grocery store or farmer's market, I smile and tend to buy the fruit. It reminds me of renewal and the joy that these friends and family members bring to my life. It is a simple concept based in our tradition. It also has become a fun game for the kids to guess what might be in front of them on the dinner table besides the round challah and apples and honey. Establishing a new tradition and watching it unfold from the viewpoint of two children (or more) is what really seems to impact the holiday.

Trying to rack my brain for the next great idea takes the essence out of the idea or heart of a new practice. Especially approaching these holidays in an unconventional year, I don't quite know what it will be for 2021; however, I do hope it is one whose effects will be long-lasting and remain for my children. What impact will these new traditions have and how long will they be carried forward? It might be the

fact that it will be the first time they are attending HaMakom Religious School (and will have their own insight for Rosh Hashanah outside of the preschool melodies they learned during their time at The One School) or something none of us expect. This is the entire point. Something new that opens our eyes to what might be ahead for us Jewishly or otherwise. So much has changed over the past two years.

I know that this season of rejuvenation will replenish us with the melodies provided by Cantorial Soloist Marcy and the inspirational words from Rabbi Alon, and I look forward to connecting with many of you whether in person or over the phone. I hope that each of you can find a way to embrace traditions you value and welcome this new Jewish year, holding on to the thought that we once again have a chance to start something new that might just stay with us. A happy, healthy, and sweet new year to each of you and your loved ones. Shanah Tovah!

A HIGH HOLY DAYS UPDATE

As Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur approach, all of us at TBA wish you and your loved ones a very happy, healthy, and prosperous New Year. I want to take this opportunity to remind you of what will be happening this season.

We are offering all of our High Holy Days Services in person this year, as well as online. If you are unable to attend the High Holy Days Services in-person, we invite you to watch with us by going to **www.livestream.com/templebethamjupiter**.

TICKETS: This year tickets will be **digital and must be obtained through our website in advance**. To request your ticket visit our website at www.templebetham.com and click on the High Holy Days image on the homepage, or from the High Holy Days page under the Worship tab on the menu at the top of the website. If you are a **Temple member in good standing** (you have either joined us for the July 2021-June 2022 membership year or have renewed your membership), make sure you choose the "**MEMBER**" option to be able to get your free, non-transferable, ticket(s) and purchase tickets for your immediate family. (You will need to call the Temple first to get your password.) **Non-members** can also purchase tickets through our website. Children 25 years and younger do not need a ticket to attend any of our Services (as well as any college student showing their college ID).

MASKS: Are required for everyone over the age of 5 while in the building. Masks must cover nose and mouth; face shields are not accepted in lieu of masks.

ARRIVAL: Tickets will be scanned **prior to entry**. Have your masks on and tickets ready for scanning (on phone or printed out) before getting to the front door.

CHILDREN/FAMILY SERVICES: On both Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kipper, our **Children's Service (appropriate for birth-5 years old and their families) is at 1:30pm** and our **Family Service (appropriate for children 1st-6th grade and their families) is at 2:30pm**. All are invited and no ticket is needed. It is free and open to the community. Services are led by Rabbi Alon and Cantorial Soloist Marcy.

BABYSITTING: Because of COVID-19, babysitting will not be available this year. A family room will be set up in the Chapel where parents may stay with their children who need a break to run around and play while still being able to see and hear the service in the Sanctuary.

