



Wedding Photographer/Videographer Instructions As of June 2018

Photographer

Take all the pictures you desire as guests are arriving, sitting, waiting and chatting prior to the service – flash use is permitted.

Feel free to stand near the chuppah to take pictures as the processional comes down the aisle – flash use is permitted.

Once the service starts, if you take pictures you must stay behind the last row where people are seated – stationary – no flash – incredibly quiet shutter.

Toward the end of the service, when Rabbi begins the Seven Blessings (long Hebrew part), feel free to come down the aisle and go back to flash use (if you wish) to take pictures as the glass is broken, the couple embraces and kisses, and then the recessional.

Videographer

Please do not stand under or behind the chuppah, but rather to either side of it.

You must set-up and position your equipment prior to the service.

You must be stationary during the ceremony.

If you use a bright light, it must bounce off something (i.e. the chuppah) so as not to shine in the couple's eyes, especially if it is a "hot" light.
