☐ Finding Happiness in Your Life Tuesday, October 10 & 24, 7pm - 8pm

Only 31% of Americans when asked if they are happy actually report that they are. Ironically, Israelis rank as one of the happiest peoples in the world, even though they live in a very tense and tumultuous part of the world. A recent Gallup survey ranked Israel seventh out of 124 countries based on the happiness level of residents. Why do you think 63 percent of Israeli respondents said they were happy — more than in the US or UK? What do they know that we do not? What practices are there in Judaism that can assist us in finding joy in our life?

We will use the Daylio Journal to track our emotions and evaluate actually how happy we are.

□ Jewish Spiritual Practices Designed to Bring Meaning into Your Life Tuesday, November 7, 7pm - 8pm

Spirituality is a slippery word. There are some who see it as an attitude that lives emotionally. Others understand it as a search for meaning, purpose, and direction in life in the light of a larger context. Still others connect it to personal growth, religious experience, services, prayer or belief. I tend to see it as an orientation that sees life more as material and measures its impact on us by how much meaning it brings into our days.

This class will introduce you to a Jewish practice of being more spiritual and of understanding one's Judaism as more than cultural belonging, and more about practices that bring meaning and purpose.





☐ The Ghost of Leo Frank and Broadway

Jew Hatred is a communal trauma and one of the most profound stories of that hatred revolves around a poorly understood man from Atlanta, Georgia, Leo Frank, who was lynched for raping and murdering Mary Phagan in a Georgian Pencil Factory. From this trauma arose the KKK and ADL. Learn history and how we still struggle with the trauma today.

□ Disrupting Judaism.

Rabbi Michael Strassfeld wrote a book "Judaism Disrupted: A Spiritual Manifesto for the 21st century". In it he wrote, "For what purpose are we preserving Judaism? Just to preserve it for its own sake is not compelling to me. If Jews no longer find Judaism meaningful or if it turns out Judaism can only flourish when we are being persecuted or by withdrawing from the world into separatist enclaves. then I am not sure Judaism can or will survive. The argument for observance for continuity's sake seems to me wrongheaded and one that I think people will increasingly find unconvincing." This will be the basis for our discussion.

ADDITIONAL OPPORTUNITIES FOR TEENS

□ Sunday/Midweek Hebrew Madrichim Program

This YOBO class places students in Sunday or midweek Hebrew classrooms as assistant teachers, or madrichim. *Madrichim* report to their assigned class every session during the year for their classroom duties. They may also receive further training and development in our monthly *Madrichim* workshop sessions on Sundays. These workshops provide teens with information on organization, classroom management, teaching responsibilities, and leadership. 11th and 12th grade madrichim must apply for these paid assistant teaching slots. Please be in touch with Aaron Nielsenshultz for an application.

□ Confirmation

Confirmation is our 10th grade class within our teen program, YOBO (Youth of Beth Or). Confirmation meets on its own, separate from YOBO, two-to-three Sunday evenings a month with Rabbi Marx and Aaron Nielsenshultz. Our goal is to help our teenagers—young Jewish adults—articulate what Judaism means to them and what they think about God, all culminating when our Confirmation students lead services during the holiday of Shavuot. Along the way, students learn about themselves, rediscover old friends, make new ones, and gain a whole new understanding of what it means to be Jewish!

□ Post-Confirmation

Ilth and 12th grade students meet with Rabbi Marx, Rabbi Bonder, or Aaron Nielsenshultz to continue our conversations about being adult Jews. We'll look at current events and topical ideas while developing our Jewish minds together.

□ Travel

YOBO also provides travel opportunities for our older students: 10th-12th graders can travel to Washington, D.C. over a weekend in February for the L'taken Seminar where they learn about the lobbying process and then lobby their lawmakers on Capitol Hill. This is a life-changing trip!