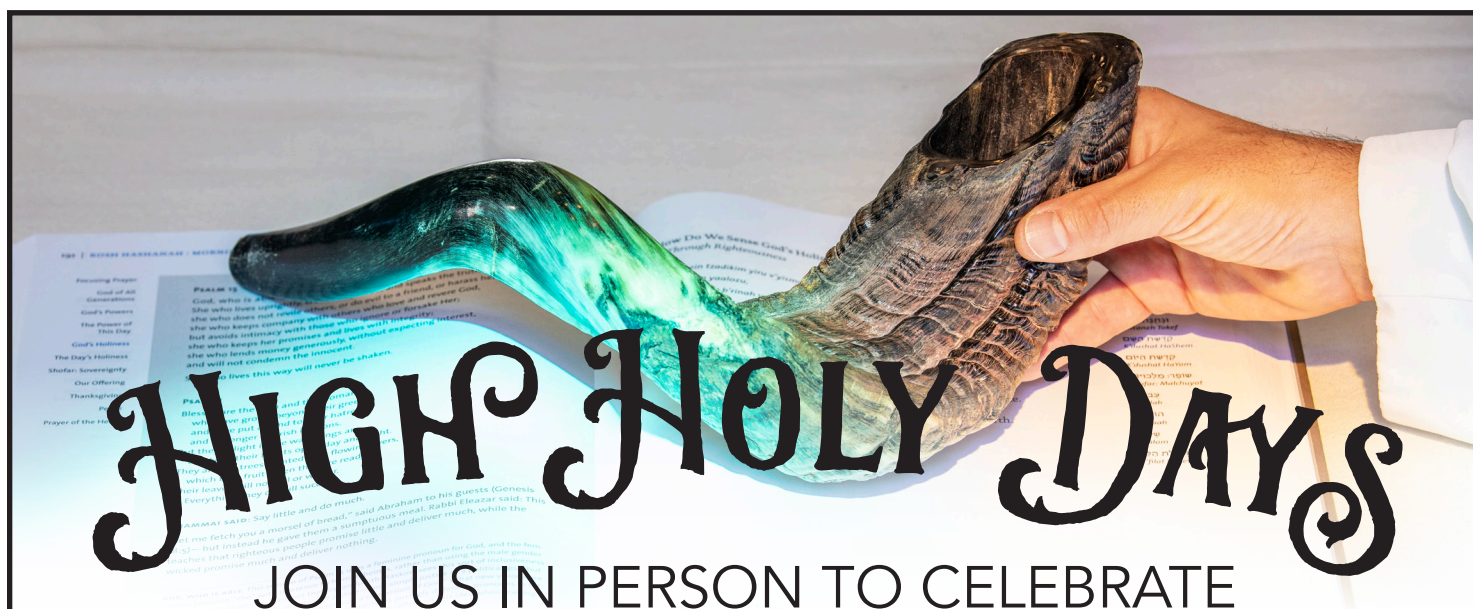

MY FATHER'S TALLIT

One of my favorite parts of our B'nei Mitzvah Service is a moment at the beginning when the Bar or Bat Mitzvah is presented with a *tallit*, their very own prayer shawl. Sometimes they are presented by parents, sometimes by grandparents or close family members, who join them on the bima to place it over their shoulders before they recite the blessing.

It's a mitzvah, a commandment, to wrap ourselves in the fringes. This commandment comes directly from the Book of Numbers and is recited daily following the Sh'ma.

"And God spoke to Moses saying: Speak to the children of Israel and tell them to make for themselves fringes on the corners of their garments throughout their generations; [...] in order that you will remember and perform all My commandments; and you will be holy unto your God." (Num. 15)

On July 3, 2021, a beautiful, sunny, summer day in Pittsburgh, my sister Katherine, and her husband Ryan, were married under a *chuppah* adorned by white roses and strands of warm green eucalyptus leaves. Covering the top—my father's tallit—the very traditional, wool tallit that kept me and my sisters warm and entertained (as we braided the fringes), during the many hours we spent in synagogue as young children.

The truth is, I didn't recognize it until the beginning of the ceremony when the officiating Rabbi mentioned it belonged to my father. I remembered it being much larger. Large enough to wrap around all of us. Seeing it up against the blue of that summer sky brought tears to my eyes and an immense amount of comfort.

During the ceremony, I had the honor of chanting the *Sheva Brachot*, the seven blessings recited at every Jewish wedding. My older sister, Rose, stood by my side to recite the English. At that moment I realized we were together again, sheltered by that very tallit for the first time in many years.

Seeing our *chatan* (groom) and *kallah* (bride) on their wedding day, and my father's tallit reminded me of the love, comfort, and stability that Judaism adds to our lives. Rituals, Shabbat, holidays, and tradition looked different in this last year, but they were still marked and celebrated. Embracing the changes and challenges in our lives shifts our perspective and helps us grow.

May we continue to provide comfort, love, and meaning to our families and communities in the new year.

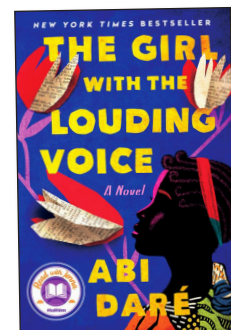

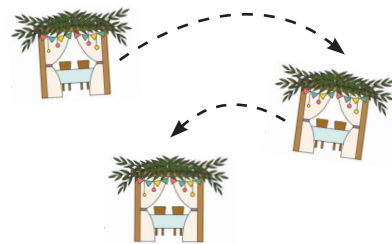

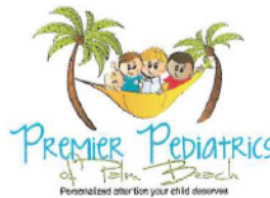
